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Day 1

Saturday 16th November

Flight to Ecuador

Day 2

Sunday 17th November

Yanacocha – Alambi - Mindo Loma

I picked up 9 people from the Hostal Birding Garden in Quito at 6:00 am to Yanacocha (3.650 masl). We walked 2 km through the trail to the feeders to find Great Sapphirewinged, Sword billed Hummingbird, Tyrian Metaltail, Scarlet-bellied Mountain Tanager, and Black Chested Mountain Tanager among others. On the way back we got Rufous and Tawny Antpitta. Then taking the old Nono-Mindo Road to Alambi Garden we followed the river and found two White Capped Dippers, Masked Trogon and Grass Green Tanager. Driving, one of the passengers spotted a Giant Antpitta skulking for food, and a few more metres down we saw two Beautiful Jays calling. Just before arriving at Alambi, a couple of Golden Headed Quetzals showed their colours well. In Alambi, Hummingbirds and Tanager's Garden (1.450 m) we found Green Crowned Woodnymph, Western Emerald, Purple-throated Woodstar, Silver Throated Tanager, Golden Tanager, Yellow Tufted Dacnis, etc. We arrived at 6pm to Mindo Loma (1.800 m).

Day 3

Monday 18th November

Bellavista Lodge Area - Upper part of Tandayapa Valley

We left Mindo Loma at 5:30am - the first bird we got in the morning was a Tanager Finch! A nice beginning! Then we found Plate-billed Mountain Toucan, Gorgeted Sunangel, Violet-tailed Sylph, Strong Billed Woodcreeper, and Streaked Tuftedcheek. We enjoyed a productive morning and a delicious box lunch at the view points. Returning down we got Toucan Barbet, Black-capped Tanager, Beryl Spangled Tanager, Flame-faced Tanager, Roadside Hawk, etc

We arrived at 4:30 pm to stay around the feeders and saw the beautiful Velvet Purple Coronet, Buff-tailed Coronet and Golden-naped Tanager, Orange Bellied Euphonia, and Blue-winged Mountain Tanager. We had dinner at 7:00 pm and afterwards had a perfect end to the evening, by seeing a Common Potoo.

Day 4

Tuesday 19th November

Refugio Angel Paz de las Aves - Milpe Area

We left at 5am from Mindo Loma to Angel Paz (1.850 metres above sea level) to see the crazy display of the Andean Cock of the Rock. Before we arrived we spotted a Lyre-tailed Nightjar female on a cliff. We saw approximately 8 male Cock of the Rocks, and nearby a couple of Rufous-bellied Nighthawks were roosting. Then we got three species of Antpittas feeding; Yellow breasted, Moustached and Ochre-breasted. Driving back to the lodge we saw Powerful Woodpecker, Crimson-rumped Toucanet, Western Wood Pewee, Black and White Seedeater.

After a traditional lunch in Mindo Loma, we went to Milpe (1.150 m). We spent about 3 hours in the garden around the feeders with great views of Collared Trogon, Pale Mandible Aracari, Orange-billed Sparrow, Rufous throated Tanager and some migratory birds such as Black and White Warbler, Swainson's Thrush, Snowy throated Kingbird, Blackburnian Warbler, and Summer Tanager. With a successful afternoon we went to Mirador Rio Blanco to have dinner and stay overnight.

Day 5

Wednesday 20th November

Mirador Rio Blanco – Quito

After having breakfast at 5:30am we visited Milpe for a second time trying for Club-winged Manakin, and two of them showed very well. Within the reserve were Ochre-breasted Tanager, Broad-billed Motmot, Masked Tityra, White-bearded Manakin, White-throated Spadebill, Immaculate Antbird, and Spotted Woodcreeper.

After lunch at Mirador we drove to Quito, stopping at the Equator Monument. We spotted Black-tailed Trainbearer, Ashy-breasted Sierra Finch, and Common Ground Dove. We then drove to Puenbo Bird Garden (PBG) which is a nice place to stay, close to the airport; which makes it easily to drive around different places and close to the next stop (Guango Lodge). We found birds at the feeders such as: Saffron Finch, Shiny Cowbird, Scrub Tanager, Giant Hummingbird, and Sparkling Violetear etc.

Day 6

Thursday 21st November

PBG, Papallacta Pass, Guango Lodge

We left at 6am, and before taking the Papallacta Road, we visited Chiche River (2.450 m) driving around the valley of Quito. We got beautiful views of Vermillion Flycatcher, Golden-rumped Euphonia, Rusty Flowerpiercer, Blue and Yellow Tanager, Southern Beardless Tyrannulet, and Southern Yellow Grosbeak. After that short stop, we were ready to cross the western Andes slope to the eastern slopes. The day was very clear, so the plan was to go first to the Antenas place; on the border of Pichincha and Napo Provinces looking for Rufous-bellied Seedsnipe, and we saw 2 individuals! An Ecuadorian Hillstar male also showed his colours off to us. Driving the old road down we saw around 6 Andean Condors, 2 Carunculated Caracaras, and several Variable Hawks as well as some Cinclodes; Stout-billed and Barred-winged, always on the paths. Many-striped Canasteros, Andean Tit Spinetail, and Brown-backed Chat-Tyrant we also were seen today. We had a box lunch at 1pm.

And after lunch we tried for Giant Conebill, only found on *Polylepis* trees in Paramo forest habitats. We did not try for long, as it showed up quickly! We started to go to Guango Lodge (2.700m), but had one more stop on the Papallacta Lagoon. We got Andean Teal, Yellow-bellied Pintail, Baird's Sandpiper, Spotted Sandpiper, Southern Lapwing, Andean Coot, and Andean Gull. We arrived at the lodge at 4 pm. We took a short hike to the river and 2 Torrent Ducks, male and female, were seen diving in front of us. By the trails were Gray hooded Bush Tanager, Mountain Wren, Black Crested Warbler and others. Dinner was at 7.pm.

Day 7

Friday 22nd November

Bermeos Road - San Isidro Lodge area - Baeza Village

We had a box breakfast with us, lunch was at San Isidro Lodge, and dinner was at Guango Lodge. We left at 5:30 am to Bermeos Road (2.100m). It was a little cloudy today, but it was not a problem. We saw Crested Quetzal, Olive-sided Flycatcher, Barred Becard, Rufous Crowned Tody Flycatcher, Barred Forest Falcon, etc.

Breakfast at 8:00 am at San Isidro Lodge road, We got, Sickle Winged Guan, Inca Jay, Subtropical Cacique, Russet-backed Oropendola, Emerald Toucanet, Golden Collared Honeycreeper, Andean Potoo roosting, White-capped Parrot, Canada Warbler, and others.

We had a delicious lunch at the lodge at 1 pm, and then to the Baeza Village (1.800 m). We found Canada Warbler, Solitary Sandpiper, Torrent Tyrannulet, Smooth-billed Ani, Golde-eared Tanager, Golden Olive Woodpecker, Saffron Crowned Tanager, all on the river and the forest that crosses the village. We arrived at Guango Lodge at 6.30pm and dinner was at 7pm.

Day 8

Saturday 23rd November

Guango Lodge - Quito

We started at 6 am, taking the Guango's trails, and it was very good light to spot Chestnut-capped Brush Finch, Striped-headed Brush Finch, Pale-naped Brush Finch, Slaty-backed Chat-Tyrant, Blue and Black Tanager, Rufous-breasted Flycatcher, Lacrimose Mountain Tanager, etc. We returned back to the main area to have a look at the feeders, we found 2 new hummingbirds – Long-tailed Sylph and White-bellied Woodstar. We had a traditional breakfast at 8 am and we left at 9 with a box lunch. We took the old Papallacta Road again, to look for Shining Sunbeam, Tufted Tit Tyrant and others that we could not see the first time we visited it. We got those and some more; Blu-mantled Thornbill, Rainbow-bearded Thornbill, Hooded Siskin, and Cinereous Conebill. We had our boxed lunch and drove to Quito airport to leave 3 passengers off; and then to Puembo Bird Garden to leave the rest of the group as it was the end of this successful and enjoyable tour. Total birds seen: 291 species.
