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Day 1

Thursday 20th March

Guest arrived on time at the Nagpur airport with excitement and eagerness. We checked in at Tuli Imperial hotel. After briefing about the next day plan we all went off to sleep after dinner.

Day 2

Friday 21st March

After breakfast we started our journey to Tadoba. It was a two and a half hour journey. We were welcomed by Rajit and Nandita at Savsara Lodge in Tadoba. After lunch and some rest we started our first game drive seeing a few birds and we heard a few alarm calls. On the way back we saw some vehicles parked and we knew that there would be a predator around. We saw a Leopard up close on a tree next to the tracks. Everyone was happy to see a Leopard on the first drive. We then did the species checklist and had dinner.

Day 3

Saturday 22nd March

The next morning as we entered the park saw a sub-adult Tigress around 16 months old. We had a good sighting and got some pictures. We saw her for a good 30 minutes then she moved in the thickets. Everyone was happy to see their first Tiger of the trip. We saw a few birds then we got lucky with a Sloth Bear sighting and in the afternoon drive we got lucky again as we saw a Tigress at Tadoba Lake at some distance. Back in the lodge we did the checklist and dinner.

Day 4

Sunday 23rd March

After a refreshing cup of a coffee we started our morning drive. We went straight to the Tadoba Lake as a tigress had been regularly sighted around the lake, but there was no sign of her and there were several vehicles going up and down the road so we decided to go to the other zone to take our chances for Sloth Bear and other Tigers.

On the way we saw quite a few birds and a rare Tree Shrew and a Chausingha, and then on the way back we saw the Tigress near the Tadoba Lake quite close to the road around 25 metres away - she was lying down grooming herself. The evening was quiet and we waited for a long time looking but tigers remained elusive. Back at the lodge we did the checklist over some drinks, followed by dinner.

Day 5

Monday 24th March

We started our morning drive with tea and coffee and saw some interesting birds. Also we saw 6 Wild Dogs on a kill. We enjoyed watching them. And then after driving for a while, we heard some alarm calls of Spotted deer and Langurs. We also saw a Leopard track on the side of the road which seemed to be fresh. We waited for at least half an hour but the calls eventually stopped and we moved on.

After driving for a bit we saw Rosy Starlings and a while after as we were watching Barking deer we heard a Sāmbhar call. We followed the call for a distance and then we waited and saw a Leopard emerging on the road but it retreated back so we drove on to find the Leopard was sitting on a small termite mound right next to the road almost 2 metres from the vehicle - we had a quick close up view before it went a little inside for a while before disappearing. We came back to the lodge and had an early lunch and checkout.

We drove from Tadoba to Pench. We reached Pench at around 5 o'clock in the evening and did the checklist at 7:30pm and had dinner at Tiger Corridor Tuli in Pench. After briefing the guests, everyone went off to bed.

Day 6

Tuesday 25th March

It was our first game drive in Pench for the main tour. With high hopes we started our drive. We heard a few alarm calls and later were rewarded by sighting of one of the dominant male Tigers of Pench - 3 out of our 4 vehicles got the sighting. Later in the day we saw a pack of Wild Dogs and Jackal, and in the afternoon we saw a common mongoose and rat snake fight in which the mongoose won the battle. We had quite a few animal and birds to mark on the check list. After dinner we called it a day.

Day 7

Wednesday 26th March

The next day was equally thrilling as we heard the alarm calls and after waiting for more than an hour we finally saw a Leopard. One of our vehicles saw a Tiger and Wild Dogs. After an early lunch we started for Kanha. At the Kanha Jungle Lodge we were welcomed and were on time to witness the Flying Squirrel perform. After the briefing and checklist we had a wonderful dinner.

Day 8

Thursday 27th March

We had a good start in Kanha as we saw a Tigress on our first drive in Kanha. Our other vehicle saw 3 Tigers in the evening. At the checklist we had a celebration for a good start in Kanha. With high expectations we all went off to sleep.

Day 9**Friday 28th March**

After a refreshing cup of tea and coffee we all set off for another game drive in the morning and were rewarded by a sighting of two Tigers and a Sloth Bear in the morning drive and one Tiger in the evening. Checklist was done followed by dinner and we all retired for the day.

Day 10**Saturday 29th March**

The luck was on our side as we had yet another Tiger sighting in morning by 2 vehicles at different place, and 3 Tigers in the evening. We did the checklist and dinner in the open, under the canopy of trees and stars.

Day 11**Sunday 30th March****Kanha to Satpura**

It was our last morning drive in Kanha. We came across a lot of pugmarks and after a while we heard a few calls, but no luck with sightings. After breakfast we checked other areas but it was quiet and peaceful in the jungle. We came out at 10 am as we had a long journey to our next destination - Satpura. Harish and other guests who were going to Nagpur had a late start after having lunch.

After a shower and packing we started our journey from Kanha to Satpura which is more than 8 hours drive. On the way, we crossed the valleys and beautiful landscape of central India, and had a warm welcome at Reni Pani Jungle Lodge. After briefing and dinner we called it a day.

Day 12**Monday 31st March****Satpura**

At Satpura we had options of jungle activities so we decided to do a game drive in the morning as everyone was keen to see a Sloth bear and a Leopard. We heard a few calls and saw tracks but no luck with the sightings. We saw Malabar Giant Squirrels and the breakfast at the view point at Lagda was mesmerizing. We saw Brown Fish Owl while having breakfast. In the afternoon we all decided to do a drive, as we entered the park, we saw an Indian Eagle Owl on a rock.

Day 13**Tuesday 1st April**

We all decided to go for a drive in the morning. We finally got lucky and we had a good sighting of a Sloth Bear. In the afternoon drive we were lucky to see a Leopard up close.

Day 14**Wednesday 2nd April**

This morning we decided to do different activities - some went for a canoe safari and the rest went with me for a morning game drive. After looking extensively for Sloth Bear we finally got lucky with sighting of a mother and a sub-adult and we also had a good sighting of Four-horned Antelope.

We decided to go look for Blackbucks and do a night safari at the bufferzone. We had a good view of Blackbucks in the recently harvested crop fields and got a chance to off-road and get close to them. In the night drive we saw a few Sambar and also we heard a few alarm calls - we followed the calls but we could not catch the glimpse of Leopard but we did spot a quite uncommon animal - a Rusty-spotted Cat, which we followed on foot with flash lights and saw it up close. Everyone was excited to see the world's smallest wild cat! So the guests had seen the world's biggest and smallest wild cats.! We also saw Civets, Indian Hare etc. We then went straight for dinner.

Day 15

Thursday 3rd April

We went for an Elephant back ride for the last safari. Everyone was happy to be on the Elephants. Back at the lodge we had enough time for packing and brunch. After brunch we left for Bhopal en route to Bhembetka the rock painting World Heritage Site. We reached the beautiful Jehnuma Palace hotel at Bhopal where we were rooms to clean and change. After getting freshened up we reached Bhopal airport on time...
