Day 1

Sunday 17th March

Travel from UK

Day 2

Monday 18th March

The group arrived at the airport on time and after a quick brief we left for Pench. The drive lasted two hours and we arrived at Tuli Corridor. We had a quick briefing about the next day, and then dinner, and all the guests went off to sleep.

Day 3

Tuesday 19th March

We had an early arrival at the gate for the first safari at 6:00am... With a lot of expectations we feasted on the variety of mammals and birds that the park had to offer. We saw the Nilgai, Sambar, Chital and Jackals. After a sumptuous lunch we were driving again. A lot of birds were seen; amongst them were the dancing Racket-tailed Drongos and the musical Magpie Robins. With lots to look forward to we ended our drive with three Jackals. Dinner was taken after doing a checklist and then it was lights out.

Day 4**Wednesday 20 March**

Getting used to an early morning drive did not take too long. We saw a Jackal killing a fawn and also a Jungle Cat out on a hunt. Alas, no tiger! After lunch we left for Kanha. Reaching Kanha Jungle Lodge we were welcomed and after a quick brief about the lodge and we went off on a nature trail along the riverbank. At 6:45 we were back to witness the amazing Flying Squirrel showing off in the canopy of the Sal trees in the lodge premises. After doing a checklist we had dinner and went off to bed.

Day 5**Thursday 21st March**

An early morning wake up call was followed by rain! Not to be deterred by this we left for a safari. One of the jeeps went off on the elephants for an hour-long ride in the core zone. They all had an amazing experience to share with us. We also saw lots of Barasingha, Sambar and Muntjac. Later we headed back to the lodge. The evening looked promising and we saw a Tigress! The day ended on a high!

Day 6**Friday 22nd March**

The rain from last night made the average temperature drop by about 2 degrees. A cold wet morning was never good for bird watching but for mammals it was good! A Tigress sitting in the water and later on crossing the road was the highlight of the day! Later on in the evening it rained a lot nearly cutting short our safari...

Day 7**Saturday 23rd March**

Another action packed day for us. Lots of birding and alarm calls. One of the cars was tracking a Tiger for nearly two hours but the Tiger's patience was far higher than theirs and they returned for lunch empty handed. That evening drive bore fruit as the same Tiger walked out in front of them without a single alarm call! What luck! Everyone was happy and we returned hoping that the last drive tomorrow will give us something special.

Day 8**Sunday 24th March**

There was thunder and lightening the whole night. Some of the clients were leaving for Satpura as an extension and were having a short drive. On the way out they were lucky to see a Leopard with a Langur kill up a tree. What a sight. All were spell bound. Another jeep saw a male Tiger walking in front of them for over an hour. It had truly been a spectacular morning. The Satpura guests left for a long 8-hour drive. With packed lunch en route they all caught up on their sleep. On arriving at Satpura we were welcomed by Ali and his team. After a quick brief about the lodge and dinner we all called it a night.

Day 9**Monday 25th March**

Our first safari in Satpura was great. We saw a Leopard with a Sambar deer that it had killed last night. It was feeding on it. We also saw another Leopard sitting not too far away from the kill. We deduced that this was a mother and cub. We also saw Sloth Bears digging a termite mound and a lot of Gaur going about their business. After lunch we spent nearly 2 hours near the Leopard, observing its behaviour and enjoying such a sight. We completed the species checklist later after dinner and all went off to bed.

Day 10

Tuesday 26th March

The morning safari was on the elephants! Sambar and Gaur were seen in close proximity. We also saw the Giant Squirrel and some Wild Boars. This afternoon we went for a safari in the park and one group did canoeing in the river. In the evening during dinner, we heard some Jackals calling out just behind the lodge. We were truly in the midst of nature. An early checklist and we all had dinner and went off to bed.

Day 11

Wednesday 27th March

It was HOLI in India. The parks were closed and hence we did activities outside the park. In the morning we went to see the Eurasian Eagle Owls and then headed to the village to play some colours with the locals. The afternoon was also great as we went to see the Blackbucks and then on for a night drive. We saw 3 Leopards very close to the lodge, Nightjars, Owls and also a Jungle Cat crossing the road. It was an unbelievable experience. We enjoyed a late dinner and then went off to bed.

Day 12

Thursday 28th March

In the morning drive we saw a Sloth Bear with 2 of her cubs, a Malabar Giant Squirrel, Gaur and a lot of Sambar. After the game drive we left for Bhopal. We had an early dinner at the plush Jhenuma Palace and all wished the guests the best for the journey back home as we ended the tour with many great memories...
