Tadoba pre-tour extension

Day 1

Thursday 28th March

Nagpur

Guests arrived at 1635 by flight at Nagpur. After meeting and greeting them we all checked into the Tuli Imperial for an overnight stay.

Day 2

Friday 29th March

Tadoba

After an early breakfast we left for Tadoba. On arriving at Svasara we were greeted by Ranjit and his wife Nandita. Settling down we all excitedly had lunch and left for our first drive into Tadoba Tiger Reserve. Just in the middle of a lake we saw a 5 year-old Tigress cooling off! It was a great start for the tour. We clicked away, not believing our good fortune. Later on we also saw a Leopard whizzing by some distance away. We returned to the lodge and were looking forward to what the next day would bring.

Day 3**Saturday 30th March**

Tadoba

An early morning start was well rewarded by the sightings of 3 sub-adult Tiger cubs and 2 separate Tigresses. But there was more in store for all of us. In the evening we saw them all again! We all were forgetting that there were other animals also in the park, and enjoyed good views of the Sambar, Nilgai, Gaur and the ever-present Chital deer. In the evening we watched a film made about Tadoba.

Day 4**Sunday 31st March**

Tadoba

The great sightings of Tigers were overwhelming. In the morning drive we saw a family of Tigers – 4 cubs and their mother. They were playing in the water, in a lake called Telia. They were a joy to watch! We all were just wondering how fortunate we were to see these magnificent animals with so much ease and at such close proximity. Later in the evening we also saw a Jungle Cat hunting a field mouse!

Beginning of Main Tour**Day 5****Monday 1st April**

Tadoba – Pench

Our last day was eventful. We heard about a Tigress that had killed a big Sambar stag for her cubs. We all drove there and were excited to see them feeding on the carcass. Later on they crossed the road and went on to a waterhole to cool off. Tadoba had ended with a bang. The numbers did not lie: 18 tiger sightings in all! Very reluctantly we left for Pench where we spent the night at the plush Tuli Tiger Corridor hotel.

Day 6**Tuesday 2nd April**

Pench

While we were in the queue waiting to go into the park we heard alarm calls close by. Hoping they would make some sense we drove in that area and saw 2 Tiger cubs hiding in the undergrowth. They were waiting for their mother who was heard close by roaring. After breakfast we went towards the dam waters and enjoyed seeing some waterfowl. In the evening we saw the 2 Tiger cubs again playing in the water. They were at a distance but we could see them well. In the evening we saw a film, which was made about Pench: Tiger – Spy in the Jungle.

Day 7**Wednesday 3rd April**

Pench – Kanha

The last drive in Pench we were eagerly hoping to see the cubs again. We heard them but could not see them as they were in very heavy undergrowth. Just before breakfast we saw a pair of Jackals hunting down a fawn. Also seen by one of the jeeps was a pack of 8 Wild Dogs on their morning patrol. Leaving Pench after lunch we made our way to Kanha where Tarun, Dimple and Jai received us. Jai took us on a nature walk to the Banjar River, which was enjoyed thoroughly by everyone.

Day 8**Thursday 4th April**

Kanha

The morning mist in Kanha was awesome. We had some great views of the Barasingha and also Muntjac. Some of the guests were also happy to do the elephant safari. Lots of birds like Short-toed Eagle, Sparrow Hawk and two Painted Sandgrouse were seen. One of the vehicles was tracking a Tiger for nearly two hours but the tiger's patience was far higher than theirs and they returned for lunch empty handed. In the evening we saw a Flying Squirrel doing her display in the lodge premises.

Day 9**Friday 5th April**

Kanha

We were destined to see a tiger today. One of the guests predicted this! And sure enough her prediction came true. We saw a Tigress walking along the river spraying her territory. She then came across the road and crossed right in front of our jeep. In the afternoon one of the cars saw a Leopard sitting up on a tree. We also had rare views of a Jerdon's Baza hawk mating. In the evening we again saw the squirrel gliding in the lodge premises. Dimple also did her cooking demonstration where the guests learnt how to make some Indian starters and the traditional 'chai' or Tea.

Day 10**Saturday 6th April**

Kanha

The elephants were enjoyed by some more of our guests. They saw some Gaur and Barasingha at close quarters. One of the vehicles also saw a Leopard crossing the road. At night we all went star-gazing and were fascinated by Dimple's knowledge of stars. The highlight was seeing planet Saturn with its rings.

End of main tour, start of Satpura extension**Day 11****Sunday 7th April**

Kanha – Nagpur/ Satpura

Today was the last day where we as a group would be together. Some guests were leaving for Satpura while others would be returning home. In the morning drive some of the guests who were on the elephant saw a big male Tiger. They photographed him for over 30 minutes. It was truly a great way to end their holiday. After lunch we left for our respective destinations. Satpura drive was about 8 hours. On arriving at Reni Pani Lodge we were welcomed by Ali and his team. Quickly settling down we all had dinner and retired to bed.

Day 12**Monday 8th April**

Satpura extension

Our first drive in Satpura started on a high. A Sloth Bear female with her 2 week-old cubs was seen. She was foraging on the forest floor looking for insects and termites. On seeing us she made a dash for cover, crossing the road before us!

We also saw the Malabar Giant Squirrel and also a Leopard with 2 cubs. What more could Satpura offer us? We were already in seventh heaven with so many good sightings! It was the birthday of one of our guests and the hotel staff surprised her when they did a dance especially for her.

Day 13

Tuesday 9th April

Satpura

We did a morning walk in the core zone. Tracking with Ali on the forest trails was special. He pointed out lots of animal tracks and scat left and also interpreted them for us. In the afternoon we went for a boat ride where we saw the rare Indian Skimmers on the banks of the river. After the boat safari we went for a night drive where we saw a Leopard near a waterhole and also the rare Rusty Spotted Cat!! We were having a whale of a time in Satpura.

Day 14

Wednesday 10th April

Satpura

We left for the morning game drive and enjoyed good views of Sloth Bears again. They were near a waterhole and were just leaving to rest in the cave close by. We also saw a Nilgai and her young ones. In the evening we went to see the Blackbucks in the wheat fields which had just been harvested. We saw nearly 16 Blackbucks in all. Later on we also saw Eurasian eagle Owls roosting near a canal. A highlight was definitely a Jungle Cat, which came out into the open wheat fields. We had great views of it. On our way back from the owls we also saw a Sloth Bear digging furiously in the undergrowth looking for termites! What a day it had been....

Day 15

Thursday 11th April

Satpuda – Bhopal

Today was our date with the elephants. We left by car from the lodge, crossed the river by boat, rode the elephants and then back to the lodge. The highlight was definitely seeing young Laxmi – the 6-month-old Asian Elephant baby. Our guests fed her bananas! After brunch we left for Bhopal, en route stopping by the Bhimbetka Caves to see some ancient rock paintings. We reached Bhopal and had an early dinner at the Jhana Numa Palace and then left for the airport and bid our goodbyes to each other...
