Summary

The Tiger Marathon tour was a remarkable success, with eight tiger sightings across Pench, Kanha, Bandhavgarh and Panna National Park. Guests witnessed some incredible behaviour, including Tiger stalking and interactions with cubs—making for unforgettable experiences. In addition to the majestic Tigers, the group spotted over 150 species of birds, showcasing the region's rich avifauna. Kanha offered further excitement with sightings of Sloth Bears and a dramatic encounter of Wild Dogs on a kill. The tour delivered exceptional wildlife moments, combining thrilling predator activity with diverse bird watching opportunities, making it a truly rewarding and memorable journey for all participants.

Day 1

Sunday 5th November

The main group left London in the morning via Doha, arriving in Delhi in the early hours of the 6th November.

Day 2

Monday 6th October

Our tour began in the early hours with a warm welcome at Nagpur Airport, followed by a brief rest at Radisson Blu. After breakfast, we headed to Pench Tiger Reserve, where the team from Tuli Tiger Corridor greeted us with hospitality and lunch.

We had a wonderful nature walk at 4:30 PM, which lasted for an hour. During our walk, we spotted some amazing birds, including Black-naped Monarch, Tickell's Blue Flycatcher, White-Breasted Water Hen, Greater Racket-tailed Drongo, Ashy Drongo, and Indian Flying Fox. After a walk, we enjoyed refreshing High-Tea.

We wrapped up a thrilling day with dinner and anticipation for what lay ahead.

Day 3

Tuesday 7th October

We began our day in Pench with a refreshing cup of tea and set off into the forest, greeted by bird calls and distant alarm calls. The morning safari was rich in birdlife, with sightings of Grey-headed Fish Eagle, Asian Green-bee-eaters, Plum-headed Parakeet and Mottled Wood Owls.

Our guests in the other two jeeps saw a Tiger lying down in dense undergrowth & one jeep saw a male Tigers cross the road.

In the afternoon drive, guests with Yusuf saw five individual Tigers and later a Leopard crossing the road with the other three jeeps seeing two different Tigers.

We ended the day with our checklist session, warm drinks, and hearty dinner—eager for more!

Day 4**Wednesday 8th October**

We set off for our second game drive in Pench. The morning was promising with lot of distress calls and fresh pug-marks—a sign of female Tigress. Although we didn't see her, we witnessed the nervous behaviour of the prey animals in the presence of a big cat. One jeep did see a sub-adult cub crossing a road.

After lunch we were ready for our next afternoon drive. The group with Bhautik saw six Wild Dogs on a Spotted Deer kill. Two of our jeeps saw a Tiger laying in waterhole & one jeep saw Wild Dogs, a pair of Golden Jackals, Black Stork and Mottled Wood Owl.

The day ended with our checklist session, sharing highlights of the trip so far. A hearty dinner followed.

Day 5**Thursday 9th November**

Our final day in Pench began with an amazing sighting with a Leopard trying to hunt the Spotted Deer but it just missed. Just on the way we saw a male Tiger growl and marking its territory on trees. We spotted some wonderful birds like Yellow-footed Green Pigeon, Asian Brown Flycatcher, Indian Vultures, and Changeable Hawk Eagle.

Back at the resort we had our lunch then we left for our next destination The Kanha National Park, arriving in the evening.

Day 6**Friday 10th November**

Our first safari in Kanha began in the misty morning jungle. Our guest three jeeps saw a pair of Wild Dogs, and later we heard alarm calls and saw fresh pug marks—signs of a mating pair of Tigers. Though we didn't see them, their distant roars echoed through the forest. We also spotted a rare Blackbuck and a peaceful herd of Barasinghas, Kanha's famous hard ground swamp deer. A White-rumped Vulture, Scarlet Minivets (male and female), White-rumped Shama, and Malabar Pied Hornbill added to the morning thrills.

After lunch we were ready again for a game drive. We saw fresh footprints of a Tigress and two cubs in the Kishli zone. We spotted some interesting birds White-throated Kingfisher, Little (was Striated) Heron, Indian Vulture and also Barking Deer and Indian Gaur.

We ended the day with a special dinner and checklist session, still amazed by the magic Kanha had offered.

Day 7**Saturday 11th November**

Our second day in Kanha began peacefully, with misty landscapes and the stunning sight of Scarlet Minivets fluttering above—like a scene from a movie. One of our jeeps saw a Tigress crossing a road in the Mukki zone. We heard alarm calls by Langur and Spotted Deer. Then saw Brown-cheeked Fulvetta, Greater Racket-tailed Drongo, Greater Coucal, Common Kingfisher and Indian Vultures.

In the evening our guests in one of the jeep saw a Sloth Bear, a Leopard, Swamp deer (Barasingha), Barking Deer, Indian Guar and Asian Pam Civet. For the birds we had a good sighting of Black-rumped Flameback woodpecker, Jungle Owlets and Indian Scops Owl.

We ended the day with our checklist session, warm drinks, and a hearty dinner.

Day 8**Sunday 12th November**

In the morning we are ready to do our final safari in Kanha. We entered the park and saw some fresh tracks of male Tiger and we heard a growl of the Tiger from the deep forest. We saw Sambar, Spotted, Barking and Swamp Deer, as well as Indian Guar.

We returned to the resort for lunch and got ready for our next destination - Bandhavgarh National Park. On the way, our guests were welcomed by a Tigress in the evening at Bandhavgarh while heading towards the lodge in the evening. A good start!

Day 9**Monday 13th November**

We began our day in Bandhavgarh with a refreshing cup of tea and set off into the forest. We saw pug marks of a Tigress with cubs. We waited there for it and we saw some interesting birds like Lesser Adjutant Stork, Red Avadavat, Scaly-breasted Munia, Changeable Hawk Eagle trying to hunt Indian Peafowl, Indian Vultures, Indian Scops Owl and Grey Wagtail. At breakfast had a chance to see some interesting butterflies Tawny Coaster, Peacock Pansy, Crimson Rose, Common Jezebel to name a few.

After lunch we were ready for our second game drive in Bandhavgarh. And it started with a sub-adult Tiger. We saw some Black Drongos, Blue-bearded Bee-eater, Rufous Treepie, Jungle Crow, Lesser Whistling Duck, Indian Spot-billed Ducks and Cotton Pygmy Goose.

The day ended with our checklist session, sharing highlights of the trip so far. A hearty dinner followed.

Day 10**Tuesday 14th November**

Our second day in Bandhavgarh was amazing! Two of our jeeps spotted a Tiger in the Khitaoli zone. We also saw some incredible birds, including Rufous-tailed Lark, Barn Swallow, Plum-headed Parakeets, Indian Roller, Lesser Adjutant Stork, Asian Open-billed Stork, Jungle Owlets, Rufous Treepie, and Changeable Hawk Eagle.

After lunch, we headed out for our afternoon game drive and spotted a Lesser Adjutant Stork, Black-naped Monarch, Greater Racket-tailed Drongo, Red Junglefowl, Greater Coucal, Asian Green Bee-eater, and Tickell's Blue Flycatcher.

The day ended with our checklist session, followed by dinner.

Day 11**Wednesday 15th November**

Our morning was incredible! In Tala zone, two jeeps spotted two different Tigers, while two jeeps in Khitoli zone had great sightings. One jeep spotted a Leopard crossing the road. We also saw Langurs, Sambar, Spotted Deer, Barking Deer, Black-winged Stilt, Indian Flapshell Turtle, and Black-hooded Oriole.

After a great morning, we returned to the resort, packed our bags, and set off for Panna Tiger Reserve with a packed lunch. Exciting times ahead!

Day 12

Thursday 16th November

Our morning began with the breathtaking landscape of Panna Tiger Reserve. In the Madala zone, three jeeps spotted a Tigress with three cubs, while another jeep from the Akola zone had a great sighting. We also spotted some amazing birds, including Oriental Darters, Golden-backed Woodpecker, Rufous Treepie, Common Tailorbird, Common Kingfisher, European Bee-eater, Red Avadavat, Scaly-breasted Munia, Yellow-footed Green Pigeon, and Grey-headed Fish Eagle. While one the jeep entered from Akola and we spotted two Jungle Cats.

After lunch, we embarked on our final game drive. Two jeeps from Akola zone and two jeeps from Hinota zone entered the park. We saw a King Vulture, Sirkeer Malkoha, Black Drongo, Changeable Hawk Eagle, Red Junglefowl, and finally, three jeeps spotted a Tigress walking on the road and crossing it twice.

The day ended with an incredible sighting in Panna Tiger Reserve. All guests returned to the resort, looking forward to a lovely dinner.

Day 13

Friday 17th November

Our guests enjoyed a lovely breakfast at the resort and with a packed lunch, we started our journey for our next stop at Khajuraho to visit the Temples. Lter we reached Khajuraho airport to catch our flight to Delhi.

After the check in we all enjoyed our packed lunch and then boarded the flight to Delhi. We landed and went to our hotel in Aerocity. After a briefing about the next day program as some of the guests had private extensions.

Some were going back to UK and somewhere going with Yusuf to Ranthambore for the extension.

Day 14

Saturday 18th November

Morning Started with series of departures. Bhautik escorted the group to T3 terminal, others left for their private extension to Agra, Yusuf met the guests in the lobby at 8:15 am and after briefing, we started our five hours journey to Ranthambore. On the way we saw some Sarus Cranes, Black Kite, Black-winged Stilts, and Bank Myna. We reached Tigers Den in Ranthambore before lunch.

Check-in was smooth, and we had delightful lunch. We all met again for a birding walk in and around the property at 4:30 pm. On the walk we saw some interesting birds like White-breasted Waterhen, White-spotted Fantails, Booted Warbler, Indian White-eyes, Ashy Prinia and Grey Francolins. In the evening, we met again for checklist followed dinner and briefing for the next day.

Day 15

Sunday 19th November

Our day started with hot cup of coffee and masala Chai. Today we were going to Zone 10 which was bit far away from the resort we were staying, on the way while crossing Zone 7 from the highway when we spotted two Leopards on the hill, probably a courting pair. Later after reaching in our zone, we saw Neelgai, Wild Boars and some interesting birds including Indian and White-rumped Vultures.

During the afternoon drive we missed a Tgress by few minutes. We saw some interesting wildlife. In the evening we completed the checklist followed by dinner.

Day 16

Monday 20th November

Our day started with some hot beverages, all of us enjoyed the beautiful landscape but no luck with big cats both in the morning and afternoon drives

Day 17

Tuesday 21st November

We had one last drive left in Ranthambore, today we were going to Zone 5 with lot of anticipation. We got the news from the camp that they heard a Tiger growl and distress calls of Sambar. We quickly drove to the spot the calls were coming from the non-tourism zone. We explored other area but no luck with Tiger sightings.

Post breakfast we departed from Tiger Den at around 12 noon with packed lunch. We reached our hotel Pride Plaza in Aerocity New Delhi at around 06:06pm. After the smooth check-in, guests were briefed about the Pickup time for next day.

Day 18

Wednesday 22nd November

Yusuf met the guest in the hotel lobby at around 7:15 am and we departed for airport at 7:30am sharp. Another successful tour ended.
