## Day 1

**Sunday 20th January**

We departed from London Heathrow on a scheduled flight with Qatar Airways to Doha then Kathmandu.

## Day 2

**Monday 21st January**

The guests arrived in Kathmandu airport at 5:00pm, met with guide and transferred to Hotel Marshyangdi, for a short briefing about the tour and an overnight stay.

## Day 3

**Tuesday 22nd January**

Weather: Misty and windy

We transferred to the domestic terminal to get a 40 minute flight to Biratnagar. We then drove an hour and a half to Koshi Camp in Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve. We were welcomed by the camp staff and were shown to our tented accommodation. Lunch was served and at 3:00pm we joined our first activity, a nature walk in the reserve. We returned back to camp after sunset, refreshed with tea and coffee, and then dinner was at 7:00pm.

## Day 4

**Wednesday 23rd January**

Weather: Foggy and windy

Breakfast was served in the early morning and we drove to the northern end of the reserve at Prakashpur to start boating. We enjoyed boating in the Koshi River, exploring river bed, grasslands and sand and finished at Madhuban on 11:30am, and walked back to camp for lunch. In the afternoon we explored the southern part with a jeep and returned back to camp at dusk. Tea and coffee was served before dinner at 7:00pm.

## Day 5

**Thursday 24th January**

Weather: Misty morning, clear at 10:00 am then sunny all day

Breakfast was served at 6:30am and we had a drive to Jabdi Phanta, and Patnali forest with a lunch box. It was a full day of exploration at Jabdi Phanta and Patnali forest and we returned back to camp by 4:30pm. Tea and coffee were served in the garden and we waited for the Jungle Cat to come out, and dinner was served at 7:00pm.

## Day 6

**Friday 25th January**

Weather: Sunny

We had a short birding walk before breakfast, and transferred to Biratnagar airport to fly back to Kathmandu, overnight at Hotel Marshyangdi.

## Day 7

**Saturday 26th January**

Weather: Sunny

We started the drive at 7:00am from Kathmandu following Trisuli River and crossing some streams and scenic villages along the road side. Few stops were made along the journey to catch up with specialties en route. We arrived at 2:30pm in Chitwan to stay overnight at Machan Paradise View Lodge. We had a short briefing about lodge at 3:00pm and set off to do an elephant safari and returned back at 5:00pm. Tea and coffee were served for before dinner at 7:00pm.

## Day 8

**Sunday 27th January**

Weather: Sunny

We had an early start today, and after breakfast we started the jeep drive. We explored part of the Tiger Tops area, Khorla Muhana, Devi Taal, Sukhebar and Bhimle grassland today. At 5:00pm we returned back to the lodge for dinner.

## Day 9

**Monday 28th January**

Weather: Sunny

At 6:30am we had breakfast and then a nature walk along the grassland and riverain forest near the lodge until lunchtime, and then had a little time for rest. In the afternoon we set off for a short jeep drive combined with boating on the Rapti River. We floated for 45 minutes finishing at Drubaghat and were picked-up by jeep to go back to the lodge. We refreshed with tea and coffee, and dinner was at 7:00pm.

## Day 10

**Tuesday 29th January**

Weather: Sunny

This morning we had a second elephant safari for an hour and a half, and said goodbye to Chitwan at 10:00am to drive back to Kathmandu. We stopped along the way when we found new species along the road to Kathmandu. We arrived at 4:30pm and stayed over night at Hotel Marshyangdi.

## Day 11

**Wednesday 30th January**

Weather: Beautiful sunrise...sunny day

At 7:30am we drove from the hotel to Phulchowki hill, exploring for a full day at Phulchowki Mountain forest and Godavari Botanical Garden and returned back at 5:00 pm.

**Thursday 31st January**

We transferred to the international airport to catch the flight to Doha and the UK.
