Summary

Near the beginning there was some rain and a mountain storm at night. However, after that the weather was very hot and sunny. The scenery was stunning, and the hotel was lovely. The staff here were very friendly and helpful. Highlights of our forays of the Austria Go Slow Tour included flowers such as Red Helleborine, Dark Red Helleborine, Marsh Helleborine, Greater Butterfly, Lesser Butterfly, Small White, Fragrant, Black Vanilla and Marsh Orchids, Spring Gentian, and Clusius's Gentian. Birds included Golden Eagle, Black Kite, Red-backed Shrike, Rosefinch, Alpine Chough and Dipper. Then we had butterfly species including Heath Fritillary, Swallowtail, Black-veined White, and Idas and Baton Blue. Other highlights included a trip to the top of Zugspitz Mountain and the boat trip on the Heiterwanger See as well as a couple of short evening excursions to see Beavers.

Day 1

Wednesday 25th June

Weather: Warm, dry and sunny.

Naturetrekkers flew either to Innsbruck or Munich and then were driven to the Alpen Residence Hotel in Ehrwald. The hosts here were very friendly and helpful. A few birds were seen on the journey including Buzzard. Some had an afternoon walk where we explored a small part of the Larchen Wald. Here we saw Mossy Sandwort *Moehringia muscosa*, Wood Scabious *Knautia dipsacifolia*, Greater Masterwort *Astrantia major* and some Clustered Bellflower *Campanula glomerata*. On our return to the hotel a Black Kite was spotted. We all met each other for the first time at the hotel in time to freshen up for the first delicious meal of the tour. Then after supper we all went down to the stream and saw a couple of Beaver in day light beside their home.

Day 2

Thursday 26th June

Weather: Hot with some sunshine that turned into a thunderstorm

After breakfast we stopped off at a supermarket in the village to buy sandwiches for lunch. Then we set off to the Ehrwaler Alm Cable Car. After paying for parking tickets, we ascended to the Ehrwald Alm where we had lovely views looking down into the villages of Ehrwald and Lermoos. We saw a nice variety of plants that included Globe Flower Trollius europaeus, Herb Paris Paris quadrifolia, Hepatica Hepatica nobilis, Woolly Buttercup Ranunculus lanuginosu,s, Green Spleenwort Asplenium viride, Round-leaved Saxifrage Saxifraga rotundifolia and Flat Sedge Blysmus compressus. When we came to a small lake, we sat down to have our packed lunch. The lake was full of tadpoles and there was a family of Mallard with their ducklings to be seen. We also saw White Wagtail flying across the lake. Some of us saw the Alpine Newt Ichthyosaura alpestris coming up for air on the lake edge. The butterfly species included the mountain form of Green-veined White Pieris bryoniae, Wood White Leptidea sinapis, Heath Fritillary Melitaea athalia, Comma Polygonum c album, Baton Blue Pseudophilotes sinaicus and Small Blue Cupido minimus, We also saw a variety of orchids that included Alpine Marsh Dactylorhiza alpestris, Small White Pseudoorchis albida, Greater Butterfly Platanthera chlorantha, Broad-leaved Marsh Dactylorhiza majalis, Twayblade Neottia ovata and Fragrant Gymnadenia conopsea agg.

Then we went down the cable car because a storm was brewing so we headed down to avoid being stuck up on the mountain in a thunderstorm. On the way down some of us spotted two Golden Eagle. We then headed back

to the hotel in the rain. So, we returned early and had a rest before going through the species list and then had our afternoon tea. Later we had our evening meal.

Day 3 Friday 27th June

Weather: Sunny and dry

After breakfast we all went down to the supermarket and chose our rolls and other things for our lunch. Then we drove through Bieberwier and on to the Marienberg Ski lift station. We boarded the ski lift that took us up to the middle station and then we went on to another lift up to the top. On the way up we could see a number of Fragrant Orchid *Gymnadenia conopsea* as well as some Dwarf Alpen Rose *Rhodothamnus chamaecistus*. When we were up there, we walked around and soon found Alpine Bartsia *Bartsia alpina*, numerous Alpine Bistort *Bistorta vivipara*, Cat's-foot or Mountain Everlasting *Antennaria dioica*, Small White Orchid *Pseudoorchis albid*, Round-leaved Wintergreen *Pyrola rotundifolia* and Alpine Aster *Aster Alpinus*. We scanned the mountainsides with the scope until we found a few Chamois *Rupicapra rupicapra* grazing. After a short while up there on the top looking at the beautiful views we returned to the middle station and here we disembarked and made our way to the Gasthaus where some of us had cool drinks whilst others had ice creams. After this welcome refreshing break, we then set off on foot down to the lower station where the minibuses were parked. There were a number of grazing ponies in the meadow whilst above our heads there were a couple of Raven cronking. On our descent we came across Adenostyles *Adenostyles alliariae*, Stinking Hellebore *Helleborus foetidus*, Good King Henry *Blitum bonus-henricus* and Matted Globularia *Globularia cordifolia*. We also saw Wart-biter Cricket *Decticus verrucivorus*.

Once we reached the minibuses we then drove up to the Blind See where we went and sat down and had our lunch. Whilst here we saw Grey Heron, Coot, Mallard, White Wagtail and Little Grebe. We also saw numerous Broad-bodied Chaser dragonflies Libellula depressa. After a pleasant lunch we then went on a short walk to Mitter See. On our journey we found Red Helleborine Cephalanthera rubra and Dark Red Helleborine Epipactis atrorubens, and Bird's-nest Orchid Neottia nidus-avis. Other plants of interest included Swallow Wort Vincetoxicum hirundinaria, Yellow Betony Stachys officinalis (yellow flower form) and Alpine Bastard Toadflax Thesium alpinum. We spotted Silver washed Fritillary Argynnis paphia, False Heath Fritillary Melitaea diamina, Orange Tip Anthocharis cardamines and Ringlet Aphantopus hyperantus. We also came across Four-spotted Chaser Libellula quadrimaculata, Keeled Skimmer Othetrum coerulescens and Common Club-tail Gomphus vulgatissimus.

We returned to the hotel and were soon sitting down to afternoon tea and cake. Later on, we went through the species list then sat down for another delicious meal. After that, some of us went and visited the Beavers again.

Day 4 Saturday 28th June

Weather: Dry and sunny

After breakfast we selected our sandwiches from the local supermarket. Then we set off in the minibuses for a short journey to the Tiroler Zugspitzbahn cable car. Once we arrived, we purchased parking tickets for both vehicles and then stepped into the large cable car. The cable car climbed up to the top of the Zugspitz. The top of the mountain is around 2962 metres above sea level. What makes the site interesting is that part of the top is in Austria but the other is in Germany and has its own cable car on the other side to reach here. This is the highest mountain there is in Germany. When we arrived, it was cloudy at the top so we went into the museum. Here we

learnt a little about the cable car history at Zugspitz. The small informative museum told us about how Josef Naus and his assistant and mountain guide Johann Georg Tauschl climbed to the summit on the 27th of August 1820. And then how the cable car systems were built to make it possible for others to reach the summit from both sides. The first was built in 1926 and then they have been continually updated. In 1990 a weather station was set up on the mountain to record climate change.

When we left the museum, we made our way out of the cable car and then went to explore the top of the mountain and explored the Austrian side first. Some of us managed to have a brief glimpse of an Alpine Chough. It was nice and cool up here among the clouds. From time to time, we would glimpse gaps in the clouds and we could see that the snow had melted almost completely and there were sadly only tiny patches of glacier still remaining and this was far less than a few years ago. We all managed to see more Alpine Chough on the German side that seem to have taken up residence here. Some of us were able to hand feed them with bits of our sandwiches. We also saw Snow Finch, Alpine Accentor and there were a few Small Tortoiseshell *Aglais urticae* flying around. There were very few flowers to see up there and we had to use binoculars to see Chamois-cress *Hornungia alpina* and Alpine Meadow-grass *Poa alpina*.

Then we descended back down the cable car to find that the temperature at the base was much warmer. We then took the vehicles a little way down the mountain and drove to briefly look at a meadow filled with wild meadow flowers including German Gentian Gentianella germanica, Meadow Clary Salvia pratensis and Alpine Marsh Orchid Dactylorhiza alpestris. Then we drove to the beautiful waterfall known as Haselgehr Wasserfall and here we sat and had our lunch. After lunch we went and explored the area and came across Twayblade Neottia orata and Red Helleborine Cephalanthera rubra. Other flowers included Ribbed Mellilot Melilotus officinalis, Swallow wort Vincetoxicum hirundinaria and Lily of the Valley Convallaria majalis. We also saw a few butterflies that included Wood White Leptidea sinapis, Ringlet Aphantopus hyperantus and White Admiral Limenitis camilla. We then returned to the hotel to freshen up and be in time for afternoon tea.

We later went through the list followed by a delicious meal. a buffet style dinner with a wide variety of food and drink to sample and enjoy.

Day 5 Monday 29th June

Weather: Hot and sunny all day

Before breakfast some of us visited the Moos area to do a bit of bird watching. It was quite atmospheric because there was a mist covering the moos whilst all around was in beautiful sunshine. Here we came across two not so common birds and they were Marsh Warbler and Rosefinch. After breakfast we picked up our sandwiches for lunch from the hotel because the supermarket was closed on Sundays. The we drove to the Lermoos cable car. We parked up and then boarded the lift and went up to the middle station and then on up to the top station. The view was amazing looking down at Ehrwald and across to Zugspritze. We set about exploring the mountainside and soon found a new mix of plants to see such as Moss Campion Silene acaulis, Hoary Rockrose Helianthermum oelandicum subsp. incanum, Spring Gentian Gentiana verna, Leafless-stemmed Speedwell Veronica aphylla, Rock Speedwell Veronica fruticans, Mountain Buttercup Ranunculus montanus, Musky Saxifrage Saxifraga moschata, Yellow Mountain Saxifrage Saxifraga aizoides, Blue Saxifrage Saxifraga caesia and Black Vanilla Orchid Gymnadenia rhellicani. There were some interesting ferns that we found that included Green Spleenwort Asplenium viride, Holly Fern

Polyystichum lonchitis and the very small Moonwort *Botrychium luniaria*. Birds of note seen whilst up here were Water Pipit and Ring Ouzel. We had a drink in the gasthaus at the top and then we had our packed lunch whilst looking at the stunning scenery and we did spot a couple of Chamois.

Most of us next took the cable car down to the middle station and from here we walked down to the two parked minibuses. However, some of us stayed a little longer at the top before going all the way down to meet us at the bottom later in the day. As most of us slowly descended the path we discovered Wood Horsetail Equisetum sylvatica, Yellow Gentian Gentianella lutea, Wood Vetch Vicia sylvatica and Leafless-stemmed Speedwell Veronica aphylla. Butterfly-wise we saw False Heath Fritillary Melitaea diamina, Weaver's Fritillary Boloria dia, Idas Blue Plebejus idas, Alpine Blue Plebejus orbitulus, Clouded Yellow Colias crocea and Swallowtail Papilio machaon. Almost near base some of us spotted a Golden Eagle. Once we all arrived back by the minibuses we were soon driving back to the hotel in time for tea and cake. Later we went through our species list session followed by last delicious meal.

Day 6

Saturday 30th June

Weather: Very Hot and Sunny

After breakfast we chose lunch from the local supermarket. Then we parked up beside an entrance leading on to an area known as the Moos. This area has a lot of wet meadows and a stream running through it. However, to get to this area we had to walk through part of the southern side of Ehrwald. We saw Black Redstart and plenty of House Sparrows. But it was not too long before the landscape opened out and we had wonderful views of the mountains all around us. We first made our way towards an area where Red-backed Shrike have been seen and we were rewarded by finding an adult and a youngster. Then we soon had a Rose Finch in the scope as well. Plantwise we came across Common Cotton-grass *Eriophorum latifolium* Hare's-tail Cotton-grass *Eriophorum vaginatum*, Slender Cotton-grass *Eriophorum gracile*, Grass of Parnassus, Knotted Pearlwort *Sagina nodosa*, Deergrass *Trichophorum cespitosum*, Round-leaved Sundew *Drosera rotundifolia* and there were also numerous Marsh Helleborines *Epipactis palustris*. We had our lunch in the Moos and then headed back to the minibuses. Some of the group wanted to either cool off back at the hotel and some wanted to go and explore the village, whilst some of us wanted to do some more natural history

So, half of us went back to the Ehrwaldder Alm Station car park and then from here we went on a walk along the Wasserfall Weg. Plants of interest that we saw included Yellow Foxglove Digitalis grandiflora, Blue Lettuce Lactuca perennis, Large Bitter-cress Cardamine amara, Alpine Bistort Polygonum viviparum and Lesser Butterfly Orchid Platanthera. We saw a number of butterflies that included Scarce Large Blue Phengaris teleius, Little Blue Cupido minimus, Chestnut Heath Coenonympha glycerion, Silver-washed Fritillary Argynnis paphia, Noble Fritillary Melitaea athalia, Titania's Fritillary Boloria titania and Large Wall Brown Lasiommata maera.

We then returned to the hotel in time for afternoon tea and then shortly after that we went through our species list session followed by a buffet style dinner with a wide variety of food and drink to sample and enjoy.

Day 7

Tuesday 1st July

After breakfast we stopped off at the supermarket in the village to buy sandwiches for lunch then we drove off to Heiterwangersee. We arrived at Fischer am See beside Heiterwangersee and waited for the boat. It was not long before we boarded and set off on our journey to Seespritze. The day was hot and sunny and many of us sat on the

top of the boat to have visibility. We had wonderful views of the mountains being reflected back in the blue waters of the lake. We saw a variety of birds that including Golden Eagle, Coot, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Great Crested Grebe, Peregrine and a family of Goosander. Then from Seespritze the boat trip continued to the far end of the lake to a place known as Forelle and then the boat then took us back to Fischer am See via Seespritze. Because it was very hot, we went and found some shade under some trees and had our lunch.

Then we set off for a short walk along the lake edge to see what flowers grew there and were rewarded with some pink Birds-eye Primrose *Primula farinosa*, yellow Buckler Mustard *Biscutella laevigata* and lilac-blue Matted Globularia *Globularia cordifolia*. There were a number of butterflies flying in the good weather such as False Heath Fritillary *Metitaea athalea*, Wood White *Leptidea sinapsis*, Orange Tip *Anthocharis cardamines* and Pearly Heath *Coenonympha arcania*. As we continued following the path running alongside the lake, we also came across interesting orchids that included Dark-red Helleborine *Epipactis atrorubens*, Bird's-nest Orchid *Neottia nidus-avis*, Lesser Butterfly *Platanthera bifolia*, Fragrant *Gymnadenia conopsea* and Red Helleborine *Cethalanthera rubra*.

Then we were soon driving back in the minibuses to the hotel and just in time for tea and cake. Later we went through the species list and then had our evening meal.

Day 8

Thursday 2nd July

Weather: Hot and sunny

After breakfast and packing we checked out and then said our goodbyes to each other as one person returned to Munich Airport, and the rest of the group went back to Innsbruck Airport. We enjoyed the last look at the stunning mountain scenery as we left the Alpen Residence Hotel grounds and reflected on the interesting and very varied places and habitats we had visited on the tour.
