## Summary

A short birding trip to the very special Camargue district of southern France provides an excellent opportunity to experience good views of typical waterbirds of the west Mediterranean. Utilising a family-run hotel on the outskirts of the ancient city of Arles as our base, the itinerary provided an easy opportunity to look for flamingoes, herons and wading birds using the shallow waters and reed-fringed lagoons as a breeding area or a suitable stop-over for north-bound migrants. Scrubby and dryer areas attract different and more localized species and we located glamour birds such as Hoopoe, Roller and Eurasian Bee-eater, together with a selection of raptors that call the Camargue home.

## Day 1

**Wednesday 3rd May**

Twelve guests travelled with leaders Ian and Neil on an Easyjet flight from Gatwick, North Terminal, to Montpellier. All went according to plan and we took immediate delivery of two Opel Vivaro minibuses from the airport and drove around Etang de Mauguio, seeing plenty of Greater Flamingoes and a Hoopoe whilst doing so. Our journey took us past some rice paddies where we saw our first views of Glossy Ibis and plenty of Black-headed and Mediterranean Gulls. A quick recce at Mas d'Agon provided views of a Squacco Heron perched on a roadside post, sadly partially obscured by reed. Pressing on, we soon arrived at Hotel des Granges, our home for the next four nights and here we met up with four of our party who had travelled under their own steam.

So, as a full complement, we were greeted by the vibrant song of the Nightingale and plenty of "chirruping" House Sparrows around the hotel grounds. Marie-Jo and Bruno (the proprietors of the hotel) greeted us warmly and rooms were allocated. Some of us went for a walk whilst the guides popped into nearby Arles to purchase picnic items for the following day.

At 7.30pm we sat down to a sumptuous meal and then it was lights out for many due to travel fatigue.

## Day 2

**Friday 4th May**

Ten guests met at 6.30am for a track walk, there and back, along to the canal. We recorded Common Buzzard, Kestrel, Black Kite, Nightingale, Cetti's Warbler, Corn Bunting, Zitting Cisticola (Fan-tailed Warbler), Kingfisher and two Rollers. A fly-over Tree Pipit was the only one recorded during the tour.

After our 8am breakfast we mustered at 8.45am and left with our picnic on board a short time later. Roadside birding in the Mas d'Agon area proved to be particularly productive. For many a perched and well-behaved Great Spotted Cuckoo was the highlight, but the feeding Gull-billed Terns, stunning Mediterranean Gulls, a confiding Whiskered Tern and our first Bee-eaters were all contenders. Migrant 'Tundra' Ringed Plover and Wood Sandpiper initiated the wader list with flocks of both showing well.

A little further down the road, bushes and reed provided views of smaller birds including a Pied Flycatcher and Bearded Reedling for some. A flock of Whiskered Terns, with two accompanying Black Terns, were easier to see and raptors overhead included Short-toed Eagle, Black Kite and a female Peregrine Falcon. The herons were not

to be outdone and up to six Purple Herons provided a variety of views, eclipsing the more plentiful egrets. Great Reed and European Reed Warblers, Red-crested Pochard, Black-winged Stilt and Glossy Ibis helped provide the backdrop for some really enjoyable birdwatching in ideal weather conditions.

Morning quickly changed to lunch time and we drove south on the D570 to reach the Parc Ornithologique du Pont de Gau. Here we did justice to our eagerly awaited picnic with Nightingales, Cetti's Warbler and some very young scholars from a school outing all entertaining us!

Off we then went for an afternoon dawdle around the shallow lagoons of this reserve, observing nesting Grey Heron and Cattle and Little Egrets at very close range. The Coypu is a large, introduced rodent of almost beaver-sized proportions and plenty of these ambivalent animals entertained us as they swam around in the margins.

Greater Flamingoes were arguably the stars of the show here, with many flocks only a matter of metres away from us as they fed and rested in this safe haven. It was easy to read the colour-rings which were affixed to the legs of a proportion of these birds. Black-winged Stilt, Pied Avocet, Little Tern and Red-crested Pochard all showed well and a couple of Black-crowned Night Herons also put in an appearance. Singing Moustached Warblers remained hidden but Sardinian Warblers showed nicely. We finished with a hot drink at the café and then took a steady drive back to our hotel for about 5.30pm. After freshening up, we completed the checklist for the day and sat down to enjoy another Provencal signature meal.

## Day 3

## Saturday 5th May

Our early-morning walk before breakfast finally provided some good views of Melodious Warbler and Nightingale, plus Crested Lark and a hunting Red Fox. Our morning concentrated on working the eastern side of the Camargue but we were still west of the River Rhone. We skirted round the edge of Etang de Vaccares, espying distant Great Crested and Black-necked Grebes and a fishing Osprey. White Storks bill-clattered from atop their nests and it was a day for seeing as many as a dozen Short-toed Eagles, two of which caught and consumed small snakes/slow worms.

A distant flock of Collared Pratincoles came a little closer so that we could appreciate their basic flight action and plumage characteristics, and more raptors included Hobby, Marsh Harrier and a young male Montagu's Harrier.

Our picnic spot provided views of Kingfisher, an all-too-brief White-winged Tern and a mixture of freshwater birds. Then it was off to the coast as we navigated through the settlement of Salin de Giraud with its unusual houses, originally built for immigrant workers. The saltpans were mostly empty of birds but the open lagoons held good numbers of waders and terns. Dunlin, Little Stint, Curlew Sandpiper, Pied Avocet and Black-winged Stilt all showed well and terns included Little, Sandwich and Common. A first summer Little Gull fed alongside flocks of super-looking Slender-billed Gulls with Mediterranean, Black-headed and Yellow-legged Gulls providing more side-by-side variety.

Scanning at Piemaeson added Grey Plover and Sanderling, and the opportunity of savoring the sights and evocative calls of Sandwich Terns as they gathered to bathe and preen. It was then a slow trundle back to our hotel, slowing to examine any roadside birds which included a fine female Red-footed Falcon.

## Day 4

## Sunday 6th May

Our 6.30am track walk leading from the hotel provided Little Owl, calling Quail, two singing Grasshopper Warblers, Black Redstart, White Wagtail and Red Fox. That was in addition to the norm of singing Nightingales, Melodious Warblers and 'zitting' Fan-tailed Warblers, now called Zitting Cisticolas!

After breakfast we ventured to La Crau, and the approach from the north produced brief views of Woodlark, Golden Oriole and Turtle Dove. On arriving at the stony semi-desert it decided to rain, and it was heavy too! So we remained in our minibuses, waiting for a reprieve for about an hour or so. We then circumnavigated the area and attacked it from the south where there were brief fly-over views of Little Bustard for some and a nice flock of 30-40 Lesser Kestrels for all of us! Other good birds included some singing Calandra Larks, up to seven Stone-curlews and brief views of both Hobby and Red-footed Falcon. A couple of wet-looking Tawny Pipits, some Northern Wheatears and a Short-toed Lark didn't look at their best! Warming temperatures with some eagerly-awaited sunshine also provided us with more views of feeding Hoopoe and Roller.

Lunchtime found us at Maries du Vigueirat, a nearby extensive marshland. First it was our picnic lunch on the long tables by the reserve entrance where we continued in our quest to try as many different French cheeses as possible in five days! So, suitably refreshed and perhaps rather full, we waddled into the reserve with a much-improved weather picture and quickly found plenty to look at. Four summer plumage Squacco Herons on the flooded meadows was difficult to beat, particularly as they showed so well, but a rather distant fly-past flock of 14 Black-crowned Night Herons was pretty good, well supported with a Great Egret and a couple of Purple Herons too! White Storks nest here and a couple of Marsh Harriers hunted low in front of us. Eurasian Bee-eaters also nest here and these resplendent birds showed well for us, both perched and in flight.

More heard than seen, warbler song from the scrub and reeds included Reed and Melodious Warblers and Blackcap, well accompanied of course by the numerous Nightingales!

Coypus swam around in the shallow lagoons, indifferent to our presence, and large carp wallowed in the margins. A Stripeless Tree Frog, Wall Lizards and even a Green Lizard or two were on show for a couple of observers, and dragonflies included Black-tailed Skimmer, Lesser Emperor and Scarlet Darter.

We eventually tore ourselves away from this very pleasing reserve, with a little retail therapy evident in the visitors centre, and then made our way back to Hotel des Granges for the checklist, our last evening meal and, of course, some packing!

## Day 5

## Monday 7th May

No early morning walk today as we enjoyed an early breakfast at 7am and then the majority of us departed to Montpellier for onward return home or to continue touring in sunny, warm and breezy conditions. Those flying back to the UK landed at Gatwick Airport, where another Naturetrek adventure came to an end.

## NOTES

1. The accuracy of this plant list is not guaranteed, in part, because identification sometimes took place while on the move or at stops when the group were watching birds.
2. The locations are approximate because there are not clear boundaries between the areas.
3. The weather was problematic at Le crau, so, while the plant families are reasonably accurate, the particular species may not be.
4. Entries in italics indicate plants seen in the area before or after the tour.
5. Plants seen in the area which have their origin in other parts of the world have been omitted from the list.
6. Some plants which originate elsewhere but have become naturalised in the wild, especially close to farms, have been included.
7. Widespread refers to the extent of the coverage, not the frequency of occurrences.
