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Summary

The Julian Alps of Slovenia host spectacular wildlife and scenery. In spite of very hot conditions, we managed to walk and explore different habitats to find amazing flora, fauna and geology. There were so many highlights, so many special moments of fun and awe. We were excited by excellent views of so many different species of bellflowers, buttercups, masterworts, vetches, saxifrages, thistles, orchids and many other genera and families. Of course, Edelweiss was a favourite. We also saw a host of butterflies, common and rare species alike. Was Blue-spot Hairstreak, Hungarian Glider, Pearly Heath, or Marbled White the most admired? And we enjoyed seeing so many birds too, from Red-backed Shrike, to Black Woodpecker, to Spotted Nutcracker and more. Our boat trip across the calm Lake Bohinj and the cable-car ride to the high-altitude Vogel Ski Centre were scenic and photographic treats too.

Day 1

Tuesday 24th June

We met at Heathrow Airport for a short BA flight to Ljubljana, where we met Luca, who had driven there from Italy. Our drive took in a stop near Bled to collect two clients who had travelled by train, and then we drove on to our base for the week, Hotel Alpinum. This is a large, modern and comfortable four-star hotel, well situated in the small village of Ribčev Laz. It overlooks Lake Bohinj with stunning views of the mountain-fringed water. Walking from the hotel offered such amazing scenery and a chance to see wonderful wildlife within minutes.

We quickly found our rooms and assembled for our first meal, selected from a wide range of dishes and took advantage of included wine and beer. We had time to introduce ourselves, to become orientated to our new surroundings, and to share an outline of the exciting week to come. We headed to our rooms with great expectations.

Day 2

Wednesday 25th June

The sky was blue; the weather forecast said it would be dry and hot. And it proved to be very hot too, the first day of a week of very high temperatures. We spent our day walking along the northern edge of Lake Bohinj. It was a great day, but tiring in the heat, so we finished earlier than normal.

A pre-breakfast walk behind the hotel produced Grey Heron adults and young, Barn Swallow, House Martin, Tree Sparrow and Kestrel, and Grey-headed Woodpecker was heard. The pre-breakfast visit to local supermarkets did not go as well though; we discovered that all were shut Slovenia's independence day! Fortunately, the hotel stepped in to provide very generous packed lunches.

By 9.30am we were aboard the small electric boat that glides along the calm Lake Bohinj from Ribčev Laz to its western end where, thirty minutes later, we disembarked at the small village of Ukanc. On the crossing we saw Mallard adults and young, and Yellow-legged Gulls. And we spotted many fish in the water: Common Gudgeon, Common Chubb, Brown Trout and Perch. The water was clear; only paddle or electric boats are allowed on the lake, which helps to support this healthy state. As we disembarked, we found various plants in and on the side of the water: Annual Fleabane (*Erigeron annuus*), Marsh Woundwort (*Stachys palustris*), Greater Knapweed (*Centaurea*

scabiosa) and Spiked Water-milfoil (*Myriophyllum spicatum*). We enjoyed a stop for coffee and toilets before heading out of the village, which was busy with campers, and coming across more beautiful plants. Meadow Clary (*Salvia pratensis*) was common and very splendid. We admired Broad-leaved Sermountain (*Laserpitium latifolium*) and the other large sermountain species (*Siler montanum*), alongside many tall Yellow Melancholy Thistles (*Cirsium erisithales*). There were plenty of bellflowers, including Harebell (*Campanula rotundifolia*), Spreading Bellflower (*Campanula patula*), Creeping Bellflower (*Campanula rapunculoides*) and Nettle-leaved Bellflower (*Campanula trachelium*). We also saw Blue Bugle (*Ajuga genevensis*), Shining Meadow-Rue (*Thalictrum lucidum*) and many lovely Yellow Ox-eyes (*Telekia speciosa*). Occasional purple flowers of Alpine Sowbread (*Cyclamen purpurascens*) peeped out from under the taller vegetation.

Many orchids grew alongside the path; we saw Red Helleborine (*Cephalanthera rubra*), Dark Red Helleborine (*Epipactis atrorubens*), Bird's-nest Orchid (*Neottia nidus-avis*), Common-spotted Orchid (*Dactylorhiza maculata* subsp. *fuschii*) and Narrow-leaved Helleborine (*Cephalanthera longifolia*). Other smart plants included Martagon Lily (*Lilium martagon*), Pannonic Thistle (*Cirsium pannonicum*), Mountain Germander (*Teucrium montanum*), Wood Scabious (*Knautia dipsacifolia*), Branched St. Bernard's Lily (*Anthericum ramosum*).

With so many plants in flower on this sweltering day, butterflies were plentiful. We followed the flight of Adonis Blue, Heath and Silver-washed Fritillaries, Pearly Heath and more. Other insects included the common, brightly marked Nine-spotted moths, iridescent Rose Chafers and dragonflies such as Brilliant Emerald. Surprisingly, we only saw a few lizards, all Common Wall Lizards, and two Grass Snakes were spotted.

About halfway along our walk, we took lunch in the shade and shortly heard the call of a Black Woodpecker. We were in luck, seeing the bird perched not too high above us, giving excellent views. We were pleased to see and hear other birds: Cuckoo, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Jay, Coal and Marsh Tits, Chiffchaff, Wood Warbler and Blackcap. Many more plant species were growing along the path. We picked out Fringed Pink (*Dianthus sternbergii*), Jupiter's Distaff (*Salvia glutinosa*), Carnic Masterwort (*Astrantia carniolica*), Tunic Flower (*Petrorhagia saxifraga*) and Tyrol Knapweed (*Centaurea nigrescens*). Hop Hornbeam (*Ostrya carpinifolia*), was a very smart tree. We came across several species of ferns: Maidenhair Spleenwort (*Asplenium trichomanes*), Green Spleenwort (*Asplenium viride*), Male Fern (*Dryopteris felix-mas*), Lady Fern (*Athyrium felix-femina*), Common Polypody (*Polypodium vulgare*) and the familiar Bracken (*Pteridium aquilinum*), together with Slender Broomrape (*Orobanche gracilis*) and Sand Leek (*Allium scorodoprasum*). We were tired by the end of our walk, and well-satisfied by all that we had seen. Our checklist was a long one, after a delicious dinner. Then we took to our beds and had a well-deserved sleep.

Day 3

Thursday 26th June

On the pre-breakfast walk we saw a family of Grey-headed Woodpeckers, and a family of Northern Ravens. We also saw Spotted Flycatcher, and Song and Mistle Thrushes. We spotted and heard other species throughout the day: Grey Heron, Common Buzzard, Common Swift and more. At lunch Common Chaffinches and Alpine Choughs entertained us as they were so eager to snatch food crumbs. We picked out, high in pine trees, Crossbill, Nuthatch and Marsh Tit. Black Redstarts were flying around the hotel.

Another hot day was forecast, and the prediction as correct, so we chose to drive north into the Triglavski Narodni Park, to explore the paths at the Vršič Pass at 1610m. The drive took us through the delightful small town of Bled, then along the motorway to Krasna Gora, from where we climbed high along the hairpin bends. We had set off

early, but it was still hard to find a parking space here! Fortunately, we found space by the refugio to enjoy coffee. While it was slightly cooler at the pass, it was still hot enough to encourage various butterflies to be active. We were delighted by close views of Mazarine Blue, Duke of Burgundy, Woodland Ringlet, Alpine Heath and Clouded Yellow. The greatest variety of species, of course, came among the alpine flora and we saw many splendid species in full flower.

By lunchtime, we had seen Bladder Gentians (*Gentiana utriculosa*), Pinnate-leaved Ragwort (*Jacobaea abrotanifolia*) and Carinthian Mouse Ear (*Cerastium carinthiacum*). Along a narrow trail we discovered two species of Valerian, Mountain (*Valeriana montana*) and Three-leaved (*Valeriana tripteris*), and, on rocky scree, the umbellifer Athamanta (*Athamanta cretensis*). Alpine Rose (*Rosa pendulina*) was beautiful in flower. We switched habitat to a wooded area where we saw Bird's-eye Primrose (*Primula farinosa*) and then, a little further on, Squarrose Knapweed (*Centaurea triumfetti*) and Serrated Wintergreen (*Orthilia secunda*). Perhaps the most impressive plants here were good numbers of the stunning Dark Columbine (*Aquilegia atrata*).

Finally, we drove a short distance downhill to a meadow and adjacent wood. Here we saw Slender Broomrape (*Orobanche gracilis*). Three spikes of Coralroot Orchid (*Corallorhiza trifida*) were a great find and we also enjoyed seeing Dense-flowered Fragrant Orchid (*Gymnadenia densiflora*) and Lesser Butterfly Orchid (*Platanthera bifolia*). We found many more butterflies; the star find was Clouded Apollo, with several lazily floating over the vegetation, giving excellent views. After an enjoyable dinner and checklist, we ended the evening in a most magical way, watching fireflies only a two-minute walk away from our hotel, along with a Common Glow-worm. We were mesmerised and humbled by this simple, yet amazing, experience. Who says fairies don't exist?

Day 4

Friday 27th June

Another hot day began with low cloud over the lake, creating a beautiful scene, ideal for photographers. Before breakfast we had great sightings of Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Grey Heron, Hooded Crow and Northern Raven. Four Mallards were on the water, and later nine more flew over as we did our checklist. Black Redstarts were around the hotel buildings. We planned to stay local and to avoid the heat where possible, so we drove the short distance to the village of Stara Fužina and the carpark beyond. A fairly level track ran through the adjacent field, and here we quickly spotted a pair of Red-backed Shrikes. We had fantastic views as the birds hunted for food and perched up on small bushes and trees. We wondered if two dead, tail-less, Eastern Green Lizards that we found may have met them earlier. A Cuckoo was calling; so too were Blackcap, Chiffchaff, Nuthatch, Spotted Flycatcher and Robin. We welcomed hearing, then seeing, a Goldcrest high in the pines.

There were plenty of butterflies on the wing already. We enjoyed taking close-up pictures of Mountain Green-veined White, Wood White, Brimstone, Holly Blue, Duke of Burgundy, Meadow Brown and Pearly Heath. The latter was very common, and attracted to sweaty skin! We added Narrow-bordered Five-spot Burnet and Oak Eggar moths to our records. Then we drove along a narrow road to the refugio of Koča na Vojah for coffee, and more butterfly hunting in a wonderful small meadow. And we took in yet more as we ate our picnic lunch. We were surrounded by Small and Sooty Coppers, and four blues: Holly, Little, Alcon and Common. There were different species of fritillaries too: Silver-washed, Dark Green, Thor's and more than fifty Glanville Fritillaries. We also admired Arran Brown and the large Hungarian Glider. And we enjoyed the picnic too, with fresh bread from the refugio.

For the afternoon, there was a choice to walk in the Mostinca Gorge, or to go back to the carpark along the road; most chose the former, more difficult option. Along the way, we saw a rich variety of woodland or damp-loving plants. These included Hart's-tongue Fern (*Asplenium scolopendrium*), Hacquetia (*Hacquetia epipactis*), Creeping Yellow-cress, (*Rorippa sylvestris*), Cabbage Thistle (*Cirsium oleraceum*) and Restharrow (*Ononis spinosa*). A large Bramble (*Rubus fruticosus* agg.) attracted a veritable swarm of butterflies. The buttery and slimy leaves of Alpine Butterwort (*Pinguicula alpina*) were nestled in damp moss, and Marsh Marigold (*Caltha palustris*) and Broad-leaved Cottongrass (*Eriophorum latifolium*) grew nearby. We noticed several trees: Hornbeam (*Carpinus betulus*), Hop Hornbeam (*Ostrya carpinifolia*), Aspen (*Populus tremula*), Wayfaring Tree (*Viburnum lantana*) and Whitebeam (*Aria* agg.). We were delighted to find Herb Paris (*Paris quadrifolia*), Dark-red helleborine (*Epipactis atrorubens*), Red Helleborine (*Cephalanthera rubra*) and lots of Fragrant Orchids (*Gymnadenia conopsea*), newly in flower.

On the river we saw Grey Wagtail and watched, with delight, a Dipper as it gracefully dived into the water and then popped back out onto a rock with food to savour. It was difficult to leave these lovely birds. From the carpark, the group walked on through the village of Stara Fužina to the hotel, while the leaders walked back up the road to collect the vans. Everyone met up for dinner, then completed a very healthy checklist. We had enjoyed an interesting day and were well-satisfied as we headed to our rooms.

Day 5

Saturday 28th June

Before breakfast, on yet another dry and hot day, we found Grey Heron, Wood Pigeon, Common Swift, Great Spotted Woodpecker and Jay. Then a Red Squirrel skipped along the road as we waited to set off. Our venue was the Vrata valley, one-hour's drive north into the Triglav Massif. New regulations were in place which prevented us from parking our vans at Slap Peričnik, so the only option was to drop the clients off there to see this spectacular waterfall for themselves, which they did and enjoyed. Orange Lilies (*Lilium bulbiferum*) grew along the road and Sweet William (*Dianthus barbatus*) was in flower, and both were a delight to see. The vans reappeared to take everyone up to the forest road, which ends at a refugio at Varta, for coffee. This is a stopping point of one stage of several high-altitude walks.

Today our walk was less ambitious in terms of distance and height; it concentrated on seeing some interesting plants, such as Einsel's Columbine (*Aquilegia einseleana*), Tolpis (*Tolpis staticifolia*), Crimped Bellflower (*Favratia zoyzsi*), and an ox-eye daisy (*Leucanthemum ircutianum*), all present in good numbers. We also enjoyed finding Blue Saxifrage (*Saxifraga caesia*). Lots of butterflies were on the wing, including Black-veined and Wood Whites, Brimstone, Common Blue, Comma, and Silver-washed and Pearl-bordered Fritillaries. One client was lucky enough to see a Chequered Skipper. We saw several moths, including Oak Eggar, Nine-spotted, and Mullein (caterpillars). So, we had much to chat about over our lazy picnic lunch in the shade; it was hot but bearable.

Thirty minutes later we arrived at a different habitat, a peat bog in the small village of Goreljek. While we were disappointed to see it so dry and being encroached upon by willows, we were not disappointed by our finds. We discovered Arnica (*Arnica montana*), Whorled Solomon's Seal (*Polygonatum verticillatum*), Bearded Bellflower (*Campanula barbata*), a rampion (*Phyteuma persicifolium*), One-flowered Wintergreen (*Moneses uniflora*) and *Erigeron glabrus*. We were not surprised to see few Round-leaved Sundews (*Drosera rotundifolia*) were growing in the Sphagnum Moss, with Hair's-tail Cottongrass (*Eriophorum vaginatum*) nearby. Fox and Cubs (*Pilosella aurantiaca*) were in bright flower, Ragged Robin (*Silene flos-cuculi*) was very ragged indeed, and Marsh Marigold (*Caltha palustris*) had gone over into fruit. Common (*Carex nigra*) and Bottle Sedges (*Carex rostrata*) and White Buttercup (*Ranunculus*

platanifolius) also grew in the damp. There were plenty of ferns, and we were pleased to see a small patch of Hard Fern (*Blechnum spicant*). A Common Toad skulked under a low tree, out of the heat, and a Common Redstart may have been doing the same. During the day, we had also heard Cuckoo, Common Buzzard, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Coal and Willow Tits, Dunnock, Firecrest and Goldcrest. We saw Grey Heron, Kestrel, Marsh Tit, Chiffchaff and more species. Once again, we enjoyed our dinner and completed a daily checklist, which ended with a sighting of a Hawfinch on a nearby pine tree. What a great way to end a wonderful day: drinks were called for!

Day 6

Sunday 29th June

After a quiet bird walk, then a tasty breakfast, we made sandwiches to take on our exploration of high-altitude flora. A five-minute drive to the west of Lake Bohinji took us to the Vogel Ski Centre and the cable-car which, in another five minutes, lifted us to 1500m. The views were stunning, and while the temperature was a little cooler than below, it was still hot. We enjoyed coffee before setting off to see some equally spectacular plants. Shaggy Hawkweed (*Hieracium villosum*) was indeed shaggy but not in flower, and another yellow-flowering plant was the more familiar Kidney Vetch (*Anthyllis vulneraria*). Black-stemmed Sneezewort (*Achillea atrata*), with its white flowers, was very common and striking. The pink flowers of Dwarf Alpenrose (*Rhodothamnus chamaecistus*) caught the eye, as did the pink flowers of Adenostyles (*Adenostyles alpina*) that were just emerging from bud. The distinctive fruit of Buckler Mustard (*Biscutella laevigata*) and purple flowers of Alpine Catmint (*Clinopodium alpinum*) helped identification.

We took the chair lift to gain a further 150m in height, to an area where Mountain Thrift (*Armeria alpina*) was flowering, and we also saw South-eastern Thistle (*Carduus carduelis*), Woolly Rock-jasmine (*Androsace villosa*) and Horned Rampion (*Phyteuma sieberi*). Lady's Mantle species were aplenty, including *Alchemilla xanthochlora*, *A. monticola* and *A. filicaulis*. Different bellflowers grew along the track, a new species being Fairy Thimble (*Campanula cochlearifolia*). And we identified different speedwell species: Long-leaved Speedwell (*Veronica longifolia*) was particularly lovely in flower. In addition, we found patches of saxifrages; Yellow Mountain Saxifrage (*Saxifraga aizoides*) especially caught the eye. Two Globeflowers (*Trollius europaeus*) had gone over, but were still nice to find, as were two species of lousewort, Verticillate (*Pedicularis verticillata*) and Beaked (*Pedicularis rostratocapitata*). Large carpets of Mountain Avens (*Antennaria dioica*) leaves spread along the rocks, occasionally showing white and cream flowers. The fruit 'clocks' of these superb plants were abundant and most attractive. So too were the flowers of Large White Buttercup (*Ranunculus platanifolius*) and Dark Rampion (*Phyteuma ovatum*).

The second chair lift wasn't working, which left us to walk, with the bonus of seeing more plants as we slowly ascended. Perhaps the prize find was Edelweiss (*Leontopodium nivale*); we discovered and admired several plants just coming into flower. How can you see this iconic species plant without bursting into song? We were glad to see new butterfly species (Silky and Dewy Ringlets, Northern Wall Brown, Safflower Skipper), as well as many more species seen earlier. Other invertebrates seen included the distinctive Yellow-banded Moth and the longhorn beetle *Oxymirus cursor*. An Alpine Marmot was calling, but was not seen. Crossbills called and flew over. We were ready for a drink at the excellent café, before we descended quickly in the cable car and returned to Ribčev Laz for a chance to swim or simply to relax. One client set up online messaging group, on which everyone quickly shared their images and excitement. It had been another excellent day.

Day 7

Monday 30th July

Our plan to visit another high-altitude venue at the Mangrt Saddle was scuppered by the approach road being blocked in two long stretches, so we chose to revisit the Vrata valley and walk as high as we could. And it turned out to be a great alternative. We arrived by 10.30am to take advantage of coffee at the refugio there. We retraced our day five route and continued along the track and, at times, in the dry riverbed. The rock here is limestone, so part of the river is subterranean. Some plants washed down from on high manage to root and establish themselves at lower altitude in such habitats; our sighting of Edelweiss was one example. We saw some more special plants, starting with a small patch of Crimped Bellflower (*Farratia zoysii*), nestled between boulders. We found two species of clubmoss, Interrupted (*Lycopodium annotinum*) and Swiss (*Selaginella helvetica*).

There were three species of orchid: lots of Fragrant (*Gymnadenia conopseis*), two individuals of Short-spurred Fragrant (*Gymnadenia odoratissima*) and a single Bird's-nest Orchid (*Neottia nidus-avis*). We saw plenty of ferns: Wall Rue (*Asplenium ruta-muraria*), Green Spleenwort (*Asplenium viride*), Holly Fern (*Polystichum lonchitis*), Beech Fern (*Phegopteris connectitis*), Brittle Bladder Fern (*Cystopteris fragilis*) and more. There were more exciting discoveries, including Bright Scabious (*Scabiosa lucida*), Creeping Gypsophila (*Gypsophila repens*) and a colt's-foot (*Homogyne sylvestris*). There were two new trees, Eastern Spindle (*Euonymus latifolius*) and an Alpine Laburnum (*Laburnum alpinum*) fully-decorated in bright yellow inflorescences. We found Corn Poppy (*Papaver rhoeas*), but were too early for the endemic Julian Poppy. The leaves of Bear's-ear Primrose (*Primula auricula*) matched the vernacular name. We added two more saxifrages to the list: Encrusted (*Saxifraga crustata*) and Spoon-leaved (*S. cuneifolia*).

There were lots of butterflies, including new species for the trip. We saw Black-veined, Mountain Green-veined, Small and Wood Whites, Brimstone and Clouded Yellow, plus White Admiral, Silver-washed, Spotted and Heath Fritillaries, Alpine Heath, Arran Brown, Large Skipper, and the star find of a single Blue-spot Hairstreak, in fresh condition.

Birding highlights were watching Treecreepers in the carpark, a client recognising Blackcap for the first time and, later, a female Black Redstart observing us as we compiled our checklist. We heard and saw many others over the day. Distant views of Alpine Chamois were enough to add it to our species tally.

Day 8

Tuesday 1st July

Today, our last day, allowed sufficient time to visit Vogar, a small collection of chalets with a fantastic viewpoint overlooking Lake Bohinj. To walk to this spot, we passed several alpine meadows, packed with special plants attended by special butterflies. The first meadow was wet enough to hold *Sphagnum* mosses and, nestled within, the wonderful Grass-of-parnassus (*Parnassia palustris*). Also on display were Manna Ash (*Fraxinus ornus*), Dark Mullein (*Verbascum nigrum*), Greater Masterwort (*Astrantia major*), Broad-leaved Sermountain (*Laserpitium latifolium*), Lesser Meadow-rue (*Thalictrum minus*), Sweet Cicely (*Myrrhus odorata*) and Spiked Rampion (*Phyteuma spicatum*). While we only found a few Martagon Lilies (*Lilium martagon*), they were coming into flower and looking splendid.

And the meadows were alive with butterflies. In just two hours, we saw more than twenty species, including Mountain Green-veined White, Arran Brown and Marbled White. There was enough time for coffee and views of Hawfinch and Nutcracker flying over.

So, well-satisfied, we drove back to the hotel to rejoin the clients who had stayed in the village, to enjoy our final picnic lunch, before heading off to the railway station and airport. It had been a short day, and far too short a week to see all the wonderful wildlife that makes up this magical place, the Julian Alps. We left Slovenia with fond memories of a special week, shared with special people and wonderful wildlife.
