Tadoba pre-tour extension

Seven members of the group joined Kaustubh Mulay for a pre tour extension at Tadoba.

Day 1

Wednesday 11th November

Group members departed from Heathrow Airport on an overnight flight to Mumbai, India

Day 2

Thursday 12th November

Our flight landed at Mumbai late morning and then, in the afternoon, we had an internal flight from Mumbai to Nagpur. We arrived on time at Nagpur airport full of excitement and eagerness. After meeting Kaustubh we were taken to the Tuli Imperial hotel where, after a briefing, we had dinner and retired to bed.

Day 3

Friday 13th November

After breakfast we started our two and a half hour journey to Tadoba with stops en route for some birding. On arrival at Svasara Lodge in Tadoba we were welcomed by Rajit and Nandita and their team of naturalists.

After lunch we set off on our first safari and, based on information from the morning safari, we knew where we had to go. When we reached Pandharpauni Lake it was quiet to begin with, and then we heard alarm calls from Spotted Deer coming from the other side. We headed there but when we reached the other side the calls appeared to have moved towards the lake. We rushed back to the original spot and were delighted to see three young Tiger cubs playing on the branches of a smallish Flame of the Forest tree. Everyone was happy watching them play when, through the dense grasses, their mother appeared. Although the sighting was a little distant it offered us the chance to observe their natural playfulness. What an excellent start to the tour!

After the safari we returned to the lodge and later met to do our checklist before having dinner.

Day 4

Saturday 14th November

Today we started our morning safari by checking the area where we had seen the cubs the previous evening. There were alarm calls from inside the dense grassland, but there wasn't any visible movement. We spent a while birding before heading for breakfast. Suddenly we heard alarm calls coming from near a lake, followed by the growls of a Tiger. We waited but things calmed down and nothing was spotted. After breakfast we found a fresh Leopard kill hanging on a branch. We staked it out till it was time to leave the park. Back at the lodge we had a bird walk before lunch. We had another walk around the lodge after lunch and this time watched Red Avadavat and Indian Silverbill.

On our afternoon drive we headed to Tadoba Lake where we saw Gaur feeding. Further on we encountered a couple of Wild Dogs (Dhole) just before they vanished into the forest. Later we saw a lot of Tiger pugmarks, and also watched a Brown Fish Owl preening and getting ready for the evening.

Back at the lodge we again did our checklist before dinner.

Day 5

Sunday 15th November

After a refreshing cup of a coffee we started our morning drive. As we drove into the park we heard a lot of alarm calls from Jamni village relocation site. We spent quite a while waiting for predator movement, but left when things calmed down. We drove to Pandharpauni Lake where we heard more alarm calls, and to our surprise the rustling grasses revealed a Leopard! The Leopard moved swiftly across the road and disappeared into the bamboo thickets. Next we went to the Navegaon grassland where we had wonderful sightings of Spotted Owllet, White-eyed Buzzard, Zitting Cisticola and lots more birds. We also saw many Blue Bulls and Gaur. Later we had our breakfast.

After returning to the lodge we went for a short walk within the lodge grounds and had good views of a soaring Bonelli's Eagle. After lunch we had another safari. We found lots of pugmarks but alas no big cat sightings.

Day 6

Monday 16th November

We started today with our last Tadoba safari. After driving for a while, we heard the alarm calls of Spotted Deer, Sambar Deer and Langur. We waited for at least half an hour but the calls eventually stopped and we moved on. We then headed towards Telia Lake and on the way spotted a Sloth Bear beside the road. It went into the bushes so we waited. Another jeep arrived and we were told that they had found Tiger pugmarks crossing the road, right over our tyre tread! Eventually the Sloth Bear reappeared, not for long but quite good for a bear! At Telia Lake another Sloth Bear was seen and lots of cub pugmarks were found on the road. After breakfast we headed back to the lodge.

After lunch we said goodbye to Tadoba and drove to Pench, arriving at 6pm. Later we met Yusuf and the others who were joining us to form the Tiger Direct! tour group.

Main Tour

Day 1

Tuesday 15th November

In flight to India

Day 2

Wednesday 16th November

Kaustubh with group members who had been on the Tadoba pre-tour extension, and Yusuf with the other group members who had just arrived in India, all met at the Tuli Tiger Corridor, Pench around 7.30pm. After dinner we had a briefing before retiring to bed.

Day 3**Thursday 17th November**

Today was our first game drive in Pench and we set off with high hopes. We heard a lot of alarm calls and later people in one of our Jeeps saw a Tiger cub scamper across the track. Later we watched some Jackal and lots of birds before it was time for breakfast.

On our afternoon safari we again saw Jackal, and bird sightings included Ruddy Shelduck and Crested Serpent Eagle. We also listened to a tigress calling for her cubs for quite a long time, and it was an amazing experience!

In the evening we had quite a few animals and birds to mark on our checklist before dinner.

Day 4**Friday 18th November**

Today we had a thrilling start with the sighting of a Leopard and her tiny cub sitting on an open rock. They disappeared into the thick undergrowth as another vehicle approached. Later we saw a Tree Shrew and a Ruddy Mongoose in exactly the same place! After breakfast, on our way out of the park, we watched a Tiger sleeping under a bush.

After returning to the lodge, we packed our bags before having an early lunch. We then departed for Kanha. At Kanha Jungle Lodge we were welcomed by Dimple, Sneha, Vinod and Tarun. After a briefing and completing our checklist, we enjoyed a wonderful dinner.

Day 5**Saturday 19th November**

We had a good start in Kanha as we saw a Tiger on our first drive. Group members in one vehicle spotted a Tiger in the morning, and those in two vehicles saw the Tiger in the afternoon.

In the evening we met to complete our checklist followed by dinner. With high expectations for the next day, we all went off to bed.

Day 6**Sunday 20th November**

After a refreshing cup of tea or coffee, we all set off for our morning game drive. We saw lots of fresh pugmarks and had close views of a Crested Hawk Eagle. We also enjoyed seeing some beautiful misty landscapes.

During our afternoon safari, people in one of our vehicles had a good sighting of a Tigress near Saundar tanks.

In the evening we had our usual routine of checklist, dinner and bed.

Day 7**Monday 21st November**

On our morning safari we drove to the Kisli zone where we saw a lot of fresh pugmarks which we followed for a while until they disappeared into the dense forest. We also saw lots of birds before having breakfast. After breakfast we had a wonderful sighting of Alexandrine Parakeets on a bush beside the road, and we watched a couple of Jackals trotting our way.

The afternoon safari was enjoyable but quiet, and in the evening we did the checklist and had dinner in the open, under the canopy of trees and stars.

Day 8

Tuesday 22nd November

Today was our last morning drive in Kanha. We came across a lot of pugmarks and heard a few calls. We had an amazing sighting of a big Gaur bull which halted the safari Jeeps. Group members in one of our Jeeps also had a sighting of a male Tiger. After breakfast we checked other areas but it was quiet and peaceful in the jungle. We left the park at 10.30am and returned to our accommodation.

We now had to pack our bags and at 12.15pm three members of the group left with a packed lunch to continue to Satpura for a post-tour extension. The rest of us had lunch before departing at 1.45pm to drive to Nagpur. On reaching Nagpur we checked in at Hotel Tuli Imperial, and later met for dinner.

Day 9

Wednesday 23rd November

Today four group members had an early departure to travel to Kochi for a private post-tour extension. The rest of us had some leisure time before a late afternoon flight to Mumbai.

Day 10

Thursday 24th November

Our flight from Mumbai to London Heathrow airport landed safely in the morning and another Naturetrek adventure came to an end.
