Day 1

Thursday 12th March

We took an overnight flight from London to Bogota, arriving in time to catch the connecting flight to Pereira.

Day 2

Friday 13th March

The seven travellers met our guide, Guillermo Nagy, at the airport in Pereira after an early morning flight from Bogota: six had arrived overnight from London and one had joined from the US. A Red-crowned Woodpecker outside the glass-fronted terminal was the trip's inaugural bird, spotted as we sat with a welcome cup of coffee, as Guillermo briefed us on the days to come. We met our skilful driver Miller, loaded up the minivan, and headed toward Manizales and the coffee lodge at Hacienda Venecia, our base for the week.

After settling in, the first delicious meal of many was lunch: family style, and always including soup, mains and dessert. Then it was down to birding around the lodge and finding out just how excellent a guide Guillermo would be. His encyclopaedic knowledge of Colombia's birds was matched by exquisitely tuned hearing, allowing him to detect birds unseen and work to find them. But there were also plenty of birds that showed themselves with no extra encouragement. Dinner and an early bedtime readied us for our first full day.

Bird highlights: Yellow Oriole, Saffron Finch, Yellow-faced Grassquit, Blue-necked Tanager, Blue-headed Parrot, Broad-winged Hawk, Ruddy Ground Dove, Bananaquit, Black Vulture, Colombian Chachalaca, Bare-faced Ibis, Spectacled Parrotlet, Rufous-tailed Hummingbird, Red-crowned Woodpecker, Bar-crested Antshrike.

Day 3

Saturday 14th March

The morning was fresh but warm, and spent in and around the hacienda (c.1300m), meeting a lot of the resident birds that would become daily sightings.

After lunch, we had a thorough hands-on tutorial in coffee production, from picking, to roasting, to grinding, to brewing, to tasting.

Bird highlights: Western Emerald, Spectacled Parrotlet, Golden-rumped Euphonia, Summer Tanager, Flame-rumped Tanager, Red-crowned Woodpecker, Rufous-breasted Hermit, Cinereous Becard, Rose-breasted Grosbeak, Scrub Tanager.

Day 4

Sunday 15th March

The morning was spent at Represa Cameguadua, a marshy lake, where the focus was on water birds, with an excellent local guide in addition to Guillermo.

In the afternoon, we had another hands-on tutorial, this time on chocolate, from the cacao pod through to a finished, rustic, chocolate bar.

Bird highlights: Buff-necked Ibis, Amazon Kingfisher, Crimson-backed Tanager, Orange-crowned Euphonia, Vermilion Flycatcher, Spot-breasted Woodpecker, Greyish Piculet, Green Kingfisher, Purple Gallinule, Blackish Rail, Yellow-bellied Siskin, Osprey, Masked Saltator.

Day 5

Monday 16th March

On a partially overcast morning, we set off early for the Rio Blanco Ecological Reserve, in the cloud forest above Manizales. It turned out to be our antpitta day, complete with Colombia's original "antpitta whisperer," who's able to call individuals to mealworm-feeding sessions at set times.

Just before reaching the reserve, we stopped to see a Lyre-tailed Nightjar, roosting in plain sight in a rock crevice right next to the road. Hours later, as we headed back to the Hacienda, we stopped and saw her again, this time protecting her newly-hatched chick: it was an amazing sight. (On the final day, after the Montezuma extenders had left with Guillermo, the remaining four learned from Daniel, our guide for the day, that mother and chick were still doing fine.)

Bird highlights: Lyre-tailed Nightjar, Collared Inca, Tourmaline Sunangel, Long-tailed Sylph, Green-and-black Fruiteater, Slaty-crowned Antpitta, Chestnut-crowned Antpitta, Star-chested Treerunner, Chestnut-capped Brushfinch, Masked Flowerpiercer, Blue-winged Tanager, Beryl-spangled Tanager, Grey-browed Brushfinch, Slate-crowned Antpitta, Brown-banded Antpitta, Black-and-chestnut Eagle, Golden-headed Quetzal, Rufous-crowned Tody-Flycatcher, Golden-fronted Whitestart, Grass-green Tanager, Blue-winged Mountain Tanager.

Day 6

Tuesday 17th March

Our destination was Hacienda el Bosque, where we spent most of our time at feeding stations. This is a relatively new conservation enterprise, with a restaurant (we had lunch there) within a large hacienda.

Bird highlights: Grey-breasted Mountain Toucan, Barred Fruiteater, Sickle-winged Guan, Pauraque, Shining Sunbeam, Blackburnian Warbler, Andean Guan, White-browed Spinetail, Yellow-bellied Chat-Tyrant, Sword-billed Hummingbird, Colombian Chachalaca.

Day 7

Wednesday 18th March

The first stop was Laguna Negra, where we saw Ruddy (formerly Andean) Ducks and other water birds (not all native). Then we moved on to Los Nevados National Park, on the slope of Nevado del Ruiz, an active volcano. The park encompasses the páramo ecosystem, essential to the regional water supply, with characteristic *Espeletia* perennial subshrubs. It was our highest elevation at about 4100m.

We ended the morning at Termales del Ruiz, a hotel/spa, where we had lunch. One of the group had a soak in the hot spring pool, and we had a brief viewing at a hummingbird feeding area.

Bird highlights: Ruddy Duck, Buffy Helmetcrest, Tawny Antpitta, Glossy Flowerpiercer, Scarlet-bellied and Lacrimose Mountain Tanagers, Great Sapphirewing, Stout-billed Cinclodes

Day 8

Thursday 19th March

Our last full day was spent in and around the family-operated Don Miguel Demostrativa Natural Reserve, a conservation area within their coffee hacienda. After breakfast, we watched birds at their two feeding stations: there was nectar for hummingbirds, and a fruit station for larger birds, including many tanagers. We then drove to the nearby two-level bamboo viewing station, with feeders, for the rest of the morning, returning to the main house for lunch and more viewing, before heading back to the hacienda mid-afternoon.

Bird highlights: Purple-throated Woodstar, Orange-bellied Euphonia, Yellow-backed Oriole, Scarlet, Bay-headed, Crimson-backed, Hepatic, Golden and Summer Tanagers, Green Honeycreeper, Crimson-rumped Toucanet.

The main tour had come to an end: the combination of comfortable lodgings and transport, well-prepared local cuisine, the range of ecosystems within a couple of hours' drive, the pace calibrated to the maturity of the participants, the 200+ birds spotted, and especially Guillermo's excellent technical and people skills, made for an altogether wonderful experience.

Montezuma extension

Friday 20th – Monday 23rd March

Three of the group left with Guillermo the next morning for the long journey to Montezuma, broken by a stop for lunch in Pueblo Rico, with its lovely square and church. From there, the journey was 4x4 vehicles, the last section on unpaved roads.

The rooms at the accommodation were large and good, with well-visited hummingbird feeders outside. The building where we dined was a shortish walk back down the track, but it was all lit well, and a vehicle was even available to take us for our meals.

Many birds were seen around the lodge, including the secretive Wattled Guan, a regular Blackish Rail, Swallow-tailed Kites, Red-headed Barbet, Black-cheeked Woodpecker, a breeding colony of Chestnut-headed Oropendolas, and Golden-hooded Tanagers. The nectar and fruit feeders in the restaurant area introduced us to Tawny-bellied Hermit, Green Thorntail, Violet-tailed Sylph, Crowned Woodnymph and Silver-throated Tanager. The proximity of the river added birds such as White-capped Dipper, Fasciated Tiger Heron, Torrent Tyrannulet and Black Phoebe.

Two early morning excursions were made into the higher forest using 4x4 vehicles up a steep and very rough track, the first day reaching the top of the track just below an army camp. Once the low clouds cleared, the views across to the Cerro Tatama were spectacular. The second day covered the lower section of the track. Strategically placed hides and nectar/fruit feeders were visited, along with other stops along the track when a bird feeding party was encountered. These areas really took us into a special world, and turned up some endemic species with very restricted ranges, such as the Munchique Wood Wren, Crested Ant Tanager, Chestnut-bellied Flowerpiercer, Black-and-gold Tanager, Gold-ringed Tanager and the near-endemic Choco Brushfinch and Orange-breasted Fruiteater.

In all, the Montezuma extension added another 86 species seen and another six heard only to the trip list. The last morning was spent in leisurely fashion, before we left after lunch for the airport.
