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Summary

The Julian Alps make up the south-eastern block of the European Alps, and are just as amazing as all the other areas. This part of Slovenia is well-known for its beautiful scenery and wonderful Alpine flora and fauna, yet it remains relatively quiet and unspoilt. Our hotel at Ribčec Laz overlooked the pristine Lake Bohinj, and was a well-positioned base for sorties into the Triglav National Park, where we walked in alpine meadows, woodland, and along dry limestone riverbeds and gorges. Every day was different, with so much to see and admire. A stroll from our well-appointed hotel offered Western Bonelli's Warblers and Nine-spotted Moths in the morning, glow-worms, fireflies and bats as night closed in, and much, much more. The final list of species seen was long and impressive. It was a difficult place to leave, but we did so with many memories of fantastic days enjoying wonderful wildlife.

Day 1

Tuesday 23rd June

A leisurely start to the day, with an early afternoon flight, meant that the flight to Ljubljana airport didn't give scope for watching wildlife. The drive to Lake Bohinj took only an hour, and we arrived at our hotel in Ribčev Laz just in time for dinner. Incidental observations of birds along the way included Jay, Hooded Crow, Common Kestrel, Magpie and Goldfinch.

Day 2

Wednesday 24th June

On the first pre-breakfast walk we saw Spotted Flycatcher, Marsh Tit, Great Spotted Woodpecker and Grey Heron. By the time we had finished breakfast the mist was beginning to clear over Lake Bohinj, to reveal stunning views, which got even better as we drove through the next village to reach our first meadow. This turned out to be a magical start to our wildlife journey.

First we concentrated on plants, seeing Swallow-wort, Viper's Bugloss, Clustered and Nettle-leaved Bellflowers, Tunic Flower, Common Rockrose, Yellow Ox-eye, Tasteless Stonecrop, Spring Heath, Alpine Basil Thyme, Large Thyme, Hoary Plantain, Hairy Buttercup, and many more interesting plants. Trees and bushes seen here and in the afternoon included Wayfaring Tree, Guelder Rose, Barberry, Common Juniper, Scots Pine, Spruce, Dwarf Elder, Red-berried Elder, Sycamore, Hornbeam and Hazel.

We picked up a few birds too, including Red-backed Shrikes: first a male perched in a low conifer, then a female with food. We presumed that this was a nesting pair, and within an hour and half we had seen at least six of these beautiful birds. A pair of Jays flew over; Chiffchaffs and Chaffinches were singing, a Common Kestrel was mobbing a Common Buzzard, and we watched a Mistle Thrush and a pair of Jays.

By now it was warming up considerably, and insects were on the wing. The first butterflies to appear were Wood White and Weaver's Fritillary, and we saw plenty of each. Other finds included Blue-spot Hairstreak, Brimstone, Clouded Yellow, Alcon and Little Blues, Duke of Burgundy, and Silver-washed and Dark Green Fritillaries. After a short drive up to a refuge we continued seeing butterflies in a small flower-rich meadow. And as we enjoyed coffee, then a picnic lunch, a very dark Arran Brown flew around us, and several moths were on the refuge walls.

Well-refreshed, we set off to walk down the Mostnica Gorge, slowly picking our way along the stony path at a pace that ensured we were safe and identified the multitude of plants. Broad-buckler, Brittle-bladder and Holly Ferns, Common Polypody, Wall Rue, and Maidenhair and Green Spleenworts grew in the damp areas. Several vascular species grew in wet flushes: Alpine Butterwort, Todfield's Asphodel, Common Sedge, Large and Long-bracted Yellow-sedges and more.

Common Spotted Orchid were indeed common, Lesser Butterfly Orchid was present in single figures, and we saw a few Fragrant Orchids and Common Twayblades. Broad-leaved Helleborines were in bud, Dark Red Helleborines were just flowering, and Bird's-nest Orchids had gone over into fruit. We also enjoyed seeing Spoon-leaved and Round-leaved Saxifrages, May Lily, Common and Angular Solomon's Seals, and a couple of gentians: Cross and Willow-leaved.

It had been a highly rewarding day, and we returned to the vans for the short drive to our hotel, where we relaxed, refreshed ourselves, enjoyed dinner and compiled a long list of species seen.

Day 3

Thursday 25th June

A shorter walk before breakfast allowed everyone to see or hear Marsh Tit, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Blackcap, Spotted Flycatcher and Tree Sparrow. We set off early to drive to the Mangart Saddle, dipping in and out of Italy on route, and near the end, squeezing past cyclists, bikers and other vehicles as we slowly threaded uphill along the hairpin bends. It was busy at the top of the road, but we found space to park next to a wonderful patch of Mountain Avens and some Globeflowers. This place was a botanist's dream, making it so difficult to get out of the carpark. But, after seeing many alpine species, we showed some discipline and moved on to the road!

The verges and banks of the single-track road were awash with plants, and it was so easy to become absorbed by the richness of the grassland and rocky terrain. Although the road is blocked off, that does not stop cyclists whizzing down it, so we remained alert for them while examining the plants in front of us. They included Scheuchz's and Flax-leaved Bellflowers, Horned Rampion, Three-leaved Valerian, Mossy Cyphel, Alpine and Hoary Rock-roses, Silvery Milfoil, Aposeris, False Aster, Alpine Colt's-foot, Willow-leaved, Cross and Spring Gentians, Alpine Basil Thyme, Alpine Sanfoin and Roseroot, among many more.

It was hot even at this height, and without a breeze to discourage butterflies from flying. We had great sightings of Mountain Green-veined White, Marbled White, Little and Amanda's Blues, Large Tortoiseshell, Dewy Ringlet and Alpine Heath. The scenery for our lunch was stunning, and almost sitting on our first clump of Edelweiss was equally amazing. Within ten metres of our chosen picnic spot, we found Frog Orchids, Moonwort, Long-life Saxifrage and a host of other wonderful alpine species.

A few Alpine Choughs flew around, and we also saw or heard Rock Ptarmigan, White-winged Snowfinch, Alpine Accentor, Raven, Hooded Crow, Water Pipit, and Alpine and Common Swifts. On a distant mountainside, we saw three Alpine Marmots.

On our return drive, we stopped for coffee and toilets at Cave del Predi, which was not the prettiest of villages, but had an interesting mining history. The lead and mineral mines here closed in 2009, leaving abandoned tunnels

some fifty kilometres long. Our long drives had been well worth the effort, as we realised when we compiled a very long species list back at the hotel.

Day 4

Friday 26th June

It was another hot day, reaching 28°C, so we decided to avoid a long drive and opted for a short boat trip across Lake Bohinj instead. Before breakfast, Luca opened his moth trap to reveal fifteen species, mostly hidden by a cloud of caddisflies. Of the moths, those that were most distinctive were Shaded Broad-bar, Great Oak Beauty and Brown Rustic. But we enjoyed seeing them all.

The boat took twenty minutes to sail up the lake (a remnant of the last Ice Age, and kept in pristine condition by authorities not allowing petrol- or diesel-powered craft). The water was very clear, allowing us to spot various fishes: Danube Barbel, Common Chub, Common Rudd, Pumpkin Seed Perch and Balkan Italic Minnow.

We set off to walk back to Ribčev Laz along the northern side of the lake. The path varied from easy-going to quite rocky in places, so a slow stroll was safe and ideal for identifying many plants in the rich meadows and wooded sides. In the meadows, we saw Branched St. Bernard's Lily, Tuberous Comfrey, Rattle, Wolf's-bane and Greater Burnet. The shady and damp areas were good habitat for different species. It was great to see Herb Paris, Angular Solomon's-seal, Martagon Lily and Lily-of-the-Valley. Along the track we saw rampions, Creeping and Nettle-leaved Bellflowers, Common Valerian, Buckler Mustard, a delightful Fringed Pink, Alpine and Yellow-flowered Melancholy Thistles and Imperforate St. John's-wort. Trees and shrubs were in abundance, including Downy Birch, Hop Hornbeam and Buckthorn. There were fewer orchids, but one caught the eye: a Dark Red Helleborine in full flower, which was so lovely to see.

So too was a highly photogenic Eastern Green Lizard, stationary in the shade, while a few Viviparous Lizards skittered across the path. An Eastern Grass Snake slithered quickly out of sight. Butterflies were very active and we welcomed seeing Silver-washed Fritillary, Green-veined and Wood Whites, Reverdin's and Chalkhill Blues, White Admiral and Hungarian Glider, and many more.

So, at the end of a most interesting and warm walk, we had an early finish to our nature watching and returned to cool down and relax in the hotel. Some chose to swim in the lake, while others elected to stroll around a little more, before dinner and checklist.

Day 5

Saturday 27th June

Our intention today was to walk up part of Vrata Valley, to search for alpine plants growing in wooded areas and in the dried-up limestone riverbed. In spite of having set off early, we reached the barrier at the entrance to the valley with only one parking space available. Following a little 'negotiation', both vans were allowed to drive the ten kilometres to the packed carpark, where our day's wildlife journey began.

We stumbled across the limestone blocks on the riverbed and found some very special plants, including flowering Crimped Bellflower, Bladder Gentian, Yellow Mountain Saxifrage and the leaves of Blue Saxifrage. Many more species were growing in the open woodland, including Round-leaved Wintergreen, Snowy Woodrush, May Lily,

Alpine Clematis and lots of Yellow Betony. Several birds we seen or heard: Cuckoo, Goldcrest, Crested Tit, Short-toed Treecreeper and Bullfinch.

With the heatwave gripping Europe, today was hot, so we found shelter under trees to have our picnic lunch. Before we left the valley, we stopped to admire the bright flowers of several Red Helleborines. Then we drove along yet more narrow roads and through lovely countryside to Gorelejk Bog. This was a tiny site, which offered a different habitat for flora and fauna. In the short time that it took to walk around the bog, we came across One-flowered Wintergreen, Ragged Robin, Mountain Everlasting, Arnica, Tolpis and *Dianthus sternbergii*,

We did not venture into an adjacent meadow, so as not to disturb nesting birds which include Black Grouse and Rock Ptarmigan. Common Redstart, Marsh and Willow Tits, and Lesser Whitethroat were singing. Over the day we also saw many butterflies, including Black-veined and Wood Whites, Little and Chalkhill Blues, Brown Argus, Alpine Heath, and Dingy and Large Skippers.

Day 6

Sunday 28th June

Once again, we took breakfast early, and left the hotel for a ninety-minute drive to the Vršič Pass, where parking is usually a problem. And this year was the worst year ever. Why? We arrived at the top of the pass to see that major construction work was taking place to create managed parking: at least we can look forward to easier parking in 2027! Anyway, everyone but the drivers took to the café to wait for a solution to be found. Some half an hour later, the vans were parked, and we were able to start exploring the alpine vegetation along the rocky paths.

Many plants that we had seen earlier were growing here, but others were new, and thriving at this high altitude. We came across Dwarf Mountain Pine, Spreading Bellflower, Blue-berried Honeysuckle, Aposeris, Stemless Carline Thistle, Pink Viper's-grass and more. There were plenty of butterflies on the wing, and we identified Duke of Burgundy, Silver-washed and Dark Green Fritillaries, Pearly Heath, Woodland Ringlet, and Large and Dingy Skippers. A loud shout alerted everyone to an Apollo flying over. We also saw day-flying moths, including Silver and Sable, Nine-spotted and Nut-tree Tussock. A Raven flew over, showing its bulky body and wedge-shaped tail. Marsh Tit, Nuthatch, Dunnock and Grey Wagtail were singing. We also saw a Crossbill.

Carefully picking our way down limestone scree paths, we arrived at the only carpark near the top, which had the advantage of toilets: it was time for lunch. A shady spot combined with fantastic views to make our picnic well worth the scramble. Once refreshed and a little cooler, we continued to search for interesting plants. We discovered Round-leaved Wintergreen, Brown Clover and Alpine Toadflax, among others.

Satisfied with our finds, we drove a little further down the valley to park on the roadside, with a small, wooded area on one side and a larger meadow on the other. Our exploration was rewarded with a great diversity of plants and butterflies. This was our final sortie of the day, and it was a good one. The new plants included Dark and Blackish Columbines, False Medlar, Large-leaved Willow and Snowy Woodrush. We had seen one Coralroot Orchid before, and found four more here today. There were many Common Twayblades in fruit in the adjacent meadow, and Slender Broomrape.

It had been another hot day, and even without a great deal of walking, we returned to our hotel tired, and enjoyed a beer and rest before dinner and compiling another great checklist.

Day 7

Monday 29th June

The heatwave continued, and it was uncomfortable even before breakfast, when the keen birders saw the usual species and a welcome new one: Western Bonelli's Warbler. Our intention was to go high again to avoid most of the heat, but it was still sweltering on high. Our destination was merely a ten-minute drive away: Vogel Ski Resort. Within minutes, the cable car had lifted us up to 1500m, and then a ski-lift added a further 150m to the altitude. Unfortunately, a second lift was not in service, so we walked from here, as far as we felt comfortable. And at each stage, wonderful alpine flora surrounded us.

There was so much to see, both plants that we had already spotted and new finds. Of the latter, we enjoyed seeing Good King Henry, Dark Rampion, Rock Valerian, Creeping Sandwort, Dark Stonecrop, Julian Flax, Alpine Figwort and Matted Globularia. The first bird we saw was a female Ring Ouzel, and we soon found another young bird and an adult male. Linnets were calling and soon seen, as were Chiffchaff, Black Redstart, Hawfinch and Crossbill.

With so much vegetation in flower, we expected to be surrounded by lots of butterflies, and we were not disappointed. Of the more common species, we saw Painted Lady, Small Tortoiseshell, and Little and Mazarine Blues. In addition, we found Asian Fritillary, Pearly and Alpine Heaths, and Small and Large Skippers. A few moths were also flying around, including Hummingbird Hawk-moth, Nine-spotted and Silver Y.

It was good to find shade and drinks in the ski centre. While we had time to spare to enjoy life at this elevation, we were ready to return to the hotel to unwind and reflect on another great day, which had comprised our last full excursion of the holiday. We met for dinner and to complete a final checklist, before a well-deserved sleep.

Day 8

Tuesday 30th June

Our last day, with a flight leaving Ljubljana Airport in late afternoon, offered a final opportunity to see more wonderful scenery and wildlife. We stayed local, and explored an area cut out of dense woodland at Vogar. There are only a few chalets here, traditional and new, with a narrow road and paths to wander along to reach a small viewpoint, with an amazing view of Lake Bohinj. The sun was shining, and it was hot and still.

Along the way, we saw Grass of Parnassus in flower, Spiked Rampion, Thyme-leaved Sandwort, Wood Vetch, Balm-leaved Archangel, Blackish Columbine, lots of Wolf's-bane, and Dark Red Helleborine.

The tiny meadows were full of flowers, which attracted a rich array of butterflies: we encountered Arran Brown, Large Skipper, Silver-washed and Lesser Marbled Fritillaries, Sooty Copper and Comma. A special bonus for those having coffee at the end of the walk was a Scarce Swallowtail. Moths were also flying around, and sometimes settling on the path, such as Speckled Yellow. Birds in the trees or flying over us included Grey-headed Woodpecker, Goldcrest, Firecrest, Nutcracker, Jay, Raven and Black Redstart.

But time had slipped by, and we had to return to our vans for the short drive back to the Alpinum Hotel Jezero. Here we enjoyed our final picnic lunch, before a one-hour drive to the airport. We took our luggage along with a host of memories of this superb part of Slovenia: it is certainly a place to which a return visit is desirable!
