## Summary

The tour was a significant success, despite the weather being dicey, with rain off and on; we managed to see twenty-one Tigers, six Leopards, twenty-six Dholes, two Sloth Bears and 155 different species of birds.

## Pre-tour Tadoba extension

### Day 1

**Thursday 9th April**

The clients arrived in Nagpur on different flights, and Yusuf met them at the airport. After a smooth check-in and briefing, we called it a night.

### Day 2

**Friday 10th April**

We departed for Tadoba at 10.50am, and arrived at 12.45pm at Svasara Lodge. Post lunch, we went for our first safari. We saw a Tiger called Mogli at Pandurpauni, a Brown Fish Owl, and enjoyed general birding.

### Day 3

**Saturday 11th April**

This morning, we saw a dominant male Tiger called Xylo; later in the drive, we also saw another dominant male called Yuvraj. Later still, we had an exclusive sighting of five Dholes. In the evening, while heading for the Moharli range, we spotted a female Leopard lying on the side of the road; as soon as we approached, she crossed the road and vanished. While we were driving along Telia Lake, we spotted a female Tiger resting in a grassy patch. While watching her, we saw a pack of seven Dholes coming to drink at the lake.

### Day 4

**Sunday 12th April**

Today, we went to the Kolara buffer zone and were lucky to see a Tiger with her four cubs. The cubs were in a playful mood; they were stalking each other, and this play-fighting will help them to learn how to survive in the future. The whole morning drive was dedicated to this gorgeous family. In the evening, we visited the Belara buffer zone and were rewarded with a sighting of a young Tiger. It was sleeping among water weeds in a slushy patch on the edge of the lake. Later, it got up and walked for a few hundred metres. before vanishing into the forest.

### Day 5

**Monday 13th April**

Today, we had an awesome morning and enjoyed three different sightings of Tigers. Initially, we saw a female called Bijli around Pandurpauni. and later we saw a collared male near the Navegaon meadows. The collared male was quenching his thirst near the camp. After a while, he got up and started patrolling his territory; he must have walked almost five hundred metres before lying down under the shade of some bamboo. After watching it for over an hour, we decided to head for breakfast. On our way back to the gate, we saw another Tiger at a distance, across Jamuni Lake.

## Main tour

### Day 1

**Monday 13th April**

The group arrived in the evening at Nagpur Airport. After a warm welcome, we transferred to our comfortable hotel in the city. Following check-in formalities, clients had time to relax after their journeys and to settle into their rooms. It was a pleasant start to the tour, with excitement building for the wildlife adventures ahead. Later, we enjoyed dinner together and discussed the plans for our first safari and the onward journey to Pench.

### Day 2

**Tuesday 14th April**

Today we met to go birding at Svasara. We saw some interesting birds such as Purple Sunbird, White-browed Bulbul and Indian White-eye, to name a few. After a relaxed birding session, we had breakfast, and then left for Pench. Meanwhile, pre-tour extension clients checked out of the Radisson Blu Nagpur at 10.30am and drove around two and a half hours to Pench. After check-in and a hot lunch, we began our first game drive.

Soon after entering the park, we enjoyed a fine sighting of a Golden Jackal. We also saw Chital, Sambar and Northern Plains Gray Langur. The highlight was a beautifully camouflaged Leopard resting under a log. Some jeeps also saw Dhoolas. Many birds were recorded throughout the afternoon.

### Day 3

**Wednesday 15th April**

We started early with tea and coffee, before heading out in four jeeps, on different routes. Some jeeps were fortunate to see two Tigers before breakfast, followed later by another (female) Tiger. Other vehicles enjoyed sightings of Dhoolas and Golden Jackal. Bird highlights included Mottled Wood and Indian Scops Owls, Black-hooded Oriole and Common Hawk-Cuckoo. In the afternoon, the whole group enjoyed excellent views of a female Tiger. Additional birds included Crested Honey Buzzard, Indian Roller and Cotton Pygmy Goose.

### Day 4

**Thursday 16th April**

This morning proved exceptional. Within fifteen minutes of entering the park, one jeep found a young Leopard only thirty yards away. Shortly afterwards, we watched a female Leopard with two cubs, feeding on a Chital kill for forty minutes. Another jeep witnessed the female Tiger Patdev making a successful deer kill and calling her three cubs. A different vehicle saw a male Tiger walking close by. After lunch, we checked out and drove four hours to Kanha, arriving in the evening.

### Day 5

**Friday 17th April**

Our first morning in Kanha was highly productive. One jeep saw two Sloth Bears, while another encountered a different individual. We also enjoyed views of Blackbuck, large herds of Barasingha, and one lucky jeep found a Leopard. Raptors included Jerdon's Baza, and Red-headed, Indian and White-rumped Vultures. During the afternoon safari, three jeeps saw Tigers, with three different individuals recorded. Other wildlife included Golden Jackal and Gaur. Bird highlights included Orange-headed Thrush and White-rumped Shama.

**Day 6****Saturday 18th April**

This morning delivered one of the most dramatic sightings of the tour. Three jeeps watched a Leopard that had killed a Northern Plains Gray Langur. Soon afterwards, a female Tiger arrived and chased the Leopard, forcing it high into a tree. The Tiger stood below, growling loudly, before eventually walking away. Ten minutes later, the Leopard climbed down and disappeared into the forest. Other sightings included Emerald Dove, Malabar Pied Hornbill, Hoopoe and Wood Sandpiper. The afternoon drive was quieter, but still enjoyable.

**Day 7****Sunday 19th April**

All four jeeps enjoyed excellent views of a male Tiger during the morning safari, along with Golden Jackal. Bird highlights included Malabar Pied Hornbill and Shikra. In the afternoon, all jeeps again had success when we found the famous female Tiger, DJ9, resting in a waterhole. Later, she suddenly chased two Golden Jackals, before calmly walking onto the road and sitting in full view. It was a thrilling encounter, and a memorable final full safari day for the group.

**Day 8****Monday 20th April**

This morning we enjoyed a relaxed birding and nature walk for about an hour near the Banjar River. Birds included Indian Nuthatch, Indian Pond Heron and several drongos. We returned to the lodge for a hot breakfast, before saying goodbye to three clients who were joining the Satpura extension. The remainder of the group checked out at noon with packed lunches, and began the six-hour drive to Nagpur. En route, we stopped at a village to watch traditional pottery work before our farewell dinner.

**Day 9****Tuesday 21st April**

Clients successfully caught their flights and flew home to the UK.
