Summary

This was the final group of the 2019 Jaguar season and we really finished on a great high, having a fantastic time and seeing everything we hoped for and more. Highlights included five individual Jaguar sightings in one day, a Jaguar kill, private viewing of Jaguars (one for over an hour with no other boats around) and Jaguars found on five different days. We enjoyed Tapir and Ocelot in the same evening, a family of seven Giant River Otters only 5 metres away, happily scent marking and feeding. Not to mention the incredible abundance of birdlife – Great Potoo, Hyacinth Macaws, Rufous-tailed Jacamar, Spot-tailed Nightjar, all five kingfisher species and Great Horned Owl, to name but a few. On one single day we recorded an amazing 14 different species of mammal with good views of Tayra and Southern Tamandua being particularly special. With very little rain and some lovely sunsets, it was great way to finish the season.

Day 1

Sunday 3rd November

The group left London's Heathrow arriving in Cuiabá São Paulo the following morning.

Day 2

Monday 4th November

The flight landed on time and when everyone disembarked we gathered everybody together to go through the plan for the afternoon, and then we went to a restaurant for lunch. We left the restaurant and eagerly began our journey to Pouso Alegre. Our first stop was at the Tourist Centre for a quick comfort break and after 15 minutes we left in order to meet up with our driver and his safari vehicle.

Once we arrived at the safari vehicle, Marcos recommended that we get out our sun lotion, bug spray, head lamps, binoculars, camera and water flask, and he handed out dust masks and protection glasses for the three hours drive to the lodge.

Once on the Transpantaneira road we saw our first Pantanal species, Green Ibis, Cocoi Heron, Great Egrets and Rufescent Tiger Heron, Buff-necked Ibis and a Red-legged Sereima was great to find.

Once we arrived at Pouso Alegre, everyone settled into their rooms and refreshed themselves after travelling. Following dinner we went out for a night drive where we encountered a wonderful Tapir. A great start.

Day 3

Tuesday 5th November

Our second day at Pouso Alegre Lodge was sunny and hot with a little bit of rain over lunch. We had an early start with a spotlighting drive followed by a walk where we saw some great wetland birds including Wood Storks, Muscovy Ducks and Snowy Egrets.

We headed back to the lodge for breakfast, after which we went to check the bird feeder, which was visited by Chestnut-eared Aracaris, Palm Tanager, Purplish Jay, Chestnut-bellied Guan and Bare-faced Curassow. We also

enjoyed seeing Greater and Smooth-billed Ani, Great Potoo and Guira Cuckoos. Other highlights today included 70 or so White-Collared Peccary and Silvery Marmoset amongst many others. Another wildlife filled day indeed.

Day 4

Wednesday 6th November

Today we said goodbye to our first lodge and travelled along the Transpantaneira road to the Flotel. On the way we stopped to look at some Marsh Deer – the largest deer of the Pantanal.

After a wildlife packed journey along Transpantaneira we arrived at the Flotel in time for lunch and afterwards we set off to look for Jaguars, and we weren't disappointed. On our first boat trip we watched two Jaguars, brothers Kim and Tore, for more than an hour. And we even saw a third cat as we spotlighted on our way back to the Flotel! The weather dry with only a 10 minute shower today. Three jaguars on our first outing! A great start.

We did well for reptiles today. As well as the common Yacare Caiman which we see in large number every day we spotted a Giant Ameiva Lizard and a Brazilian False Water Cobra!

Day 5

Thursday 7th November

It was a dry day and cooler, which was welcome. This morning we had a magical hour of watching a family of seven Giant Otters, all by ourselves, with no other boats for around one hour. They were only 5 metres away and we were privileged to watch them scent marking and feeding. There were no Jaguars this morning, but the playful Giant Otters more than made up for this.

We returned to the boat for lunch and then rested and relaxed before going out in the afternoon.

We found the brothers Kim and Tore once more in the afternoon but they were rather hidden in the bushes this time. After staying with them for a short while, we returned to the flotel, had dinner and then went through the checklist.

Day 6

Friday 8th November

This morning was overcast but dry all day. On our first trip of the day, two Giant River Otters were seen travelling along a river channel. And again we found one of the brothers Kim or Tore. This time we were able to enjoy this majestic cat in the open for around ten minutes and at a distance of around 10 metres.

In the evening we found our friends, the jaguar brother and watched Kim and Tore for more than an hour! They came out of the bushes to relax on a sand bank by the river. We have really begun to get to know these brothers and look forward to catching up with them each time we go out.

The day then ended perfectly with a stunning sunset over the Pantanal, a sight that will certainly never be forgotten.

Day 7

Saturday 9th November

This was our last full day at the Jaguar Flotel and it did not disappoint. In the morning we found a Yellow Anaconda and found another Jaguar. Again we had excellent views. The Anaconda wasn't the only reptile for us, we also saw many Green Iguanas and a Golden Tegu Lizard.

We came back to the Flotel in time for lunch and then had an hour or so to recharge our batteries, which was a good job as unbeknown to us, we had a particularly exciting afternoon ahead.

This evening we glimpsed a Jaguar killing a Capybara and after that went on to see one cat sleeping. To complete an amazing day of Jaguar action we found a mating pair and watched them as they mated once for the group! A truly unforgettable experience.

We hit our record today with five individual cats sighted during the day and some wonderful views. Again there was no rain today.

Day 8

Sunday 10th November

Marcos asked for the luggage to be ready before we had a full breakfast and then went upriver on the Piquiri and had a wonderful encounter with a mother Jaguar and two young cubs! They were drinking water from a sandbank in the river and we were alone to watch these beautiful cats. No one else around as we explored this amazing area.

This was an incredible way to end our time at the Flotel and soon we were heading back to Porto Jofre where the truck had already arrived and our luggage had been loaded. Before we set off, we took the opportunity to have a look at the Hyacinth Macaws here.

We then made our way to South Wild Pantanal Lodge, with a few birding stops along the way seeing a great range of species once more. White-headed Marsh Tyrants, Limpkins, Savannah, Roadside and Great Black Hawk as well as Snail Kites, Jabiru and Wood Storks and much much more.

We got to the SouthWild Lodge in time for lunch. We then relaxed for a while before going for a walk along the main road from the lodge.

After dinner we went to the Ocelot hide but sadly this evening we had no sightings so we headed back to update our checklist.

Day 9

Monday 11th November

It was a hot and Sunny day today. We had an early morning start with a boat ride on Paxaim River during which we saw a large number of amazing birds. The highlights included three Agami Heron, four species of Kingfishers (all but one of South America's Kingfishers), Blue-crowned Motmot, Capped Heron and Black-throated Mango to name just a few. In the evening we had great views of Sunbittern, Sungrebe and a Great Potoo with young.

This evening ,we went back to the Ocelot hide and had amazing views of this beautiful cat. We then went to the Tapir hide nearby where we stayed for a while and were rewarded with superb close views of a Tapir too! Wow. A fantastic evening.

Day 10

Tuesday 12th November

It was our last full day in the Pantanal and we started with a very rewarding early drive during which we saw an incredible nine mammals! Tapir, a superb Tayra, a Southern Tamandua which was on the ground and we had close views, Crab-eating Fox, Marsh Deer, Brown Brocket Deer, Capybara, Azara's Agouti, South American Coati and also some Jaguar prints. An amazing morning.

We returned to the lodge for breakfast, enjoying feeders covered in birds including the amazing Toco Toucan and we discussed our fantastic morning drive before heading out on another lovely boat ride to enjoy more amazing wildlife.

It was another hot and sunny day, broken up with some clouds and we enjoyed this wonderful area and its special species.

In the evening we went back to the Ocelot hide and had yet more superb close up views before dinner and the checklist. In total today 12 different mammals!

Day 11

Wednesday 13th November

We enjoyed the lodge grounds this morning for another walk enjoying a whole range of different species as the Capybaras grazed the lawns. It was soon time to leave, as we headed back to Cuiaba, enjoying the wildlife of Transpantaneira once more before saying our goodbyes to Marcos, thanking him for all his expert help and guidance, before boarding the flight to Sao Paulo.

Day 12

Thursday 14th November

Our overnight flight from Sao Paulo landed at London's Heathrow at 13:15 where we said our goodbyes.
