## Day 1

**Friday 15th November**

In flight from London to Kathmandu. Patrick and Brian had arrived a few days earlier and went to Suklaphanta National Park for four nights and met the rest of the group at Kathmandu, while Keith arrived today and did some sightseeing around the city.

## Day 2

**Saturday 16th November**

Suchit picked up Max, Tessa and Simon from the airport and transferred them to hotel Royal Singi. It was a sunny afternoon with some light haze. The temperature in Kathmandu today lingered between 12 - 25 degrees celcius. All the group members had different plans so we decided to meet for breakfast the next day, at 6:30 am and leave for Phulchowki Hill at 7:15 am with a packed lunch so we could spend the whole day in the field.

## Day 3

**Sunday 17th November**

We set off from the hotel at 7:15 am and it took us about 45 minutes to reach the base of Phulchowki Hill (Godavari). We spent about an hour and a half birding and got species like Red-billed Blue Magpie, Great Barbet, Crimson Sunbird, Black-throated Sunbird, Orange-breasted Leafbird and Bay Woodpecker to name a few. We then proceeded towards the top of Phulchowki Hill. The Snow-capped Himalayas were perfectly set against the blue sky. We stopped to enjoy the Himalayas and Suchit pointed out all the peaks and ranges that we could see. We could see from Dhaulagiri in the far west to Dorje Lakpa in the east. Dhaulagiri, Annapurna I, Manaslu, Shisapangma (in Tibet) were the peaks above 8000 metres.

We spent about eight hours on the hill before we headed back to the hotel. After lunch we saw Black-throated Sunbird, Blue-winged Siva and Black-headed Jay just to name a few.

## Day 4

**Monday 18th November**

Our flight today was unfortunately delayed by two hours due to the mist at Biratnagar airport followed by air traffic at Kathmandu airport. We reached Biratnagar at about 11:15 am where we met Badri Chaudhary from Koshi Camp. After collecting our baggage we set off towards Birju Lake which took us about 45 minutes. As soon as we reached Birju we had our packed lunch and we birded for about 2½ hours before heading to Koshi Camp (Our base for three nights). At Birju we saw Spotted and Common Redshank, Red-naped Ibis, Grey-headed Lapwing, Cotton Pygmy Goose, Pheasant-tailed Jacana and Marsh Harrier just to name a few. We reached Koshi camp at around 5pm where we were welcomed with tea, coffee and biscuits. After we checked in we decided to meet for the log at 6:30 pm followed by dinner at 7:30 pm.

## Day 5

**Tuesday 19th November**

Today we had a cooked breakfast at 6:30 am and set out at 7:15 am. We set off on foot, birding initially in the campgrounds and then in the Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve (KTWR). We saw a Siberian Rubythroat, Tickell's Leaf and Hume's Warbler, Spotted Owlet, Stork-billed and Common Kingfisher, Crested Serpent Eagle and

White-throated Fantail in the camp ground and came across many interesting species in the KTWR. We also saw Grey-capped Pygmy, Streak-throated and Lesser Flameback Woodpeckers, Pin-striped Tit Babbler, Thick-billed Green Pigeon and many more in our morning excursion in KTWR.

We were back for lunch and after lunch at around 2pm we set off towards the central part of the national park where we came across Pied and Marsh Harriers, Lesser Kestrel, Swamp Francolin and many more species of birds along with a herd of about 30 Wild Water Buffalo, eight Asiatic Golden Jackals and an Indian Grey Mongoose!

## Day 6

## Wednesday 20th November

After morning tea/coffee and biscuits we set off at 6:30 am with a packed breakfast. We drove for about 45 minutes and reached the banks of the Sapta Koshi River. There was light mist so we had our breakfast and scanned the surrounding area. After breakfast the mist started to lift and we had more visibility so we scanned further, as far as the far bank of the river. Due to the last monsoon the landscape had changed a lot and the banks had a lot of sand deposited rather than grasses.

We drove and stopped at two high banks and checked and found things like Brahmany Starlings, Red-necked Falcons, Indian Thickknees, a Bengal Fox, Ashy-crowned Sparrow Larks and Lesser Adjutant Stork just to name a few. We came back to the camp for lunch and then drove to the Koshi Barrage and the southern end of the KTWR. In the afternoon we saw Gangetic River Dolphins, White-eyed Buzzard, Hog Deer, Jackals and unfortunately missed four wild Elephants by a few minutes!

## Day 7

## Thursday 21st November

After breakfast we set off at around 7:30 am with a packed lunch, heading towards Chitwan. On the way we made two comfort stops and had a break for a picnic lunch. After nine and a half hours we reached Tigerland Safari Lodge at 5 o'clock in the afternoon.

We decided to meet for drinks and the log at 7pm followed by dinner at 7:30 pm. Highlights for today were a Tawny Eagle and about 300 Amur Falcons!

## Day 8

## Friday 22nd November

This morning started off with a thick fog. We had a cooked breakfast and left the lodge on foot. We walked through the nearby Riverine forest overlooking the grassland and saw species like the Grey Bushchat, Lesser Coucal, Chestnut-capped Babblers, Siberian and Himalayan Rubythroats, Short-toed Snake and Booted Eagle, Blue-bearded Bee-eater and Grey-capped Pygmy Woodpecker amongst many others.

After the walk we drove to the riverside where the boats were ready to take us on a river safari. We came across about five Gharials, two Marsh Muggers, over 600 Ruddy Shelducks, saw over 300 Greater Cormorants fly over us, plus Citrine Wagtails and River Lapwings. We were met by our jeep and drove back to the lodge for lunch.

After lunch we had some time to enjoy the beautiful garden of the lodge before we set off at 3:30 for an elephant safari. The temperature was between 15 – 28 degrees with 67% humidity.

## Day 9

## Saturday 23rd November

After an early breakfast we set off at 7 am. It was a full day outing, exploring the Chitwan National Park by jeep with a packed lunch. The morning was misty and chilly at first and we were provided with a blanket each to keep warm, which was very helpful. The mist started clearing at about 8:30 just as we reached the grasslands. We came across a small flock of Rufous-necked Laughing Thrush calling. When Suchit played the call they responded very well and came up the tall grasses and showed well for all of us to have a great view. The same thing happened with Slender-billed Babblers.

When we reached the forested area at the base of the Churia hills we managed to see White-browed Scimitar Babblers, Black-backed Forktail and the way back came across a mixed flock of Lesser and Greater Necklaced Laughing Thrushes. On the way back we saw a Rhino with a 4/5 months old baby, coming to drink. When we reached the lodge it was dark so we decided to meet after an hour and a half for the log followed by dinner. After dinner we were informed about a Tiger and Tigress roaring to each other, possibly for mating but we did not hear it again.

## Day 10

## Sunday 24th November

Today we had to leave for Kathmandu so we set off after breakfast with a packed lunch. Patrick and Virginia stayed back for another night at Tigerland. Suchit spotted two Bonelli's Eagles so we stopped and had a look. After about two hours we made our first stop at Riverside Spring Resort for about 15 minutes for a comfort stop and to stretch our legs. We then made a stop to try to find a Spiny Babbler but unfortunately, although two birds responded and called back, we did not see them. We spent a good 20 minutes here before we set off to find the Ibisbill. We made a stop to check the Trisuli River and found White-capped and Plumbeous Redstart and at our last stop before lunch we found a single Ibisbill! This really cheered us all and we also managed to get closer and see it properly and also got some photos.

We then made a stop at a small roadside inn to have our packed lunch. Here we saw a few raptors like Egyptian Vultures, Steppe Eagles, Himalayan Vulture and Black Kites. The drive to Kathmandu was quicker than we had anticipated and we checked into Hotel Royal Singi by 4:30 pm. After arranging the departure times Suchit bid the group a final goodbye and left the group.

## Day 11

## Monday 25th November

Prakash the driver (who drove us all the way from Koshi to Kathmandu) picked up the four people taking the flight home today from the hotel and dropped them at the airport to catch their flight back to Doha and on to London. Brian had privately arranged a day in Kathmandu and was leaving the next day for Canada.
