## Day 1

Wednesday 20th July

Weather: Cloudy with rain and occasional sunny periods

Seven tour members met Paul at Heathrow Terminal 5 for the 8.40am British Airways flight to Lyon, arriving at 11.10am, local time. Meanwhile, Susan arrived in Lyon, having flown via Amsterdam from Glasgow. After passport control and baggage reclaim we made our way out to the arrivals area, where we all boarded the bus to the car rental area. As soon as we had completed these formalities we boarded our vehicle for the journey to the Vercors region.

We drove westwards and joined the autoroutes towards Grenoble, stopping briefly for some refreshments, before making a detour to Grenoble Isere regional airport, where we explored the lanes and fields to the east and west of the airport. At our first stop we saw a single male Montague's Harrier, Black Kite, Kestrel, male Hen Harrier and a solitary, distant Short-toed Eagle. A family of Red-backed Shrikes was also busy feeding. The arable fields had mainly been harvested, but a field of magnificent Sunflowers was still standing, providing cover for a number of small birds. Paula spotted a single Titania's Fritillary butterfly, trying hard to warm up. There were still a few plants to see, including *Solidago gigantea* (Early Golden Rod), *Ambrosia artemisiifolia* (Ragweed) and *Amaranthus retroflexus* (Common Pigweed). Several Large White butterflies were also evident. Our second stop produced *Saponaria officinalis* (Soapwort) and *Cucubalus baccifer* (Berry Catchfly), and Goldfinch, Willow Warbler and Chaffinch were all recorded.

From here we continued on south to Grenoble and Sassenage, where we turned up onto the Vercors plateau, and on to Lans en Vercors and the Hotel La Val Fleuri, our base for the tour. Here we were met by Eliane Bonnard and her husband, Francois, our hosts. Having settled into our rooms and freshened up, we went out to a local restaurant, La Charrette, for dinner.

## Day 2

Thursday 21st July

Weather: Cloudy with rain and occasional sunny periods

Following a splendid breakfast, we made the short journey to Les Geymonds, in order to visit the hypermarket to buy our picnic. With this task soon completed, we made our way to the small hamlet of Les Merciers.

The birders set off to try and find the elusive Wallcreeper. Meanwhile Paul and the botanists explored the rocky lane sides and grassland, checking out the plants and butterflies. The birders did see Common Swift, Black Redstart, Chaffinch and Crag Martin. They also heard Blackcap, but sadly, no Wallcreepers. Meanwhile, the botanists' exploration produced *Dianthus carthusianorum* (Carthusian Pink), *Dianthus monspessulanus* (Fringed Pink), *Orchis ustulata* (Burnt Orchid), *Epipactis atrorubens* (Dark Red Helleborine) and *Gentiana cruciata* (Cross Gentian). In the fleeting sunny intervals, butterflies became active, and we saw Apollo, Heath Fritillary and Provence Chalkhill Blue and Arran Brown, among others.

For lunch, we drove down to the Gorges du Furon, where we enjoyed our picnic in a grassy clearing, by the River Bourne. Scotch Argus and Small Skipper butterflies were recorded and a mixed flock of hirundines. As we returned to our vehicle, Susan's sharp eyes picked out a small group of Chamois, on a distant crag.

Our last location for the day was in the hamlet of Traffet. As we parked, Common Buzzard and Honey Buzzard were seen circling in the distance. Continuing into the mixed natural woodland, we followed a series of paths, finding *Goodyera repens* (Creeping Lady's-tresses), *Monotropa hypopitys* (Yellow Bird's-nest) and *Melampyrum nemorosum* (a Cow-wheat). Although the woods seemed very quiet, the birders managed to locate Coal Tit and Crested Tit.

Leaving this beautiful spot, we made our way down towards the spectacular Gorges de la Bourne, to look for Dippers. However, we were now in the teeth of some very heavy and persistent rain. So, as it was very near the end of the day, we made our way back to our hotel via Meaudre. After completing our checklists, we once again visited the restaurant, La Charrette, for dinner.

## Day 3

Friday 22nd July

Weather: warm and sunny, with a stiff breeze

After a quick visit to the hypermarket to buy our lunch, we left Les Geymonds and drove south through the Gorges de la Bourne, where we made two stops. The first was by the river at Les Jarrards. Here the birders looked for Dippers, but unfortunately, did not find any. However, they did get excellent close views of a Short-toed Eagle. Meanwhile, the botanists found *Campanula patula* (Spreading Bellflower), *Tilia cordata* (Small-leaved Lime) and *Epipactis helleborine* (Broad-leaved Helleborine). Our second stop, a little deeper in the gorge, produced some superb scenery, but again, no Dippers.

We now turned west and down to the Royan Valley, where, on the verges we saw good numbers of *Anthericum ramosum* (Small St. Bruno's Lily). Just north of Choranche, we paused to admire the splendid geological formations, and found Great Sooty Satyr and Dryad butterflies. Continuing on through Pont en Royans and St Jean en Royan and made our way up to the precipitous Route Combe Laval, passing Walnut groves as we went. We stopped to scan the cliff walls for Wallcreeper, but had to satisfy ourselves with small mixed groups of hirundines. Botanically there was *Asplenium fontanum* (Smooth Rock Spleenwort), *Acer opalus* (Italian Maple), *Potentilla caulescens* (Lax Cinquefoil) and *Linaria repens* (Striped Toadflax). Driving on past the Col de la Machine, we stopped to enjoy our picnic in the forest, south of Lente, before moving on to the Font d'Urle, an area of sub-alpine meadows and limestone pavements. As we approached, we passed a fine display of *Aconitum lycoctonum* subsp. *vulparia* (Wolf's-bane). Setting off to explore, we were soon being inspected by a flock of Alpine Chough.

Before long we began to record interesting plants, such as *Viola calcarata* (Long-spurred Pansy), *Aconitum napellus* (Monk's-hood) and large numbers of *Dianthus monspessulanus* (Fringed Pink). The birders added Northern Wheatear, Griffon Vulture and Kestrel. However, the highlight of the afternoon was several Alpine Marmots, sunning themselves on the rocks and people-watching. We moved on up to the headland, where we enjoy yet another splendid view and added Swift and Alpine Swift, Grizzled Skipper, Dark-green Fritillary and Common Brassy Ringlet butterflies to the growing list of species. Additional plants included *Serratula alpina* (Alpine Saw-wort), *Carlina acaule* (Stemless Carline Thistle) and *Aster alpina* (Alpine Aster).

After rejoining our vehicles, we now made our way over the Col de la Chau, making a short stop at the cemetery, where the victims of the Nazi massacre at Vassieux during the Second World War are buried, before driving on south. Our final objective today was to try and watch Griffon Vultures returning to their roost on the cliffs below the spectacular Col de Rousset. We drove through the tunnel at Rousset, making a short stop to enjoy our final spectacular view of the day. A solitary Chamois was spotted feeding on a distant crag, before we made our way the short distance down the valley to Chamaloc, where we parked on a wide verge, at a point where we were able to get good views of the vultures' roost. It was not long before Griffon Vultures began to appear, circling on what remained of thermals. Among them we also saw a single Cinereous (Black) Vulture as well. For the botanists, there was *Campanula speciosa* (a Bellflower), *Iberis stricta* subsp. *leptophylla* (Annual Candytuft) and *Cotinus coggygria* (Smoke Bush). As it was now getting quite late, we took dinner at the Hotel Bellier in La Chapelle en Vercors, before returning to our hotel.

## Day 4

Saturday 23rd July

Weather: Cloudy with light rain at first, becoming sunny and warm later

Leaving the hotel after breakfast, we drove south to an area of wet meadows and light scrub at Les Bruyeres, where Paul dropped us off, while he went to the hypermarket, and it was not long before our exploration produced superb views of a family of Marsh Warblers, feeding. We also saw Common Buzzard, Serin and Yellow Hammer. Plants included *Genista tinctoria* (Dyer's Greenweed), *Angelica sylvestris* (Wild Angelica) and *Scirpus sylvaticus* (Wood Clubrush).

Moving on, we made our way up to the Route Forestal de Autrans, a magnificent example of natural mixed woodland, of *Abies alba* (European Silver Fir), *Picea abies* (Norway Spruce), *Acer pseudoplatanus* (Sycamore) and other various broad-leaved shrubs. Our first stop produced Short-toed Treecreeper, Bullfinch and several Crested Tits. Meanwhile, the botanists found *Paris quadrifolia* (Herb Paris), *Calamintha grandiflora* (Large-flowered Calamint), *Lilium martagon* (Martagon Lily) and *Monotropa hypopitys* (Yellow Bird's-nest). We took lunch further along the route, just below the viewpoint at Le Moliere, among a fine stand of *Gentiana lutea* (Great Yellow Gentian) and *Adenostyles alliariae* (Adenostyles).

After completing our picnic, we made our way back to a point where we could clearly overlook the valley to the west. By now the sun was shining and the butterflies were becoming active, we saw, Great Banded Grayling, Damon Blue, Grizzled Skipper, Marbled White, Scotch Argus and Almond-eyed Ringlet. The botanists added *Campanula cochlearifolia* (Fairy's Thimbles), *Cicerbita alpina* (Alpine Sow-thistle), *Gymnadenia conopsea* subsp. *densiflora* (a Fragrant Orchid), *Dactylorhiza fuchsii* (Common Spotted Orchid) and *Neottia ovata* (Twayblade). B

y now the birds had become quite elusive, but Blackcap, Common Whitethroat, Sparrowhawk and Robin were recorded. We now returned to Lans en Vercors to prepare for dinner.

## Day 5

Sunday 24th July

Weather: Cloudy and dull at first becoming brighter later

We began today with a short drive towards St Nizier du Moucherotte, stopping in the forest. This wonderful example of natural mixed conifer and deciduous woodland is home to a number of special plants, and birds, but it was the orchids that were to attract most attention. The small, eerily white spikes of *Epipogium aphyllum* (Ghost Orchid) were the highlight, and we found about 20 or so. In addition we saw *Epipactis microphylla*, *Epipactis muelleri* (Mueller's Helleborine) and *Epipactis atrorubens* (Dark Red Helleborine). In addition, there were also several spikes of *Monotropa hypopitys* (Yellow Bird's-nest). On the verge we found *Campanula glomerata* (Clustered Bellflower), *Digitalis lutea* (Small Yellow Foxglove) and *Gymnadenia conopsea* (Fragrant Orchid).

Returning to the vehicles, we continued on down the east side of the plateau through Seyssins and Claix. We left the auto-route near St. Paul-les-Monistier. After passing through the town, we made our way to an area of meadows at Plan de Grisél. By now the sun was beginning to show itself, and the insects were starting to become active: Mazarine Blue, Chapman's Blue, Marbled White, Wood White and Meadow Brown butterflies were all seen, and Wartbiter, Dark Bush and Great Green Bush Crickets were also recorded. The birders found family groups of Red-backed Shrike and Whinchat, together with Crested Tit, Swallow, House Martin and Swift. After completing our picnic, we began scanning the distant mountain side, find in a small group of Chamois and a pair of distant Golden Eagles.

Following our picnic, we moved on to Gresse en Vercors, where we took the narrow road to the Pas du Serpaton (1586m), parking at the low summit. After pausing to take photos of the famous Mont Aiguille (2037m), we set out to explore. The birders set off for the summit, finding a massive flock of Alpine Chough, Raven and Kestrel. Meanwhile the botanists began to descend the narrow road, exploring the verges. *Scabiosa lucida* (Shining Scabious), *Gentiana cruciata* (Cross Gentian), *Veronica spicata* (Spiked Speedwell), *Centranthus angustifolia* (Narrow-leaved Red Valerian), *Tetragonolobus maritimus* (Dragon's Teeth), *Serratula alpina* (Alpine Saw-wort) and *Helianthemum nummularium* (Common Rockrose) were all seen. Scanning the distant mountainside, a small group of Alpine Ibex were also seen.

We now made our way back to Monistier de Clemont, where we had dinner in the Pizzeria Campobello, where we sat outside in the warm evening sun. Leaving Monistier, we drove north towards Vif, where we were to visit a local reserve where Eurasian Beaver are known to live. Setting up our viewing point, we were soon recording birds. Little Bittern, Little Egret, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Mallard and Coot were also seen. Just as the light began to dim, we had our first sighting of the Beaver, swimming across the pond, on the surface. It made its way to the margin of the pond, where it began collecting reeds, which it then transported back to its island lodge. This happened several times. Also, as the light faded, we were treated to a wonderful display of Nightjars, hunting insects across the surface of the water. When we could see no more, we made our way back to Lans en Vercors, for some well earned sleep.

## Day 6

Monday 25th July

Weather: Fine and sunny in the morning, becoming cloudy and wet later

The principal objective for today was to make a day-long walk up to the Pas de l'Oeille, above Villard de Lans. After the usual visit to the hypermarket, we drove up to the low level cable car station at Le Balcon Cote 2000, and caught the 9.30am lift to Le Altitude 2000 upper station at 1,720 metres. Before we began to make our way up the well sign-posted track, we observed a small flock of Citril Finch feeding and a solitary Nutcracker. As we progressed, we found *Hypericum richeri subsp. burseri* (a St. John's-wort), *Scabiosa lucida* (Shining Scabious) and *Linaria supina* (Pyrenean Toadflax). The path to the Pas de l'Oeille was uneven, but not too difficult. On a distant peak we found a small group of Alpine Ibex, resting in the morning sun, and in among the scattered *Pinus uncinata* (Mountain Pine), we found a solitary Chamois. Alpine Marmot were numerous and rather vocal, there squeaking calls carrying across the mountainside.

We took several rest stops for water, on the ascent, but progressed steadily, passing *Arnica montana* (Arnica), *Doronicum grandiflora* (Leopard's-bane) and *Allium narcissiflorum* (Narcissus-flowered Onion). All around us Alpine Chough were calling, and a single Red-billed Chough was also spotted. We stopped for lunch in an area of broken limestone boulders, enjoying our picnic with the addition of stunning views. As we paused, to select an ideal picnic spot, some group members were fortunate enough to see an inquisitive weasel!

After we had eaten, the botanists continued on a short way finding *Gentiana nivalis* (Snow Gentian), the fruiting heads of *Pulsatilla alpina* (Alpine Pasque Flower), *Ranunculus alpestris* (Alpine Buttercup), *Pritzelago alpina* (Chamois-cress) and *Armeria maritima subsp. alpina* (Mountain Thrift). Meanwhile the birders added Alpine Accentor, Water Pipit and a single Wallcreeper. By now the cloud had descended, and it had begun to rain, so we began our descent back to the cable car station, where we enjoyed refreshments at the Café Altitude Cote 2000, before catching the 16-00hrs cable car back down. After meeting to complete our checklists, we took dinner in the adjacent Hotel du Col de L'Arc.

## Day 7

Tuesday 26th July

After breakfast, we left the hotel and drove south once again through the Gorges de la Bourne. Taking the Choranche road, we made a right turn just after the village and climbed up to the magnificent cliffs of the Route de Presles, a stunning limestone cliff formation, over-looking the Commune de Chatelus and the valley of the River Bourne. Here, the birders saw Alpine Swift, House Martin and Raven, Honey Buzzard, Common Buzzard and Red-backed Shrike, while the botanists found *Telephium imperati*, *Lactuca perennis* (Blue Mountain Lettuce), *Prunus mahaleb* (St. Lucie's Cherry) and *Teucrium montanum* (Mountain Germander). We also added Lulworth Skipper, Gatekeeper and Large Blue to the butterfly list, and saw Common Wall Lizard.

We now set off into the Forêt des Coulmes, heading for the Fontaine de Petouze, where we set up our picnic. As we went Paul spotted a single *Himantoglossum hircinum* (Lizard Orchid) on a road verge. After lunch, we set out to explore the local area. A small pond produced emerging Blue Hawker Dragonflies, and a nearby meadow had Niobe Fritillary, Scotch Argus, Arran Brown and Meadow Brown butterflies and Shaded Broad-bar moth in it.

Retracing our steps, we made our way back down the Route de Presles, stopping on the banks of the River Bourne, where several *Buddleja davidii* (Butterfly-bush) bushes increased the moth and butterfly numbers. Jersey Tiger, Hummingbird Hawkmoth and Broad-bordered Bee Hawkmoth were seen, together with Silver Washed Fritillary, Scarce Swallowtail, Dryad, Great Banded Grayling, Grizzled Skipper and Clouded Yellow.

The remainder of the afternoon was spent in the picturesque town of Pont en Royans, where we visited a local cafe for refreshments. Dipper, Crag Martin, Spotted Flycatcher and Grey Wagtail were all seen in the river gorge. We returned to Lans en Vercors, in time to pack, before going for our final dinner in the Restaurant Charrette.

## Day 8

Wednesday 27th July

Weather: Cloudy with light rain at first

After an early breakfast we bid farewell to our host Mme. Bonnard and her husband Francois, and began our journey back to Lyon. We retraced the route north that we had used on arrival. Along the way we saw Common Buzzard, Grey Wagtail and Grey Heron. We arrived at Lyon St. Exupery Airport in good time for our various flights back to the UK.
