Day 1

Friday 20th June

For the first night of the Naturetrek tour we gathered for dinner at our hotel in Alton. After dinner we drove a few miles north to Mapledurwell Fen where we located large quantities of marsh orchids. There were orchid 'swarms' of Southern Marsh, Early Marsh, Common Spotted and one or two Pugley's Marsh Orchid. Also present were large numbers of Marsh Helleborines.

Then we drove the short distance back to the River Whitewater to look for bats. Here we detected four species of bat calling, although the group only actually saw one bat in flight! There were Long-eared Bats feeding alongside the hedge, Pipistrelles overhead and Daubenton's Bats feeding over the river, while Natterer's bats were feeding over our heads. All in all, it was a fantastic evening.

Day 2

Saturday 21st June

Our next stop was the top of Portsdown. From here we had a lovely view over the south coast to the New Forest and the Isle of Wight, from where we went to look at a *belgarum* form of Bee Orchid and the extremely rare Field Cow-wheat and an unusually yellow broomrape growing on ivy. From there we went on to a downland garden, where the rare white form of Pyramidal Orchid was growing, followed by a walk along the crest of Portsdown. Here we also found the more usual downland plants in profusion, including Yellow Rattle, Mignonette, Salad Burnet and Rockrose.

Lunch was in Southwick, after which we went to a woodland rich in orchids. We found large numbers of Bird's Nest Orchids and White Helleborines growing in a spectacular beech tree 'cathedral'.

Then we had a stop to look at a wood near East Meon where there was a good display of the rare Sword-leaved Helleborine, although they had finished flowering. We also found several Broad-leaved Helleborine, some about to flower, and a small Green-flowered Helleborine.

Our final stop of the day was to look at a wood in Hornbeam where Wild Service tree, Rowan and Whitebeam have been crossing for centuries. This has led to the creation of a new hybrid *Sorbus* x *vagensis*, which is a cross between Wild Service and Whitebeam, and there's the possibility of a hybrid between Wild Service and Rowan.

Then we headed back to Alton for dinner and a well-earned drink at the bar.

Day 3

Sunday 22nd June

After a reasonably early start we went to a National Nature Reserve, The Warren, where we found White Helleborines growing under the dense shade of the yews. At the car park area there was also the unexpected sighting of a Mole running across the road – a real highlight for the leader!

En route we had stopped to see two, 3000-year-old Yews. Both were magnificent trees and enjoyed by the group. Then we went on to Noar Hill in the warm morning sunshine. Noar Hill is perhaps one of the finest chalk flower assemblages in southern England and is covered in a variety of orchids. During the course of the walk we found Common Spotted, Fragrant, Musk, Frog Orchids and Common Twayblade interspersed with vetches and thymes. There was also a superb Knapweed Broomrape and a small patch of the rare vetch, Dragon's Teeth.

Lunch in Selborne was followed by our final visit of the weekend – to the army training ranges at Woolmer. This visit was in total contrast to the rest of the weekend which had all been chalk-themed, as we stopped on the dry acid heath of the ranges. Here Heather and Bell Heather were growing and a couple of Woodlarks and Dartford Warbler were calling. On the ponds Black-tailed and Keeled Skimmers whirled round, while in the pond Natterjack tadpoles were swimming around in company with the extremely rare Spangled Diving Beetle which is only found at Woolmer.

Our final sighting of the day was the beautiful Flower Crab Spider eating a very large bee.
