Day 1

Monday 22nd May

Southampton, Newtown Marsh, Parkhurst Forest and Ventnor

10-21 degrees

Meeting at the ferry terminal, we all loaded on the van and onto the ferry as we started our adventure to the Isle of Wight. The journey over was calm and on arrival we headed to Shalfleet for a spot of lunch before heading to Newtown Marsh where we walked down to the marsh through the elms where we saw Holly Blue and Speckled Wood flitting around. Reaching the hide, we scanned noting Mediterranean Gulls out on the breakwater feeding, while a stunning Black-tailed Godwit fed in front of the Black-headed Gull colony. Behind on the creek, we saw both Harbour Seals on the mud and Grey Seals floating in the water. We headed along the road to the reserve where the next meadow had hundreds of Green-winged Orchids and a few Common spotted Orchids.

We walked out onto the saltmarsh where several Oystercatcher were feeding as well as a group of Sandwich Tern resting out on the promontories. Moving around to the next meadow, we found Dyers Greenweed and Small Heath butterfly. Once we reached the van, we headed down the road a little way where we stopped and had a look for Adders Tongue Fern finding several plants.

We moved on towards Parkhurst Forest spotting a Red Kite on route. On arrival we found a Red Admiral and then a Red Squirrel feeding just off the track. We carried on around the woods before heading to the hotel. On the walk down for dinner in the town we had a Fulmar fly through.

Day 2

Tuesday 23rd May

St Lawrence, Needles Alum Bay, Freshwater, Compton Chime, Brook Down and Strawberry Lane

10-19 degrees

We started the morning at the hotel where the group saw Wall Lizard before we headed off to St Lawrence where there was a lot of Crosswort in flower as well as Crested Cow Wheat just coming into flower. We scanned across the fields we spotted ten Hares.

We moved on to the Needles and Alum Bay. We got off to a slow start with only a singing Willow Warbler as we walked up to the point, but we managed to see Raven and two Peregrines circling around. As we got closer to the top, species such as Painted Ladies and Grizzled Skipper appeared. Going on to look at the Needles, the smell was strong with the flowers with lots of Horseshoe Vetch, while a Rock Pipit put in an appearance with a Wall Butterfly flitting around. We walked back down enjoying the stunning views of Hurst Castle. Reaching the van, we headed to Freshwater for lunch before heading to Compton Chime.

We arrived and looked around, soon finding Small Blue, Grizzled and Dingy Skipper as well as a very showy Green Hairstreak. After a little searching, we also found Glanville Fritillary. Walking along the track we found Hoary Stock in full flower as well as lots of Yellow Rattle.

We headed on to Brook Common for a look where we found both the skippers and Small Blue as well as a Hobby over, as well as some great Green winged Orchids.

We headed over to Strawberry Lane which was quite quiet but with lots of Common Blue, Small Copper and Brown Argus, good numbers of Linnets as well as another Hare which soon ran up the hill. There was also lots of Horehound. We finally left and went for dinner at Brightstone and then home to bed for the night.

Day 3

Wednesday 24th May

Bempton and Brading Marsh, St Helen Sea view, Arraton, Atherstone Mead, Compton Chime

11-21 degrees sunny

After breakfast we headed out with most of the group seeing the Wall Lizard - giving its forecast for the day as it sunbathed on the wall. We headed to Bembridge Bay and walked along the sea edge of Brading Marsh. For some, the first Cuckoo of the year was heard. We were serenaded by Sedge, Reed and Cetti's warbler, we soon picked up a Marsh Harrier drifting across. We found Blue-tailed Damselfly drifting round the brambles. We soon picked up on something not quite right or to be honest, just big and making the other birds agitated! It was a White-tailed Eagle up in the dead trees! We moved on keeping an eye on it, and on reaching the bridge, we realised both birds were there. As we watched, we saw the occasional fishing attempt, showing the maturity of these birds with the lovely flash of the white tail.

We moved to St Helens for a spot of lunch before heading to Arreton to look for Purple Broomrape - sadly not up yet. We moved on to Atherstone where we set out for a walk. We stopped at a viewpoint where we were joined by a photographer and also joined by a Red Squirrel that showed well.

Moving on, we got great views of Greater Spotted Woodpecker at the nest. Wandering further, we headed out the woods onto the old railway track, back to the van and then off to Compton Chime where lots of Small Blue showed well in the evening light, before we headed to Hulverstone for dinner.

Day 4

Thursday 25th May

Brading Marsh, Firestone Copse and Southampton

12-23 degrees sunny

We had our last breakfast as a group and said our farewells to our hosts at the Eversley, before getting underway and heading over to Brading village and a walk at Brading Marsh. Heading out over the railway track, we headed to Laundry Lane for a walk where a few Holly Blue and Speckled Woods flitted along the hedgerow. We soon

picked up a singing Firecrest that put on a small show for the group. Wandering further along, we soon were welcomed with the song of Reed Warblers with a few Lapwings in the fields. After a scan we picked up on the White-tailed Eagles watching over the reedbeds while a Lesser Whitethroat sang from a nearby hedge. As we wandered back along the lane, the damselflies sprung to life with Common, Blue-tailed, Azure and Large Red all putting in an appearance as well as a Broad-bodied Chaser moving round over the marsh. We heard another Cuckoo teasing the group calling from further out on the marsh. Reaching the vehicle, we headed off to our last stop on the island at Firestone Copse where we went for a walk through the strange mix of pine and broad leaved trees including Wild Service Tree and Narrow-leaved Lungwort in the ditches. We also recorded Common Cow Wheat and Butchers Broom. After a lovely wander, we headed for lunch at a nearby farm shop and café before heading for the boat.

Once loaded on the boat, we started scanning the water noticing large group of gulls feeding with some Sandwich and a couple of Common Terns mixed in. After this, most of the trip was quite quiet apart from a Grey Seal putting in a quick appearance. On disembarking from the boat, we headed to the train station where we said our farewells and headed on our way after a fantastic few days on the Isle Wight.
