Day 1

Sunday 18th November

Most of the group were in flight from the UK to Bogota.

Day 2

Monday 19th November

Following their flight from Bogota, Ferney, Andres (our driver) and I met the group in Cali. We birded along the way to La Voragine where we looked for Torrent Duck and White-capped Dipper: we found it!! Later, at El Pance, we visited Balcon de los Colibries where we found a few highlights such as Long-billed Starthroat and Black-throated Mango.

We had a wonderful lunch of Colombian cuisine, what a treat! In the afternoon we drove back to Cali and then to La Lolita, a community project, had a great homemade dinner, and comfortable stay overnight. After dinner we had the chance to go Owl-watching, but we had no luck this time. On the way to La Lolita, species included Rusty-margined Flycatcher, Yellow-headed Caracara and Colombian Chachalaca.

Day 3

Tuesday 20th November

We had an early departure to have breakfast at El Descanso, where visited Dona Dora feeders at the Anchicalla Forest. Here we saw an amazing list of birds, including Masked Tityra, Scarlet-browed Tanager, Summer Tanager and White-whiskered Hermit.

In the afternoon we birded along the road to Buenaventura or the Represa. Late in the evening we drove back to la Lolita for dinner and overnight.

Day 4

Wednesday 21st November

We left La Lotita and after an hour we got to Alejandria where we enjoyed a nice breakfast ande we were ready to birdwatch the whole morning and even some time after lunch. Here we saw the endemic, emblematic bird of this trip, Multicoloured Tanager. Other species included Red-headed Barbet, Blue-winged Mountain Tanager, Long-tailed Sylph, Green Hermit, Montane Woodcreeper and Crested Quetzal (some scientists suggest this is a hybrid with the Golden-headed Quetzal).

After lunch we drove to El Sonso marsh, we saw amazing birds like Common Potoo, Common Nighthawk and Greyish Piculet. We ended up the day in Buga at the Hotel Guadalajara.

Day 5

Thursday 22nd November

After breakfast we went back to Sonso Marsh to bird for few hours more in such a beautiful place. Species seen here included Streaked Flycatcher and Bay-headed Tanager.

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After this interesting morning we drove up north following the road to Armenia y Pereira. We had three hours of driving, leaving behind the enormous Valle del Cauca and passing through miles and miles of sugar cane, to reach the Valle del Rio Rizaralda. We had lunch in Pueblo Rico.

We then changed to 4x4 vehicles and drove for 20 kilometres to the Montezuma Lodge, really close to the Tatama National Park. Amongst the wonderful hummingbirds we saw were Empress Brilliant, Brown Inca, Purple-throated Woodstar, Violet-tailed Sylph and White-tailed Hillstar.

We had dinner and stayed overnight in Montezuma Lodge.

Day 6

Friday 23rd November

Today we had a full day in Montezuma and Tatama National Park. Highlights included Collared Inca, Chestnut-bellied Flowerpiercer, Green-and-black Fruiteater, Lyre-tailed Nightjar, Tourmaline Sunangel and a Crested Dragon Anole.

Day 7

Saturday 24th November

We spent the morning in Montezuma. After a very tasty breakfast, we did an uphill walk, birdwatching along the main road. Here, amongst other species, we saw Black-and-white Warbler, Olive Finch and Purplish-mantled Tanager.

After a few hours birding here, we went back to Pueblo Rico, took back our minibus and drove for four hours to Otun-Quimbaya, stopping for lunch on the way. We were lucky to see the most emblematic species of birds of this amazing place: Cauca Guan and Red-ruffed Fruitcrow. This lodge is another community project, where we had dinner and stayed overnight.

Day 8

Sunday 25th November

We left Otun-Quimbaya and drove for about two hours to the Rio Blanco Reserve, near the city of Manizales, where we were excited because of the feeding station for Antpittas. Amongst many other species, we had good views of Brown-banded Antpitta, Chestnut-crowned Antpitta and Powerful Woodpecker. We spent a full day here, from breakfast till mid-afternoon. We went back to Manizales by the old road, where spent the night in a very nice hotel.

Day 9

Monday 26th November

We had an early departure this morning for the Nevados National Park. It was cold - weather for gloves and a hat – but fine. We had a great morning birding, seeing many wonderful species, including Grass Wren, Blackbacked Bush Tanager, Buffy Helmetcrest and White-capped Dipper.

It was our last night in Manizales, and we had a great dinner in a nice restaurant with a beautiful view of the city.

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Day 10

Tuesday 27th November

We left after breakfast to birdwatch in Chinchina, visiting the dam known as Cameguadua, where we had the chance to see a lot of aquatic birds. Then we drove to Pereira airport to take our flight back to Bogota. Most of the group were heading back home, but three guests and myself were ready to start a follow-on trip in search of the endemics of the Santa Marta region.

Day 11

Wednesday 28th November

Those heading home arrived back in the UK.


