Day 1

Monday 18th November

Bright, mild day, cooler evening

Guests arrived at Nagpur airport at 5pm. We immediately left for Pench. On the Khawasa-Turiya road, we saw an Indian fox. It stayed for some time next to the road and then went inside the forest. We reached Tuli Tiger corridor by 8pm. Went into our rooms to freshen up, came back for dinner and discussed next day's plan before calling it a day.

Day 2

Tuesday 19th November

Cold clear morning, cooler evening

We all met at 5.15am for tea/ coffee & biscuits. By 5.30am we started for the park. We were split in four vehicles. By the end of first drive one of our vehicles saw the Collarwalli female Tigress of Pench. Other three vehicles saw a pack of seven Wild Dogs. One of the vehicles also saw a Leopard, which crossed the road after a series of alarm calls from the Spotted Deer. We came back to the lodge for lunch and rest, and started the afternoon drive by 2pm. Not much cat movement in the park in the afternoon that day.

Day 3

Wednesday 20th November

Cold clear morning, cooler evening

This was our last drive in Pench. One vehicle saw a beautiful male Tiger coming down the hill, crossing the road and climbing up the hill on the other side before disappearing. Other three vehicles saw the pack of Wild Dogs. Jackal, Gaur, Mongooses were also sighted in the drive.

We came back from the drive, packed, had lunch and started for our next park, Kanha. The drive was pleasant; we crossed some good forest patches and stopped at a few places for birding. We reached Kanha Jungle lodge by 7pm, had our dinner and went to sleep.

Day 4

Thursday 21st November

Cold clear morning, cooler evening

This morning we had an early start. We explored Kanha and looked out for Tigers. None of the vehicles saw any Tiger or Leopard, but Gaur, Barasingha etc were seen in good numbers. In the afternoon drive, two vehicles saw the Mahabir female Tigress, near to the arterial main road.

Day 5

Friday 22nd November

Cold morning, cool evening

Today was really exciting with a lot of alarm calls of Spotted Deer and Langurs. We also heard a few calls of Tiger and followed the calls. All the four vehicles had a good look of the Badimaada female near to Chital firebreak. A couple of our vehicles also saw two of the three sub adult cubs she had. After we came back, we went for a short walk in the nature trail near to the lodge. We saw some birds including Velvet Fronted Nuthatch before having lunch. The afternoon drive was also rewarding. Two of our vehicle saw the Chhotimaada female Tiger on the arterial main road walking towards Chhota Chhatta Pathar. One other vehicle saw a male Tiger near to the Gaidhar Elephant Camp. After we returned from the drive, we saw an Indian Giant Flying Squirrel in the lodge. We did our check list, had dinner and went off to sleep.

Day 6

Saturday 23rd November

Less cold morning; cloudy warm evening

In the morning we went to the Kisli side of Kanha. A lot of alarm calls but we saw no cats. We watched a good herd of Gaurs and birded while waiting for Tiger movement. Coming back we saw a pair of Red-headed Vultures and a Short-toed Snake Eagle. In the afternoon drive, one of our vehicle saw a male Leopard for 30mins walking on the road. Before evening, all the four vehicle had seen the female sub adult cub of Chhotimaada female on the Bisanpura-Babathenga road. Everyone had a good view of this female which stayed around for some time. One of the four vehicles saw two different tigers at Umerjhola & Bisanpura-Singarpur area, apart from the female sub adult. Another vehicle of ours saw a male Tiger behind Sondar tank area. This was a really exciting day for us!

Day 7

Sunday 24th November

Cloudy but cool morning, sunny afternoon, cool evening

The morning drive was short. It was cloudy and we did not come across a lot of animal activities so we did a bit of birding before exiting. We all came back early. The main group packed and had lunch before leaving for Nagpur with Harish. The main group stayed for the night in Nagpur.

The extension group (Ron, Airlie, Nigel, Christine & Pauline) was going to Satpura. They took a packed lunch and left with me. We had a long drive of seven hours ahead. We did some birding and reached ReniPani lodge in Satpura by 8pm.

Day 8

Monday 25th November

Cool clear morning, Warm afternoon, cool evening

We started for the park at 5.30am. We saw a few Indian Nightjars and Indian Hare before reaching the entrance. After entry formalities, we crossed the river to get to our vehicles for a safari. We saw some good Giant Squirrels which were a new mammal for us. After breakfast, we got a glimpse of a Sloth Bear resting under a Bamboo clump with its cub. In the afternoon drive, both the vehicles had a good sighting of the Sloth Bear female & its cub foraging for 30 minutes near to the vehicles. One of the vehicles saw 3 more Sloth Bears before exiting the park. In the evening we did our checklist, had dinner and retired to our rooms.

Day 9

Tuesday 26th November

Cool clear morning, warm afternoon, cool evening

The morning drive didn't yield any cats or bears. There were a lot of alarm calls, possibly due to Leopard movements but no sightings. In the afternoon we went canoeing. It was good for seeing some birds like terns, kingfisher, Bar-headed Geese etc and we also saw a Sambar female on one tiny island which later crossed to the mainland. The sunset whilst on the river was stunning.

Day 10

Wednesday 27th November

Cool clear morning, warm afternoon, cool evening

We looked out for Leopards, and followed some good fresh tracks but were not lucky enough to see one. Saw some Giant Squirrels. In the afternoon, the park was closed. We went to do some birding in a nearby lake and then went towards the village fields to look out for Blackbucks. We saw 30 of them in a patch among the fields. Later we checked the canal side and saw a couple of Indian Eagle Owls before it got dark.

Day 11

Thursday 28th November

Cool clear morning, warm afternoon, cool evening

We had scheduled the Elephant ride in the morning. We went to the Elephant camp after a 15mins boat ride and climbed on. We did a one hour safari on the elephant which went through the forest. Giant Squirrel, and Sambar were seen. We came back to lodge and had our breakfast. We went to our rooms to pack, checked out of the lodge and started for Bhopal. On the way we stopped to check out the Bhimbhetka Caves & cave paintings. We had our packed lunch there before making a tour of the caves. After that we started for Bhopal and reached Jehan Numa Palace hotel around 4pm. We lounged for couple of hours before having an early dinner. After the early dinner we went to the airport for the guests to begin their journey back to the UK.
