Summary

This birding tour in northern Goa combined coastal, wetland and forest habitats, and offered excellent bird diversity and memorable wildlife experiences.

The tour began with arrivals at Mopa Airport and a three-night stay at Mandrem Beach Resort. Early days focused on birding at key sites such as Parcem wetlands, Morjim beach, Siolim marshes, the Socorro plateau, Agassaim beach, and Batim and Carambolim lakes. These locations yielded a rich variety of wetland and coastal species, including waders, gulls, terns, storks, ibises and raptors.

Midway through the tour, the group moved to Backwoods Camp, a birding lodge in the Western Ghats, for a more forest-focused experience. Birding here included Aglote fields, Bolcornem and Dharge villages, Tambdi Surla Temple, Bondla Wildlife Sanctuary, and surrounding forest tracks. This phase of the tour produced a high diversity of endemic and forest species, such as Malabar Trogon, hornbills, woodpeckers, bulbuls, sunbirds, minivets, orioles, flycatchers and drongos. A visit to a spice plantation added a cultural and culinary element, with guests enjoying a guided tour and traditional Goan meal.

Throughout the tour, early morning and late afternoon birding sessions maximized sightings, and participants observed a wide range of species, from shorebirds and waterfowl, to rare forest birds, and nocturnal species like Sri Lanka Frogmouth and Spot-bellied Eagle-Owl.

The tour concluded successfully with most participants seeing a large proportion of the target species, supported by excellent guiding and use of spotting scopes. The group departed from Mopa Airport after a rewarding and well-paced wildlife experience.

Day 1

Saturday 10th January

Clients departed from the UK.

Day 2

Sunday 11th January

After arrival at Mopa Airport, all the clients were picked up around 2.15pm and transferred to their hotel, Mandrem Beach Resort, where they would be staying for three nights. On arrival at the hotel around 3.00pm, the clients checked in and were briefed about the plan for the rest of the day.

We departed at 3.30pm for an afternoon of birding at the Parcem wetlands. On arrival at the site, it was quite sunny and hot, but by the end of the day we had seen a lot of species. Specialities included Ruddy Shelduck, Indian Paradise Flycatcher, Painted Stork, Asian Openbill, Black-headed and Glossy Ibises, Chestnut-tailed Starling and Shikra.

Day 3

Monday 12th January

We picked up the clients at 6.00am and departed for birding at Morjim beach and Parcem fields. On arrival at the beach, we had a few flocks of waders roosting on the beach, and other species in the bushes and trees nearby. After birding on the beach and the surrounding scrubland, we left for Parcem fields and spent an hour and half birding there, returning to the hotel for a late breakfast.

For our afternoon birding, we visited the Socorro plateau. On arrival, it was still quite sunny and hot, but after a while when it started to get a bit cooler and we had added many new species to the list.

Specialities seen during the day were Oriental Skylark, Lesser Whistling Duck, Grey-bellied Cuckoo, Temminck's Stint, Small Pratincole, Lesser Crested Tern, Black-winged Kite, Oriental Honey Buzzard, Indian Golden Oriole, Coppersmith Barbet, Black-rumped Flameback, Small Minivet, Streak-throated Swallow, Tickell's Blue Flycatcher, Crimson-backed Sunbird and Fork-tailed (Blyth's) Swift.

Day 4

Tuesday 13th January

We picked up the clients at 6.00am and departed to go birding at Agassaim beach, and Batim and Carambolim lakes. On arrival at Agassaim, it was a bit cool to start with, and activity was high, with a lots of waders, gulls, terns and other shorebirds, and scrubland species in the nearby bushes. After birding for an hour and half and having seen a lot, we moved on to Batim lake around 8.30am, as it was starting to get quite hot. We spent around half an hour at Batim lake, and then proceeded to Carambolim lake. We spent some more time birding here, adding a few more birds to the list, and returned to the hotel around 11.00am, for a late breakfast.

For our afternoon birding, we visited Siolim marshes. Some clients decided to stay back. We added a few more species to the list birding at this site, and returned to the hotel by 6.45pm.

Specialities seen during the day were Spotted Owlet, Indian Grey and Malabar Pied Hornbills, Cotton Pygmy Goose, Greater Spotted Eagle, Pheasant-tailed and Bronze-winged Jacanas, Indian Cormorant, Terek Sandpiper, White-browed Bulbul, Indian Robin, Vigor's Sunbird, Asian Woolly-necked Stork, Lesser Adjutant, Greater Crested Tern, Slender-billed Gull and lots of other gulls, terns, sand plovers, sandpipers, stints, godwits and others.

Day 5

Wednesday 14th January

Today being the check out from Mandrem Beach Resort and transfer to Backwoods Camp, the clients requested a relaxed morning with a late departure. Three or four keener clients did some birding within the grounds of the resort. We picked up the clients after breakfast around 10.30am, and departed for Backwoods Camp, arriving before lunchtime. After we had briefed the group, the rooms were allotted.

For our afternoon birding, we went to Aglote fields and surroundings. We added a few more special birds to the list at this site, and returned to camp by 6.30pm.

Good birds seen today included White-rumped Spinetail, Asian Palm Swift, Indian Swiftlet, Brown-capped Pygmy Woodpecker, Vernal Hanging Parrot, Orange Minivet, Indian Jungle Crow, Grey-fronted Green Pigeon and Spot-bellied Eagle-Owl.

Day 6

Thursday 15th January

This morning, we did some birding on the Backwoods Camp track, and then went to the Tambdi Surla Temple area. It was a little to start with, but we saw many species at both sites, and returned around 9.45am for breakfast.

Later, we went to Bolcornem and back to Tambdi Surla. After more additions to our list, we returned to Backwoods Camp by 6.45pm.

Specialities seen during the day were Crested Serpent and Booted Eagles, Malabar Trogon, Malabar Gray Hornbill, Malabar and Brown-headed Barbets, Indian and Black-headed Cuckooshrikes, Ashy Woodswallow, Bronzed and Greater Racket-tailed Drongos, Bar-winged Flycatcher-shrike, Brown Shrike, Dusky Crag Martin, Flame-throated and Yellow-browed Bulbuls, Dark-fronted Babbler, Malabar Starling, Yellow-throated Sparrow, Loten's Sunbird, Malabar Whistling Thrush, Orange-headed Thrush, Asian Brown and Brown-breasted Flycatchers, Velvet-fronted Nuthatch and Puff-throated Babbler.

Day 7

Friday 16th January

We departed at 6.00am for some birding at Bondla Wildlife Sanctuary. It was a lovely morning, and we had many new species. After breakfast at Bondla, we took the clients for a visit to a spice farm. The clients enjoyed the guided tour around the property, and saw a few birds. After a sumptuous buffet lunch, we returned to Backwoods Camp around 2.30pm.

We started again around 4.00pm with birding on the Backwoods Camp track, and then later went to Dcharge village and the Tambdi Surla Temple area. We added some more species here, and then returned by 6.30pm.

Highlights today included Grey Junglefowl, Malabar Imperial Pigeon, Jerdon's Nightjar, Rufous Woodpecker, Common Woodshrike, Indian Yellow Tit, Black-naped Monarch, Black-hooded Oriole, Long-tailed Shrike, Blyth's Reed and Large-billed Leaf Warblers, Gray-headed Bulbul, Verditer, Taiga and White-bellied Blue Flycatchers, Golden-fronted Leafbird and White-rumped Shama.

Day 8

Saturday 17th January

Once again, we departed quite early for birding at the Tambdi Surla Temple area, because there were a few fruiting trees there which were attracting a lot of birds. We saw many of the same species again, some much better than before. We then proceeded for birding at Deumol, and after another good session returned to Backwoods Camp around 10.00am for breakfast.

We departed around 3.45pm, for afternoon birding at Surla, and had quite a few more specialities, and returned to Backwoods Camp by 6.30pm.

Today's special birds included Chestnut-headed Bee-eater, Heart-spotted and White-naped Woodpeckers, Malabar Flameback, Malabar Parakeet, Stork-billed Kingfisher, Indian Pitta, Malabar Woodshrike, Rufous Treepie, Square-tailed Bulbul, Brown-cheeked Fulvetta, Asian Fairy Bluebird, Common Rosefinch, Sri Lanka Frogmouth and Indian Spotted Eagle.

Day 9

Sunday 18th January

The morning was spent at leisure for some, and birding for a few. We departed for Mopa airport after breakfast at Backwoods Camp. We dropped the clients at the airport around 11.45am, and said farewell to everyone.
