Day 1

Wednesday 5th July

Fly Gatwick to Lyons – Pont en Royans – La Chappelle-en-Vercors

An early start to the day for one guest and the tour leader meant that meeting in the coffee queue at Starbucks at London Gatwick was hardly surprising! After a delayed flight and a rather exciting landing in Lyon, we made our way to the car hire and after a very smooth transaction (almost gathering up some extra guests who liked the sound of the trip) we headed south down the A43 towards Grenoble. The weather was hot (25 degrees) but slightly cloudy. En route we spotted Kestrel, Black Kite, Common Buzzard and a flyover from some Long-tailed Tits. We paused in Pont-en-Royans for some refreshments, but not before adding a good number of new species including Wall Brown, Scarce Swallowtail, Brimstone, Cleopatra, High Brown Fritillary, Marbled White and White Admiral butterflies. A pair of Grey Wagtails flew downriver but unfortunately there were too many people in the water for any likelihood of Dipper. However, we did see a handsome male Black Redstart and some good views of White Wagtails as well as some impressive numbers of Common Swifts swooping over the rooftops. On our way back to the van, we made note of several wildflowers including Herb Robert, Maidenhair Spleenwort, Horsemint, Ivy-leaved Toadflax and White Stonecrop.

Arriving at the Hotel Belliers, we met the remaining two guests who had been there for an extra day ahead of our arrival. Sitting in the hotel garden under the pleasant shade of the large Sycamore, we discussed our aims for the week before freshening up to enjoy a splendid home-cooked meal – complete with the famous walnuts of this region.

After dinner, a couple of the group had a wander up the lane from the hotel and found a modest group of Lizard Orchid and Pyramidal Orchids in the edge of a cattle field. Wildflowers were in abundance and several new species were added including White Campion, Creeping Thistle, Bladder Campion and Hedge Bedstraw. As dusk fell, we turned on a bat detector which helped us identify the single bat scouting around the field margins as a Common Pipistrelle. In the distance we heard Tawny Owls calling and as we returned to the hotel we saw several plume moths and a Striped Shieldbug. After a long day it was time to turn in for the night.

Day 2

Thursday 6th July

Valchevriere – Les Merciers

Our day began bright and warm, and after a very generous breakfast, we visited the market in La Chapelle where we picked up some local cheeses and fresh bread to take for our picnic later.

The Valchevriere stop took most of the morning. We had a very pleasant walk down to the ruined village. In the woods, we had Herb Paris, Hedge Woundwort, Broad-leaved Helleborine (not in flower yet), lots of geraniums (including ...) we also heard Crested Tits tantalisingly close as well as Short-toed Treecreeper and a Goldcrest feeding its fledgling. Butterflies were very active, and we added Black-veined White, Small Blue and Large White to our checklist as well as some unidentified fritillaries. Common Lizards were basking on the fern-covered walls.

On a short walk along the track above Les Merciers, we had a huge array of wildflowers in the meadow including Pyramidal Orchids, Burnt-tip Orchids, Green Hellebore, Dark Mullein, Yellow Gentian. We also identified Common Swallow-wort (*Vincetoxicum hirundinaria*).

Along the road verges we had lots of Viper's Bugloss and Yellow Foxglove.

At the top, at the farm at the end of the road we picked up a couple of Crag Martins, a pair of Ravens and another Black Redstart. On the limestone we had some Yellow Ox-eye daisy, Burnet Saxifrage, Pale Toadflax and carpets of Wild Thyme.

Day 3

Friday 7th July

Moth trap La Chapelle - Memorial de la resistance – Font d'Urle – Col de la Machine – Combe Laval

Before breakfast we looked through the moth trap which our leader had set up last evening. The morning was overcast and not too warm so luckily the moths were slow to warm up and we had some delightful characters including the very robust Pine and Privet Hawkmoths, as well as Small Elephant Hawkmoth, a beautifully pristine Royal Mantle, and quite a number of Heart & Darts. White Point, Riband Wave, Uncertain and Light Brocade were also present. Among the micromoths we had Small Magpie. However the large Pine Longhorn beetle which made an appearance from some pine logs nearby rather stole the show! During breakfast we also spotted a lovely pair of Common Redstarts flitting around the pool as well as a Violet Carpenter Bee.

At the memorial de la resistance, we had a brief but worthwhile stop as, whilst some guests chased after butterflies, others were scanning the rocky ledges – consequently we managed to add White Admiral, Essex Skipper and a group of Chamois to the list!

The morning was already marching on and getting quite hot now, so we were happy to continue up to the Font d'Urle where we spent several hours marvelling at the scenery, the fabulous spectrum of colour provided by the wildflowers and enjoying the playful Alpine Choughs which frequently flew around us. We struggled to go many steps before finding new things to look at – we ended up spending several hours on the top and whilst there we had great views of Griffon Vultures flying over, as well as frequent and close views of Short-toed Snake Eagle and kestrel. Marmots were heard but it wasn't until later that we spotted them, grazing outside their burrows on the edge of the cliff. A Water Pipit was heard but not seen and a Citril Finch was seen but not heard. During our picnic (which we decided to have here as time had run away with us and no one could bring themselves to leave) we had fantastic views of a pair of Red-backed Shrikes. Among the other species we had Red-billed Chough, Linnet, House Martin and Alpine Swifts. Our wildflower list was not exhaustive, but some highlights were Vanilla Orchid, Round-headed Rampion, Blue Alpine Daisy, Mountain Pansy and Thyme Broomrape. Rather surprisingly we found the Miller fungus.

We tore ourselves away finally from this fine spot, and headed to Col de la Machine where we took in the view before enjoying some refreshment at the café at the top. From here we headed back via the Combe Laval.

Day 4

Saturday 8th July

Cretes de la Moliere (Gorges du Bruyant) – Les Jaileux

After a splendid al fresco breakfast beneath the spreading chestnut tree, we headed to the local market which satisfied our needs for cheese (as well as walnuts and apricots). Swifts were particularly active, and we also saw a Violet Carpenter Bee and Hummingbird Hawkmoth on our way out through the hotel garden.

On our drive north towards Lans en Vercors, we took in the beautifully sweet smell of freshly cut meadows. The temperature was already reaching 30 degrees, so we were glad to be heading in to the shade of the woods on the hunt for the elusive and mysterious Ghost Orchid. We had prepared ourselves for a long morning of hunting but as it happened one guest, Paul, stumbled across a marvellous group of pristine Ghost Orchids before we had barely got our eyes adjusted to the shade. After some time appreciating and photographing this wonderful rarity, we then found several more groups of them! Although the Ghost Orchids drew most of our attention, we also heard Crested Tits and saw numerous Bird's-nest Orchids (all long since flowered), Broad-leaved and Sword-leaved Helleborine (also not flowering) and Common Wintergreen as well as Nodding Thistle and Large Yellow Underwing moth.

Returning to the van we wandered down the road a bit and discovered a group of three Dark Red Helleborine orchids and a single but impressive Marsh Fragrant Orchid. We also recorded High Brown Fritillary, Common Blue and False Heath Fritillary. Longhorn beetles were in abundance here.

At a more appropriate time than yesterday, we made a lunch stop at a layby off the D106L just south of Les Jaileux. We ventured up the track through a mixed woodland reaching a meadow. Apart from hearing a Nuthatch, Blackcap and some noisy Coal Tit fledglings it was quite a quiet period for birds. However, we saw lots of Common Cow-wheat, Limestone Woundwort, Fly Honeysuckle, Slender St John's-wort, Broad-leaved Helleborine and lots of Small Yellow (Straw) Foxglove. Further on the rocky path became steep so some of the group made their way back slowly whilst we explored a steeply sloping meadow which abounded with invertebrate and botanical life - Clustered Bellflower and Red Trefoil Clover being new species for our list. Butterflies including Grizzled Skipper, Scarce Copper, Common Blue, Marbled White, Brimstone and High Brown Fritillary were recorded as well as several longhorn beetles, grasshoppers and bees. Returning to the van along the same track we still managed to find new things, including a Lurid Bolete fungus, White-banded Drone Fly and Snow-in-summer.

We drove back the same route, with a stop in Lans -en-Vercors at the Mountain Café for a well-deserved and very welcome long draught of lemonade.

After another delicious dinner outside, we set up the moth trap in the hotel garden. A few then headed out later on for an evening walk to listen out for common Pipistrelles and Noctule Bats feeding over the pool. A wander down the lane produced more Lizard and Pyramidal Orchids. Upon returning to the hotel, around 23:00 it was still very warm and the moth trap was already attracting a great deal of attention.

Day 5

Sunday 9th July

La Coche – Col de Rousset

At 6.30 am, some of the group met outside to go through the moth trap in the hotel garden, with some joining later on. With the sun already giving plenty of warmth the Blackcaps were in full flow of song and the Swifts were all screaming above. The trap was heaving, and we had some charismatic species including Small Elephant, Privet and Pine Hawkmoths. Rosy Footman, Ground Lackey, Black V Moth and Grey Arches were good additions to our moth trap earlier in the week. We also had the beautifully marked White Spot and the robust Goat Moth but the highlight was a single *Rhodostrophia vibicaria* which wasn't found until we were dismantling the moth trap.

After a leisurely breakfast outside, we headed south toward St-Agnan-en-Vercors and took a steep narrow track up to La Coche where we spent the morning exploring the meadows, woodlands and tracks. With the temperature soaring over 30 degrees, we were keen to take some shelter in the shade in between leaping after butterflies in the open. During one of these respites, we heard teasingly close Crested Tits and had a wonderful close view of Willow Tits flitting about the lower branches of the spruces. Wandering up a quiet track we were greeted by Cleopatra and Apollo moths as well as Heath Fritillary. The Queen of Spain Fritillary was abundant here, as was Wood White and Mountain Ringlet. In the car park we had a very obliging Mazarine Blue and Swallowtail also gave us several fly-bys.

After a very cheese-orientated lunch in the welcome (but scarce) shade around the van, we headed back out for a short wander to tot up a few more species including Herb Paris, Wood Avens and Bee Beetle. We decided to head back down and on to the Col de Rousset where we stopped halfway down for a view. Despite the sweltering heat we spent some time taking in the view and watching the butterfly life visiting the abundant Viper's Bugloss covering the slope below us. Griffon Vultures soared overhead and with the background hum of cicadas and motorbikes, we drank in the mountain views as well as the stunning Scarce Swallowtail and Apollo butterflies. Hummingbird Hawkmoths and Brown Argus were also around and after some time we dragged ourselves away and made our way back to La Chapelle, only stopping briefly just south of St Agnan to look for Dipper.

Day 6

Monday 10th July

Cote 2000 (Villard-de-Lans) – Pas de L'Oeille

After a very pleasant breakfast outside, we headed out promptly to Villard-de-Lans and the cable car up to Cote 2000.

After a short steep hike partway up the track, we rested in the shade for a moment and spotted some Crested Tits, Alpine Choughs and a pair of Golden Eagles soaring high up. A Marmot made a brief appearance before the group split, with some settling amongst the shade of pines to watch for mammals and birds whilst the rest headed on further up the mountain. Higher up off piste, we found Black Vanilla Orchid, Heath Fragrant Orchid, a Wood Tiger moth, Brassy Ringlets, Geranium Argus and Mountain Clouded Yellow as well as some very territorial Swallowtails. Summer Chafer was also recorded as was Copper Click Beetle and several blue butterfly species including Mazarine and Small. Botanical species included Fairy Foxglove, Mountain Thrift, Harebell, Mountain Pine, Alpine Figwort and Rock Rose.

A generous lunch was had at the café before venturing into the trees again and then taking the cable car back down.

This evening was very close without any breeze, so we set up the moth trap, with bats flying over our heads and we also found some Glow Worms – a male and a female!

Day 7

Tuesday 11th July

Col de Toutes Aures (D292 route to Presles) – Pont-en-Royans

In the garden we met from 6.30am onwards to go through the moth trap. Having been a very warm, still night it was heaving with moths and beetles; compared to the previous mornings we caught a very different variety of macro moths including around half a dozen Leopard Moths and other species such as Broad-bordered Yellow Underwing, Bordered Gothic, Black, Grey and Green Arches, Latticed Heath, Hoary Footman, Maple Prominent, Poplar Lutestring and Cloaked Minor. Heart & Dart was by far our most numerous species in our moth traps this week, but given that some guests had never done a moth trap before this week, seeing the beautiful diversity of the moths was enlightening.

After breakfast and a brief visit to the bakery to get fresh bread for picnic lunch, we headed northwards through Pont-en-Royans and took the D292 towards Presles. After some climbing windy lanes, we made a stop for a view and a wander which turned into several hours of exploring – we ended up having our lunch here (overlooking St Andres en Royans) too as it was so pleasant.

The place was alive with butterflies and the strong ringing of cicadas, of which we managed to spot up in the Oak branches! Some oozing sap on one tree was attracting a number of butterflies, mainly Woodland Grayling and Great Banded Grayling as well as a rather large Stag Beetle which we admired for some time. A couple of new orchids were added to our list, namely Dark Red Helleborine, Red Helleborine (which had mainly finished flowering) and Mueller's Helleborine. Despite being our last full day out, we managed to add a healthy number of new insects including day flying moths (Provence, Crepuscular and Transparent Burnet moths), White-spotted Rose Chafer, Great Green Grasshopper and Golden-ringed Dragonfly. Blue-spot Hairstreak, Sooty Satyr and Dusky Meadow Brown were additions to our butterflies. For the wildflowers, St. Bernard's Lily, Pyrenean Flax, Scarlet pimpernel, Field Eryngo, Round-headed Leek and Tall Fleabane were also noted.

Pausing at a bridge just before returning to Pont-en-Royans, we spotted White-throated Dipper and Grey Wagtail as well as a number of butterflies feeding on the Buddleia bushes overhanging the rapids. After satiating our desire for seeing Dippers, we parked in the centre of Pont-en-Royans where we enjoyed ice creams. Swallowtails were flitting around the streets, and we also saw a Southern Skimmer dragonfly at the water's edge.

After dinner, we had a short wander just beyond the hotel garden to find Glow Worms - of which we were delighted to find two just yards from the drive, and before it was properly dark.

Day 8

Wednesday 12th July

Last day – Les Meunieres (St Agnan en Vercors)

After an impressive thunderstorm overnight, we were relieved that the temperature had dropped to a more favourable level (at least whilst we had our final breakfast). We had a brief visit to the shops for some essentials (namely wine and cheese for some!) then took a short jaunt down the road (south) through St Agnan-en-Vercors and onwards to a site where we hoped to find Creeping Ladies' Tresses. Already the sun was radiating a reasonable level of heat, so we were grateful that this short exploration was mostly in woodland. Having barely stepped foot out of the vehicle we found a good display of Dark Red Helleborine and a few Mueller's Helleborine as well as a scattering of Pyramidal and Burnt-tip Orchids. We ventured deeper under the trees and found lots of Common Twayblade and plentiful White Helleborine though the latter was sadly no longer flowering. After a wonderful Crested Tit sighting (we had heard them all week but not everyone had seen them), we adjusted our eyes to searching for something smaller, and soon discovered a good patch of (just) flowering Creeping Ladies' Tresses. Growing on the moss in the dappled shade, we could have easily missed them, and each plant only had the lowest flowers but we were glad to find them. On our return to the vehicle, we had a brief but close glimpse of a Marsh Tit and what appeared to be a display flight of a male Kestrel.

A Southern White Admiral and an Ocellated Lizard (leader only) were excellent additions to our list.
