

## Suffolk: Aldeburgh \& Iken Cliff (Guide: Brian Small)

## Saturday 9th March 2024

## Highlights

- An array of wildfowl on North Warren marshes, including fine Pintail...
- ...fine views of Gadwall, Teal, Wigeon and Shoveler...
- ...plus three Goosander and a drake Ring-necked Duck
- I62 White-fronted Geese and many Curlew on the town marshes
- Many Avocet, both Black-tailed and Bar-tailed Godwits at Iken
- A grand finale of a fine Peregrine and Crane at Snape

We met at Slaughden at 9am and with a last-minute change to the morning's itinerary immediately headed to Church Farm marshes at North Warren, where with the light behind us we had fine views of many wildfowl. Initially, many Pintail and Shoveler were wheeling about having been disturbed by a male Marsh Harrier, but they had settled by the time we reached the first hide. From here we scanned the pools seeing plenty of Wigeon and Teal, in addition to a first-winter Caspian Gull and a pair of Goosander. On the middle pool we were lucky to find the over-wintering Ring-necked Duck - a vagrant from North America.

Moving to the second hide produced even better views of the aforementioned ducks, plus Snipe, Little and Great Egrets, iridescent displaying Lapwing as well as Stonechats and singing Cetti's Warblers in the bushes.

Back at Slaughden, we walked west along the bank of the River Alde, picking up numerous Curlew, singing Skylark and Meadow Pipit, several Great Crested and a single Little Grebe. More Stonechat sat atop the brambles, but more impressive was a large flock of Whitefronted Geese that flew north over the town, before turning and heading back over our heads to land on the fields. We walked on to the main pools, where on the high tide over 900 Dunlin had gathered along with Ringed Plover and nearly 200 Curlew; the flock of White-fronts were
counted (162). Heading back to the coast, a few had fish and chips for lunch, then we drove round to Iken Cliff for a walk along the river.

Though the winds were holding the tide in a bit, we were able to see a large flock of Avocet on the river, plus many Black-tailed Godwit, Redshank and Shelduck. Further searching and a walk west towards Snape Maltings produced Knot, Grey Plover, Bar-tailed Godwit and Dunlin; back at the car park a pair of Woodlark took off and flew to the field from which we had heard them singing on arrival.

The fun was not over, as we visited the new RSPB Snape Wetlands at Botany Marsh, where numerous Buzzard and Marsh Harriers were joined by a lovely Peregrine that flew past to settle on a post. We ended the afternoon with a Crane out amongst the reedmace.
