Summary

The Julian Alps make up the south-eastern block of the European Alps, and are just as amazing as all the other areas. This part of Slovenia is well-known for its beautiful scenery and wonderful Alpine flora and fauna, yet it remains relatively quiet and unspoilt. Our hotel at Ribčec Laz overlooked the pristine Lake Bohinj, and was a well-positioned base for sorties into the Triglav National Park, where we walked in alpine meadows, woodland, and along dry limestone riverbeds and gorges. Every day was different, with so much to see and admire. A stroll from our well-appointed hotel offered Western Bonelli's Warblers and Nine-spotted Moths in the morning, glow-worms, fireflies and bats as night closed in, and much, much more. The final list of species seen was long and impressive. It was a difficult place to leave, but we did so with many memories of fantastic days enjoying wonderful wildlife.

Day 1

Wednesday 1st July

The leader collected the clients from Ljubljana airport and we drove to Ribčev Laz. The drive to Lake Bohinj only took an hour, and we arrived at our hotel in Ribčev Laz just in time for dinner. While the timing didn't give much scope for watching wildlife, our incidental observations of birds along the way included Jay, Hooded Crow, Kestrel, Magpie and Goldfinch.

Day 2

Thursday 2nd July

On a pre-breakfast walk we saw or heard Spotted Flycatcher, Marsh Tit, Great Spotted Woodpecker and Grey Heron, and a family of Western Bonelli's Warbler was flitting about in the bushes. Three Ravens perched in a tall Scots Pine and showed their distinctive features when they flew off. Paul had set up his moth trap, and showed everyone what it had attracted: moths, caddisflies and mayflies.

Lake Bohinj was stunning as we drove past and through the next village of Stara Fužina, to reach our first stopping point of the day, the refuge at the top of the Mostnica Gorge. Here we walked a short distance along a path to a small meadow, where plants and butterflies were in abundance. We started by identifying plants, such as Swallow-wort, Viper's Bugloss, Clustered Bellflower, Caraway, Greater Masterwort, Rampion, Common Rockrose, Yellow Ox-eye, Hoary Plantain, different buttercups, and many more interesting species which caught our eye.

It was warming up considerably, and plenty of insects were on the wing. The first butterflies to appear were Wood White, Heath Fritillary and Duke of Burgundy. We also saw Silver-washed and Dark Green Fritillaries, Meadow Brown and Marbled White. While enjoying coffee at the refuge, we spotted several moths on the walls: Black Arches, Buff Ermine and Long-legged Tabby. A pair of Jays flew over, and Chiffchaffs and Chaffinches were singing.

As we carefully picked our way down the rocky path in the gorge, we encountered an array of plants. There were many ferns (Broad-buckler Fern, Wall Rue, Brittle-bladder Fern, Common Polypody, and Maidenhair and Green Spleenworts) in the damp areas. Several vascular species grew in wet flushes, such as Alpine Butterwort, Tofield's Asphodel, Common and Star Sedge, Long-bracted Yellow-sedge and more. Broad-leaved Helleborine was in bud,

flowering Common Spotted Orchids were common, and a few Bird's-nest Orchids had gone over into fruit. We enjoyed seeing May Lily, Common and Angular Solomon's Seals, Lily of the Valley and Herb Paris.

We also enjoyed a packed lunch on the way. Soon we completed the gorge walk, ready to amble back to Ribčev Laz, leaving the leader to return to the refuge to recover the van. Finally, we had dinner together, then met to have a briefing and complete our first checklist. It had been a highly rewarding first day in the field.

Day 3

Friday 3rd July

We thought it best to leave early after breakfast to secure a parking space at the Vrata Valley, and the plan worked well. We walked up the valley, searching for alpine plants growing in wooded areas and in the dried-up limestone riverbed. As we stumbled across the limestone blocks on the dry riverbed, we discovered some very special plants. Perhaps Edelweiss in full flower was the most amazing: it is a plant that thrives at much higher altitude, but this individual, which had been washed some considerable way downstream, was looking very good indeed. We successfully searched for Crimped Bellflower: several clumps were flowering well. So too were Yellow Mountain Saxifrage and Alpine Catchfly. We enjoyed finding Dark Columbine, and identified the endemic Einsel's Columbine with great care. And there were other species between the limestone blocks: Alpine Gypsophila, Alpine Mouse-ear and Livelong Saxifrage. We would see these all of these later at higher altitude. A single Grass of Parnassus was in bud.

Many species were growing in the open woodland, including Round-leaved Wintergreen, Fairy Flax, May Lily, Dwarf Alpenrose, Fringed Pink, Yellow Melancholy Thistle and lots of Yellow Betony. Different species of vetch, speedwell, forget-me-not, thyme, thistles and more added to the floral diversity.

Several birds we seen or heard, including Goldcrest, Crested Tit, Short-toed Treecreeper and Bullfinch. We were surprised not to see more butterflies, but we saw Black-veined and Wood Whites, Brimstone, lots of Heath Fritillaries (some individuals landing on our clothing and hands), Red Admiral, Brown Argus, Large Wall Brown and Small Skipper. We observed a number of moths, including Clouded Buff and Drab Looper, and saw Blue Featherleg damselflies too.

The heatwave of the previous week had left its toll on many plants, which had 'gone over' and shrivelled. But we were in luck when we stopped to admire the bright flowers of a few Red Helleborines along the road down the valley, and two specimens of Herb Paris were also in peak condition. However, two nearby Twayblades were in a sorry state: we were still pleased to have noticed them.

Further on, we approached the famous waterfall of Slap Peričnic, and took the steep, but short, walk up to the top and around it. It is a superb sight. Sadly, the Carnic Lily at the bottom of the waterfall was much less impressive, with only one petal remaining. Others in local gardens gave a much better show!

We drove along yet more narrow roads, through lovely countryside, to Gorelejk Bog. This is a tiny site which offers a special habitat for different flora and fauna. In the short time that it took to walk around the bog we came across One-flowered Wintergreen, more Round-leaved Wintergreen, Mountain Everlasting and Tolpis. Some of the top flowers of the very showy Arnica plants had been picked: they're used locally to make a medicinal ointment.

We did not venture into an adjacent meadow, so as not to disturb nesting birds, which include Black Grouse and Rock Ptarmigan. Common Redstart, Marsh and Willow Tits and Chiffchaff were singing. After a further twisting journey in the van, we arrived back at our hotel and, at dinner, met Mike, who had spent the day cycling around the area. It had been a most enjoyable day.

Day 4

Saturday 4th July

It was another hot day. It was also the weekend, so we avoided the more popular sites to visit until later, choosing instead a short boat trip across Lake Bohinj. No drive today for a change! Before breakfast, Paul had opened his moth trap to reveal several species: perhaps the most attractive was Black Arches.

The boat took twenty minutes to sail up the lake, which is a remnant of the last Ice Age, and is kept in pristine condition by the authorities not allowing petrol- or diesel-powered craft. The water is very clear, to the advantage of spotting fish – Sun (or Pumpkin Seed) Perch seemed to be the favourite. We saw Yellow-legged Gull, Goosander and Mallard on the lake.

Upon disembarkation, we watched more fish, then dragonflies and damselflies, some perching on stems of Water Milfoil. We picked up several butterflies, before a fresh Common Swallowtail flew in and settled on the mud just in front of us. It seemed to be completely unfazed by our presence, so we took advantage and captured lots of photographs.

We set off to walk back to Ribčev Laz, along the northern side of the lake. The path varied from easy-going to quite rocky in places, so a slow stroll was safe and ideal for identifying the diversity of plants along the way. In the meadows, we saw Branched St. Bernard's Lily, Tuberous Comfrey, Rattle, Wolf's-bane and Greater Burnet. The shady and damp areas were good habitat for different species. It was great to see Rampion, Creeping and Nettle-leaved Bellflowers, Common Valerian, French Sorrel, a delightful Fringed Pink, Alpine Thistle, Yellow-flowered Melancholy Thistle, Imperforate St. John's-wort and Carnic Masterwort. Trees and shrubs were in abundance, including Downy Birch, Hop Hornbeam, Buckthorn, Wayfaring Tree, Spindle and Small-leaved Lime. A large stand of Dwarf Elder was impressive, and a Deadly Nightshade was developing its black fruit: beware!

A few Viviparous Lizards skittered across the path, as did a much larger Eastern Green Lizard. Birds seen or heard included Blackcap, Coal, Marsh and Great Tits, Dipper, Grey and White Wagtails and Great Spotted Woodpecker. A male Red-backed Shrike made itself obvious for some to enjoy. (Around the hotel we also saw House Martin, Spotted Flycatcher, House and Tree Sparrows, and Greenfinch.) Butterflies were very active: we welcomed seeing and photographing Silver-washed Fritillary, Black-veined and Wood Whites, Chalkhill Blue, White Admiral, Brimstone and Pearly Heath. And there were many more, including Scotch Argus, and Silver-washed Fritillary.

So, at the end of a most interesting and warm walk, we had an early finish to our nature watching, with no drive needed. We returned to cool down and relax in the hotel, where some enjoyed ice-cream. There was time to swim, to stroll around, or to check identifications from photographs we had taken, ahead of dinner and completing the daily checklist. It had been another fruitful day.

Day 5

Sunday 5th July

A warm day began with an enjoyable breakfast, and a short drive to Vogel Ski Centre, where we caught the gondola to see more alpine plants, and different birds. Within minutes, our packed cable car had risen to 1500m, giving us great views of Lake Bohinj as we ascended. At the top, we slowly walked to the ski lift, the only one working today. Along the way we saw Good King Henry, Dark Rampion and Rock Valerian, and the large cream flowers of Wolf's-bane stood out, as did the dark pink flowers of Alpine Rose. Then, at this higher altitude, a wide range of alpine flora awaited our inspection.

We walked past very obvious Shaggy Hawkweed, and the yellow flowers of Silvery Milfoil contrasted well with its grey/green leaves. Dotted around were the light blue flowers of the more diminutive, and endemic, Julian Flax. Less obvious, but equally attractive, were several small Alpine Figworts in flower, and there was a single Edelweiss in bud.

After a couple of hours, we were ready for lunch, which we enjoyed surrounded by Tofield's Asphodel, Mountain Thrift and many rock-roses, including Hoary. We also saw Martagon and Carnic Lilies in full flower. These sights made the effort of reaching this height so rewarding.

On the way back down to the ski lift, we came across Hybrid Buttercup, Alpine Clematis and Three-leaved Anemone. There were lots of Fragrant Orchids, a few Pyramidal Orchids, and a single Elder-flowered Orchid, its flower buds just opening. There were few birds, but we saw or heard Crossbill and Dunnock, and had a fleeting view of a Ring Ouzel. With so much vegetation in flower, we expected to be surrounded by lots of butterflies. Of the more common species, we saw Green-veined White, Brown Argus, Painted Lady, Mountain Ringlet, Large Wall Brown and Alpine Heath. A few moths were also flying around, including Hummingbird Hawk-moth, Nine-spotted and Silver Y.

The weather had been good, but rain was coming, so we took to the gondola once more and made the short drive back to the hotel to await the downpour: it duly arrived! It gave us time to relax and relive our finds on another fantastic day.

Day 6

Monday 6th July

After an early breakfast, we set off for a long drive to reach the Vršic Pass, suspecting that it would be very difficult to park. And it was! But during coffee in the café, Steve eventually managed to park and join the group, and we began the first of three walks at the highest level of the pass.

There were large patches of Mountain Avens leaves, occasional flowers and more plants in feathery fruit. Another member of the rose family, False Medlar, was also in fruit. Alpenrose was common, but Hairy Alpenrose less so. The tiny Serrated Wintergreen grew under one for these plants, and we found many more individuals of Round-leaved Wintergreen as we walked down the road to our next site.

Here, we explored a meadow and woodland path, finding more Tofield's Asphodels. Perennial Cornflower was in flower, and looked splendid, as did Alpine Thistle. Of the ferns, perhaps, we admired Holly Fern most, and we enjoyed seeing Mountain Clover and Brown Clover

Lots of butterflies were on the wing: over the day we saw Pearly and Small Heaths, Large Skipper, Silver-washed, Dark Green, Pearl-bordered and Heath Fritillaries, Mountain Ringlet, Common and Silver-studded Blues and more.

We were hungry, and the plan was to drive a short distance downhill to the final site we would explore. This location proved to be as interesting as the others. The large leaves of Cross Gentian stood out, as did those of Woolly Thistle, but the latter was in flower. The meadow was rich in different species, such as three kinds of broomrape: Slender, Common and Thyme. There were lots of Twayblades and Fragrant Orchids, mostly 'gone over'. But a single Grass of Parnassus plant was in bud.

While it was not really a birding day, we did connect with Lesser Whitethroat, Marsh Tit, Blackcap, Chiffchaff and Wren. On the drives to and from the pass, we saw Hooded Crow, three Buzzards, Kestrel, Magpie and Jay. Back at the hotel, we saw Dipper, Grey and White Wagtails, Spotted Flycatcher, Great Spotted Woodpecker and Grey Heron.

It had been a long day. We were pleased to have seen such spectacular scenery, and more wonderful wildlife.

Day 7

Tuesday 7th July

A bank of low cloud hung over Lake Bohinj, and with the mountain tops in full sun, this was a perfect picture to start the day. And today was going to be a long one: little did we know how long though! After an early breakfast, we set off to drive to Mangart Saddle, a journey taking us into and then out of Italy to shorten the route. We made good time until the Italian border, where we were detained for almost thirty minutes while our documentation was scrutinised. So when we reached the road to climb to the top, it was closed.

Plan B kicked into action: a retreat to the nearby town of Cave del Predil for coffee and deliberations. It's an interesting little place, scarred by years of mining for lead and zinc, but with a fascinating story to tell. We were more interested in its wildlife though, finding Carthusian and Fringed Pinks, Kidney-vetch, Spring Sandwort and Goldenrod. There were a few butterflies too, such as Small White, Common Blue and Painted Lady. A family of Common Redstarts flew around us. We decided to wait and retry our ascent to Mangart Saddle, and we were in luck: enough people had been and gone, leaving some precious parking spaces free.

The first thing was to be amazed at the glorious scenery, and the second was to enjoy a filling picnic lunch. For dessert: fabulous wildlife all around us! Mountain Avens was everywhere, and we found Alpine Avens too. Only a few Globeflowers were still in bloom, but they were still wonderful. Alpine Sainfoin was flowering, but Alpine Bartsia was not. Moonwort was on the edge of the road, and Mountain Bladder Fern grew on the adjacent rocks. We found Flax-leaved Bellflower, Round-headed Rampion, and Marsh-leaved and Three-leaved Valerians. Mats of Moss Campion were in different stages of flowering, while Golden Hawksbeard was in full bloom. Clusius' Gentian was in flower, glowing an intense blue, and Spring Gentian was in fruit. We compared the fascinating fruits of Alpine and Mountain Avens, and Alpine Pasqueflower. There were many species of lady's-mantles, but too little time to identify them with certainty. But we were very sure of our orchid finds: Dark Vanilla, Elder-flowered and Frog.

Where there are so many plants in flower, there will be plenty of pollinators: butterflies, moths, bees and more. We were delighted to see Small and Green-veined Whites, Brown Argus, Little Blue, Painted Lady, Mountain Ringlet and Meadow Brown. Twenty or more Alpine Choughs flew around, Water Pipits called, and we heard Ravens.

After a few hours, we were well-satisfied with our visit, and left with only one regret: that we could not have stayed longer to see more. But dinner was awaiting at our hotel, and we thoroughly enjoyed it after a great day.

Day 8

Wednesday 8th July

Our last day, with a flight leaving Ljubljana Airport in late afternoon, offered a final opportunity to see more wonderful scenery and wildlife. We stayed local, and explored an area cut out of dense woodland at Vogar. There are only a few chalets here, traditional and new, with a narrow road and paths to wander along to reach a small viewpoint, with an amazing view of Lake Bohinj. The sun was shining, and it was hot and still.

Along the way, we saw Dark Red Helleborine in flower, Spiked Rampion, Thyme-leaved Sandwort, Wood Vetch, Balm-leaved Archangel, Whorled Solomon's Seal, Blackish Columbine, Brown Knapweed and lots of Wolf's-bane. The leaves of Heart-leaved Leopard's-bane were big (and heart-shaped), the large Peached-leaved Bellflower was in bud, and we identified some thick, glaucous leaves and stem as those of Broad-leaved Sermountain. A single Martagon Lily was still in flower; as was Yellow Salsify.

The tiny meadows were full of flowers, which attracted a rich array of butterflies: we encountered Arran Brown, Large Skipper, Silver-washed and Dark Green Fritillaries, Brown Argus, Sooty Copper, Chalkhill Blue, Speckled Wood and Marbled White. Two longhorn beetles landed on flowers for long enough for our identification: Spotted Longhorn and *Pachyta quadrimaculata*. Moths were also flying around and sometimes settling on the path, such as Transalpine Burnet. A German Scorpion Fly rested on a pine leaf. Birds in the trees or flying over us included Grey-headed Woodpecker, Goldcrest, Firecrest, Nutcracker, Jay, Raven, Buzzard and Kestrel. Later, from the van, we spotted a Red-backed Shrike flying from tree to tree.

But time had slipped by, and we had to return to the Alpinum Hotel Jezero, where we enjoyed our final picnic lunch. The subsequent drive to the airport took an hour. We took our luggage along with a large bank of memories of this superb part of Slovenia: a place to which a return visit is desirable, we agreed.
