Weather

Night temperatures were cold. Midday temperatures were quiet warm and it was generally very sunny though some mornings were briefly quite misty, with 3 days of rain experienced in the trip. Temperature ranged from 10 to about 25 degrees Celsius.

Day 1

Saturday 9th February

London to Indira Ghandi International airport, New Delhi

Met with the group at the airport and guests went to exchange the money in the foreign money exchange. Left from the airport to the Westin Hotel in Gurgaon and got them in their rooms around 11am. Then we left for the Sultanpur bird sanctuary at 2 pm. We got back around 6pm and then after letting everyone know about the programme for tomorrow we left them to rest for the rest of the evening.

Day 2

Sunday 10th February

Delhi sightseeing – Jabalpur

We met with the group at the hotel at 7.30am and left there for the sight seeing in Delhi - we saw Qutub minar, Humayun tomb and drive around the India gate and Parliament buildings and then reached a restaurant to have lunch at 1230pm. After that we went to the Nizamuddin station to catch the train to Jabalpur at 320pm. We got settled in the train and chatted before dinner at 730pm and then to bed.

Day 3

Monday 11th February

Jabalpur to Kanha National Park

We reached Jabalpur an hour late. After having some bananas we arranged for tea for at the station and we left at 815 hrs and then drove to Jackson hotel for breakfast and wash as we had reserved 3 rooms there. After breakfast we left Jabalpur for the 3 hour trip to Kanha and reached there on time before lunch.

We had lunch and then told outlined the programme about the day and the park timings and a little description about Kanha National Park. We went to the park in 3 gypsy jeeps. We reached Khatia gate and spoke to the guides about the sightings in the park and entered the park and luckily we were all in the same zone...we went to the route called Digdola and there we stopped at one of the places to see birds when all of a sudden we heard the Sambar deer alarm calls and waited...after some time we heard the roar of a Tiger and then we got our jeeps to the right place where we thought the Tiger would come over. Then after some time we heard the roar again and it was quite loud and the whole jungle was surrounded by the noise of the Tiger! After some time we saw something moving in the woodland behind the tall grass. Then this big male Tiger called Munna came and walked right in front of the jeeps and then showed his face to us and looked at us and then he went in the grass again and disappeared. This was a lovely sighting! After some time we went to do some birding and then on way back at the same place where this male had previously crossed the road we saw there was a female Tiger crossing road and then she also went inside the forest.

We got back to the hotel and then met for the species checklist at 0730 pm and had dinner and I told them about the programme for tomorrow morning and then went to bed around 9pm.

Day 4

Tuesday 12th February

Kanha National Park

We got up at 5am and met for tea and coffee at 530 am and then left to park at 645 am in 3 jeeps again. We did some very good birding in the morning and then we also tried for the Tiger but didn't see any this morning and had breakfast in the park and got back around 1130 to the hotel. We met again for lunch at 1pm and then left to the park at 3pm and saw nice birds and animals and heard some alarm calls of Sambar deer in the park but didn't see a Tiger. We came back from park at 630pm and had tea and coffee and then went to our rooms to refresh. We met again for the checklist at 730 pm followed by dinner and then lights out.

Day 5

Wednesday 13th February

Kanha National Park

We got up at 6am and met for tea and coffee and left the hotel for a nature walk this morning as the park was closed on Wednesday. We started our walk at 630am and came back around 930am for breakfast followed by a little birding in the hotel. We met again for lunch at 130pm and then made a plan to drive to some local villages. We went to about 4 villages and after some time we stopped at one of the lakes near to a village where we spotted a Jackal on the top of some rocks. Back at the hotel we met for the checklist at 730 pm and then had dinner after letting them know about the programme tomorrow.

Day 6

Thursday 14th February

Kanha National Park

We got up at same time but this morning we had rain so we were in touch with the park people to see if the park would be closed or open and luckily the park was open at 7am. We came back from the park around 1030 and met for lunch at 130.

In the afternoon at 3 pm we had a good afternoon drive with some new birds for the list but didn't see a Tiger again...nothing is guaranteed in the jungle.... We got back and had tea and coffee and met for dinner and checklist at same time and then off to bed.

Day 7

Friday 15th February

Kanha National Park

We had our wake up call this morning and were met at 7am by the cars and went inside and today we could only go on one route due to the rainy weather. We saw some nice birds and returned for lunch at same time and then we left again for the park and it wasn't raining this time. We went inside the park and reached the place where a Tiger was seen this morning and as we reached there the Tiger came out and most got to see the Tiger (apart from those who were allocated another route). We got back from the park and met for the checklist, dinner and bed as usual.

Day 8

Saturday 16th February

Kanha National Park

We went inside the park today - it was not raining and all of the guests came to the park and did a wonderful drive with Sambar deer alarm calls, monkeys playing on the road, and two Spotted Owlets sitting in a tree hole and other lovely birds, but no Tiger sighting this morning. Later this afternoon after lunch we went to the place where a Tiger had made a kill of a Swamp deer male a few days ago and this afternoon we got to see him still there! We got back from the park and met for the dinner and checklist and then off to bed.

Day 9

Sunday 17th February

Kanha National Park

It was a very beautiful morning with very mild cold and clear weather as we left for the park this morning. One of the jeeps from the group saw a Tiger at the same place where the Tiger had been with the kill and two jeeps did some good birding and saw some other animals. We came back and met for lunch and then met to go to the park again and saw the Tiger again! We came back and met for the checklist and dinner and retired to bed.

Day 10

Monday 18th February

Kanha National Park

It was our last drive to the park and we heard some alarm calls and saw some Spotted deer, Sambar deer and other animals but no Tiger today. We came back and had breakfast outside the park and then got to the hotel for the early departure from Kanha to catch a train from Jabalpur to Agra.

We left from Kanha National Park around 1 pm after an early lunch and then reached Jabalpur about 430pm and boarded the train at 530pm. We had a packed dinner on the train and then lights off around 830pm.

Day 11

Tuesday 19th February

Agra to Bharatpur

We had a good breakfast on the train and reached Agra around 10.30am. We went to the hotel for a freshen up and change and then left to see the magnificent Taj Mahal. We had lunch in a restaurant then went to see the Agra Fort. After visiting all these beautiful monuments we went for a little shopping and then after that Sara and Simon Walker, Jenny Roger and Jo Harwood left to go to Delhi with Rachit at the end of the main tour and the rest all of us went to continue the tour with the extension to Bharatpur.

We all reached Bharatpur around 730pm and checked in and then met for the checklist followed by dinner in Laxmi Vilas Hotel. I left them after letting them know about the programme and also told the programme to Colin and Georgina as they were leaving from here to join their tour extension to Ranthambore.

Day 12

Wednesday 20th February

Bharatpur

We started the day with a good breakfast at 630am and then gave the documents to Colin and Georgina for their Ranthambhore extension. I left to the park at 7am with Jack and Gill and Shirley and had lunch in the park. We returned to the hotel around 630pm after seeing so many lovely migratory birds like Great White or Rosy Pelican and Dalmatian Pelican, Greater Flamingo and Greater spotted Eagle, Booted Eagle, Marsh Harrier and other ducks like Pintail, Garganey, Shoveler, Gadwall, Ferruginous Duck and many more. We met for the checklist and dinner and then lights off.

Day 13

Thursday 21st February

Bharatpur

We met again for the park and did a very good walk in the park and we took a rickshaw ride as well. We had lunch in the park again and saw very nice birds and this morning we saw the very rare and beautiful bird called Siberian Rubythroat as well as some other beautiful birds like Water Rail and Black Bittern. We came back after and met for the checklist and dinner and then to bed.

Day 14

Friday 22nd February

Bharatpur to Chambal

Left from Bharatpur to Chambal at 8am and reached Chambal Safari Lodge around 12 pm and then had lunch. We left for the boat ride at 230 as it took about half an hour to reach the boating place and stopped on the way to see Variable and Desert Wheatear, and Kentish Plover. On the boat and we saw some nice birds like Greater Flamingo, Eurasian Wigeon, Spoonbill, Great Thick-knee, Osprey, Egyptian Vulture and Indian Skimmers and we also saw loads of Marsh Muggar Crocodiles and Garials. After our 2.5 hours boat ride we came back to the hotel. We met for the checklist and dinner and discussed the programme for the next day before bed time.

Day 15

Saturday 23rd February

Chambal to Agra to Delhi

We got up at 630 and had breakfast and then we went out for a walk around the hotel and saw some nice birds. We also saw Saras Crane in the village and then it started raining so we came back early from the walk. We left Chambal with a pack lunch to Agra to catch our train to Delhi, but heard from the local agent in Agra that our train is 4 hours late - so in case we couldn't reach to Delhi on time for the guests flight departing in the same night, we took the decision to go by taxi to Delhi to catch their onward flights home...We had lovely sightings of birds and animals and altogether it was a very nice and successful trip.
